From Quilts to Wearables and Back Again

I would like to offer a quote from one of my favorite authors, "Behind every quilter is a great big pile of fabric, so get back to work. *A Thread of Truth* by Marie Bostwick.

This month we welcome Nick Coman to speak about his journey from quilts to wearables and back again. Nick has had a lifelong love affair with fiber and design. Starting with glue and handi-wipes to make his sister's Barbie dolls and his GI Joe some new duds, he continued throughout high school and college making costumes and garments for himself and others.

At one point, Nick decided to go to design school and has never looked back. Having worked for costume shops, event companies, and commercial garment manufacturers, he eventually settled in as a custom clothier and fiber artist. Somewhere along the line, Nick started quilting and developed a love for the art quilts he saw. Diving in with his usual abandon, he learned from teachers, books, videos, and some osmosis how to use surface design to create "one of a kind" fabrics to use in his quilts and one of a kind garments.

Today Nick makes clothes for a private clientele and teaches clothing, quilting and design techniques around the country. He has written numerous articles for magazines such as *Threads Magazine*.

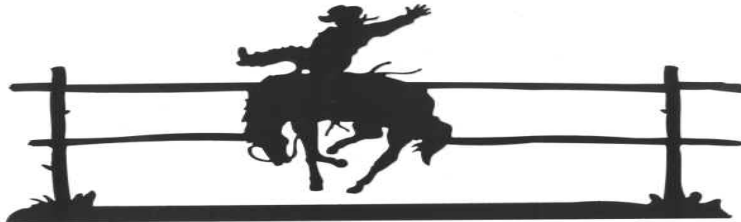
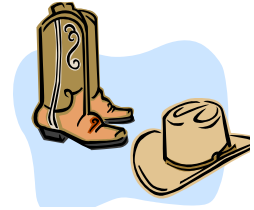

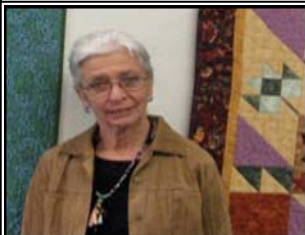
Happy New Year Pardners & Hallelujah to 2011!

MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting
At Barbara Gibson's Home December 2, 2010

Present: Barbara Gibson, Sharon Bishop, Margie Emmons, Carolyn Hodapp, Corinne Gurney, Heidi St. Royal, Barbara Stuart, Karen Waller, Pat Rollie, Nan Maples, Alice Turner, Judy Sellers, Brandi Nalley, Harriet Sartinsky, Frances Brannon

Barbara Gibson opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m. The minutes of the last board meeting were review and approved as printed in the newsletter. We then had a wonderful Christmas pot luck, and then returned to the meeting.

Margie Emmons, Treasurer, handed out copies of the November treasurer's report and reviewed it with the Board. This month's checking account is lower due to the expense for the Bylaws printing and Show, and the income from the Show is not arriving as yet. This is a normal situation at this time of year.

Barbara Gibson then called for old business. The next meeting will be at Susan Edwards' home January 6, and the February meeting will be at Patchwork Penguin. Fat quarters for December are holiday prints; January will be whites and cream; February will be reds and pinks, plus Valentines.

Mary Ann Kroening was not present, as she has broken her shoulder. She needs someone to attend the SCCQG meeting, and Sharon Bishop volunteered to cover the meeting. Mary Ann sent a message to Barbara Gibson regarding the table set up, and Sharon Bishop has already e-mailed her regarding the needed tables. Since we won't have a block-of-the-month in December (supplanted by the Christmas block exchange) it will be started up again at the January meeting - for the February drawing.

Barbara Gibson thanked Karen Waller for the beautiful job she did on the newsletter for this month. The fact that the newsletter arrived early this month was greatly appreciated by all, with special thanks to Mary Ann Kroening (and husband) for finishing up the job folding and getting them mailed.

Nan Maples was asked about the deadline for entries in the Quilt Show, saying the deadline is January 8, which is the latest time she can accept the entries and get everything entered and the information turned over in a timely manner.

Programs Chair Corinne Gurney announced the future programs scheduled:

Apr. Cara Gulati - 'So You Want to Make an Art Quilt' **Workshop:** 'Fuchsia Fireworks' @ Antelope Valley Quilt Association

Bookmarks with the Program/Workshop Schedule for 2011 have been printed and are now available.

Membership Chair Barbara Stuart announced that people have been signing up on the website and also a new one was handed to her at this meeting. Bylaws and Rosters for those who have not picked up theirs will be available at the December and January Guild meetings and at the Information Desk at the 2011 Quilt Show. It is not planned to mail out those not picked up, with certain exceptions, to be decided on a case-by-case basis.

Sharon Bishop, Corresponding Secretary, Esther Norbut's husband has been in the hospital, but is out now, Frances Brannon had her surgery and is doing well. Gerda Moller's daughter e-mailed Sharon that Gerda (a long-time member) had passed away in October. Dorthea Corrigan has sent an e-mail that she is still square dancing at age 86 and will be at the Quilt Show.

Nan Maples, Parliamentarian, furnished each of the Board with a full-sized copy of the Bylaws and each member of the Bylaws Committee. She told us that when they were looking for historical references regarding the original intent of the Bylaws, Betty Fisher was nice enough to loan her personal archive of the Bylaws. Sharon photocopied them and they are now in a notebook to be maintained by the Guild Parliamentarian.

