POINTERS FOR NEW QUILTERS

Techniques : Strip Quilting

Strip quilting is a fast, labor-saving technique that can be used for constructing blocks or borders. In a nutshell, strips of fabric are cut and stitched together in bands. A rotary cutter is then used to create completed rows for block or border assembly. The most basic use for strip quilting would be for blocks or border patterns that feature repeating square or rectangles. Common examples would include a Nine Patch block or Double Irish Chain. Strip quilting can involve diagonal cuts, however, and may be used to construct blocks such as Ohio Star and Pinwheel.

June, 2011

Words from the Heart

Cut a 6 inch square from a fabric of white, beige or pale color. With a permanent marker for fabric, inscribe words from the heart. It can be a poem, just words, a special quote, anything you would like.

All the strips will be 2-1/2 inches wide-Any fabric you'd like!!!!!!

1st row-	both strip same fabric	6 in & 8 in	1 each
2 nd row		8 in & 10 in	1 each
3 rd row		10 in. & 12 in.	1 each

1st row:

Sew 1st 6" strip along the top of the inscribed square
Sew next 8 inch strip along left side of square

2nd row:

Sew 8 " square along top
Sew 10 " sq along left side and continue for the last row

MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild General Meeting
Glendale Central Library May 11, 2011

Meeting Called to Order: 6:30 p.m. by President Barbara Gibson. She welcomed our speaker for the night, Annette Guerrero presenting "My Journey as a Quilter & Contemporary Fiber Artist" She reminded the members of the 3 minute time limit and that Board meetings are open to the general membership, with the exception of June and December, when the extended board meet and space is a consideration. Next Board meeting will be at Fellowship Hall at the La Canada Congregational Church on June 2 at 6:00 p.m. It is a potluck dinner for the incoming Board and the outgoing Board.

Barbara stated that members had received an e-mail announcing the Board's decision to end our current relationship with Loving Hands. There was not a member on the Board who was not deeply saddened by having to take this action, but every Board has a mandate to identify problems and to try to solve these problems in order to build a better and stronger Guild for the future. This was not an easy decision for the Board and it was made with a heavy heart.

Actions Taken: The minutes of the April meeting were approved by the membership as written. Motion seconded and approved unanimously. Fat quarters for June will be animals and pets.

Treasurer's Report: Margie Emmons reviewed the income and expense figures for the month of April.

Corresponding Secretary: Sharon Bishop announced that Kim Smith's twins were born on April 26th, a boy, Jack and a girl, Lucy. There is a need for A-positive blood at Good Samaritan Hospital for the twins. Penny Knapp is going to have back surgery Friday 5/13.

Parliamentarian: Two proposed Bylaws revisions that were noticed in the last newsletter. The first eliminates the age exemption for release from the service obligation. Right now, in order to be a member in good standing, one has to serve two hours at the Guild major fundraiser, which is the Show. In the past there has been an exemption based solely on age, not by disability or illness or any other thing. This motion is to eliminate that exemption. After discussion, the motion was made and seconded "to eliminate the age exemption from the service obligation for the purposes of determining good standing". The motion passed. The second motion combines the offices of the Program Chair and the Workshop Chair. Motion was made and seconded. Discussion was held regarding the effect of the vote on the Board as well as creating a committee by the chairman to perform the duties. A motion "to combine Program and Workshop Chair into one office" was moved. The vote was 36 for and 26 against.

Parliamentarian announced that the motion passed.** (This was not the required majority, however, so the motion did not pass.)

Nan Maples then read the slate of officers up for election: President Barbara Gibson, Vice President Mary Ann Kroening, Recording Secretary Frances Brannon, Corresponding Secretary, Barbara Stuart, Treasurer Margie Emmons, Parliamentarian Nan Maples, Membership Co-Chairs, Annette Guerrero and Louise Rupp and Program/Workshop Chair Colleen Shier, (corrected to Program chair), Newsletter Editor Melinda Helscher, Show Chair 2012 Rasa Read. She called for nominations from the floor. There were no nominations. It was moved and seconded to accept the slate as presented.

