

Curved Paper Pieced Flying Geese

SUPPLY LIST

Level: confident in paper piecing (no beginners) This is extremely important- all students *must* have complete knowledge of how to paper foundation piece a section of traditional flying geese and *must* know the basics of paper foundation piecing so as not to slow or interrupt the progression of the class.



In this class we will take the basics of machine paper piecing techniques and add a twist to them by making and designing a small quilt (18" x 24") with curved flying geese. This design can be used as a border or as the central theme of your quilt as well. You will learn how to measure, design, draft and sew the pattern in this class, and then we will talk about how to interpret other basic shapes into curved paper piecing.

SEWING MACHINE (in good working order) for straight stitching

Paper and fabric scissors, thread, regular sewing supplies
Paper- several options for you to choose from: the best however is Golden Thread paper 12" or 18" wide- you can use other types of paper such as doctors office rolled paper, rolled garment drafting paper but not freezer paper or tissue paper,

Machine needles, Olfa cutter and board, 2 rulers: (1 x 12 or 1 x 6) ,
sharp pencils and good eraser

'Add a quarter ruler' by CM Designs- (optional)

Collins wooden Finger Presser or similar presser (optional)

Fabric: 1) background fabric for small class quilt =about 3/4 yard

2) one fabric OR scraps of assorted fabrics for geese =total about 1/4 yard for geese

Trash bag, and pillow for your sitting comfort

If we have time: you may want to bring a quilt top if you are designing a Curved Paper Pieced Flying Geese borders for it and sufficient length of paper for the pattern