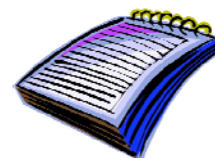
Heidi St. Royal said that it just points out how important a top-notch assistant is, one who not only can, but does step up and take the reins in the case of an emergency such as Sharon has, and acknowledged Sharon Bishop's great job in taking over, fronting the Quilt Show and meeting show deadlines. As Heidi's medical issues, the doctors are still running tests, trying to decide exactly what her situation is. She is still 'grounded', not allowed to drive. Heidi said she sent a letter to Huell Howser, inviting him to the Quilt Show. She has received an e-mail from Huell acknowledging the invitation, with a decision to follow. The Autry Museum is interested in inviting us back to another 'behind the scenes' tour of the museum. More information on this to follow. She is also working with the museum regarding volunteering our expertise for the big 'Gala' to be sometime in the fall - a great opportunity for Guild publicity. The **next Quilt Show meeting** is January 4 at Patchwork Penguin, then February 1 and March 1, location to be announced. Sharon announced that the workshop registration for the Quilt Show will be available on-line shortly; in the meantime, forms can be printed, filled out and mailed, if you wish.

Brandi Nalley, Publicity Chair, said posters and flyers are being printed regarding the Quilt Show and will be available shortly.

The subject of the 2012 Quilt Show Opportunity Quilt was discussed, with the possibility of getting the quilt to the Long Beach show. It was decided to ask the membership to submit quilt designs, so it can be started soon enough to get it done and to the Long Beach show.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m.

Glendale Quilt Guild General Meeting Glendale Central Library December 8, 2010

President Barbara Gibson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. She then called on Caren Cooke Ryan to introduce our special guests for the evening, Etsuko Kubota, winner of the Viewer's Choice Doll Award at the 2010 Quilt Show. Mrs. Kubota traveled from Japan to receive the award, as her daughter explained. The winning doll was also available for viewing at the meeting. Caren advised that Mrs. Kubota's daughter also won a ribbon for her quilt entry at the Show.

Barbara Gibson called for approval of the minutes of the last meeting as reported in the newsletter, explaining that the bottom part of the minutes had been cut off inadvertently in the printing, and asked for any corrections. There were none and a motion was made, seconded and approved by unanimous vote. Members were invited to enjoy the Christmas potluck while the meeting continued. The Autry Museum will be offering us more special events, details to follow. She announced that the Board is soliciting ideas for the Show theme for 2012 and ideas for the Opportunity Quilt. If you have any suggestions, see one of the members of the Board or write them down and give them to Barbara Stuart.

She reminded us that all members to Executive Board meetings and to meet the speaker of the Guild meeting at a dinner at Outback Restaurant prior to each meeting (Dutch treat).

Joni Kellam, Workshops Chair, announced upcoming programs scheduled. January is Nick Coman, 'From Clothing to Quilts and Back'. His workshop "How to Deconstruct and Reconstruct a T-shirt", so that it fits you, and it looks good on you, no matter what body type you are, will be held at Patchwork Penguin and will include fitting the t-shirt to you.. Several samples were displayed. February's speaker will be Earlene Fowler, a mystery writer, and a quilter; March we will have "The Amish and Their Quilts" by The Quilt Complex.

Barbara Gibson reminded us that the deadline for this month's newsletter entries is Monday, December 13; get your articles in on time so they can be printed and in the mail.

Marva Packey advised Opportunity Quilt tickets were given out to each member attending. Prices are \$1 each, \$5 for 6 tickets, \$10 for 12 tickets. The Opportunity Quilt will be at the Road to California in January, and volunteers are needed to white glove there; sign-up with Marva.

Heidi St. Royal, Quilt Show Chairman, recognized her individual members on the Quilt Show Committee. She thanked each individually for their great efforts, with a special thanks to Nan Maples for doing all the printing for the Show. She said Cathy McNassor is seeking entries for the 24x24 Small Quilt contest, Frances Brannon seeking recipes for the Chuck Wagon Cookbook, with a December 15th deadline for submissions, and don't forget to do your crafts for the Country Store. Nan (Judging Room) and Crystal Dudley and Lettie Williams are looking for volunteer sign-ups for the show.

Heidi told of writing to TV personality Huell Howser, inviting him to the 2011 Glendale Quilt Show. Obviously, having a 'name' at the Show would be great publicity for the Guild. She got an e-mail acknowledgement, and then on Friday night, she got a call from Huell, asking for more information about the Show. She advised him that if he attended, there will be a "Huell Howser Golden California" quilt presented to him. After a very long conversation he advised he loves quilts, and he will get back to us about attending our Show.

Nan Maples, Quilt Acquisition, has a deadline of January 8 for quilt entries, and asked that you get your entry forms in earlier, instead of waiting till the deadline, like last year, when 75% of the entries were submitted the last day. She also asked for sponsors for the Quilt Show awards. Award choices are going fast.

Sharon Bishop announced that she got an e-mail from long-time member Gerda Moller's daughter, advising that Gerda had passed away in November. Mary Ann Kroening fell and broke her shoulder. Pat Rollie had her quilt pictured in Quilter's Magazine.

Chances for a raffle for a free night's stay at the Marriott were sold at \$1.00 per chance, 6 for \$5 and 13 for \$10. A drawing for a free night will be held in January and February. The March drawing will be for TWO free nights.

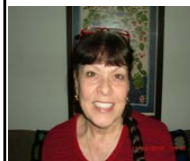