Programs: Corrine Gurney announced upcoming programs - June - Ice cream social and table top sale, cost of tables \$10 (you can share); July - Pat Rollie "The Magic of Mistakes"; August - Anne Copeland will be giving quilt appraisals (limit of one quilt per member for appraisal), with a workshop on Saturday on how to do quilt restorations - September Marguerette Tate - "Choosing Fabrics and Quilts Best Suited for Dimensions and Embellishments", Workshop will be "Fun Flowers and More:"

Bus Trips: Judy Sellers said the Long Beach bus will be ready to take us to the quilt show on July 30, the last Saturday of the month. \$15 pays for the bus ride and your admission to the show. Spots going fast.

Newsletter: All items for the June newsletter must be to Karen Waller by Monday, May 16th.

2011 Quilt Show: Heidi St. Royal thanked everyone for all their hard work at the 2011 GQG Quilt Show to make it successful and profitable. She added that due to an oversight in the May newsletter, the 'wrap-up' of the 2011 Show would be in the June newsletter, along with a collage of pictures and the beautiful quilts in the Show At the wrap up party on May 3, the first showing of the Huell Howser visit to our show was viewed by the party-goers and at 8:30 the next morning, Huell called her and asked 'How was it?'. The DVD of the Huell Howser production at our Show is now at the Guild and on sale for \$10, a big reduction from the price on-line. Next showing on TV will be May 19 7:30 p.m. and again on May 20 at 12:30 a.m.

Move to Reinstate Loving Hands: Alice Smith presented a motion to reinstate Loving Hands as a special committee of the Glendale Quilt Guild including a requirement that information on this issue be included in the June newsletter, with reasons for and against the motion and a call for a vote at the July Guild meeting. Motion was seconded. Parliamentarian Nan Maples clarified that the motion on the floor is to reinstate Loving Hands committee and put the pros and cons in the newsletter and advised that both sides, for and against, needed to limit their space in the newsletter. Discussion followed, the sum being that members asked for the publication of the pros and cons. President Gibson explained that one of the problems was non-adherence to the Bylaws by Loving Hands. It was moved and seconded to amend the original motion to include the explanation of the reporting and performance requirements. The motion to amend passed. Vote will be held at the July Guild meeting.

2011 Quilt Show Brandi Nalley said no meeting was scheduled until probably July, but they are looking for volunteers for many, many positions for the 2012 show, so let Rasa or Brandi know if you are interested.

Librarian: Susan Edwards announced that the quilt displayed by Esther Norbut was made from an oldie but goodie book, which Esther donated to the library and is now available for check-out. She also said, because of collection of fines, she was able to purchase "Orphan Block Quilts" which ties in with the 2012 Show theme - and has already received two requests for it.

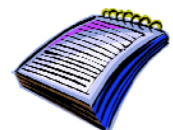

Membership: 100 attendees and 3 guests were announced by Barbara Stuart, and she reminded us that membership dues would be due in June, and they were available on the membership table. Door prizes included animal crackers, fabrics, chocolate bars and one with 2 tickets to the Antelope Valley Quilt show

Program: Annette Guerrero gave us an interesting trip through her life as she progressed from beginning to accomplished quilter with all the blips and successes as she went - the dissertation and the quilts on display were obviously enjoyed by all.

Meeting Opening: Called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Barbara Gibson. The minutes of the last board meeting were unanimously approved as written.

Treasurer: Margie Emmons reviewed copies of the April Treasurer's Report and Show Budget. The Show results were reviewed and Margie presented a complete analysis of the income vs. expenses. It was agreed that this form of stats report be standard in the future. Margie will draft an outline to be followed by future Treasurers.

New Business: The June Board meeting location will be announced. Fat quarters for May will be flowers, June animals, July patriotic. Working from lists furnished by the Opportunity Quilt committee and the Volunteers committee, it was determined that there were some members on both lists, and according to the Bylaws, were no longer in good standing. Those who did not work their 2 hours and did not sell \$10 worth of Opportunity Quilt tickets will be dropped from the mailing list. The Executive Board will take these lists and contact each, if possible, to assure they are at the same address as on the membership roster, and if they were aware of the new Bylaws regarding members in good standing.

Loving Hands:

After much discussion of the failure of Loving Hands to report to the Guild as outlined in the Bylaws and as a direct result of their refusal to participate in the Guild's annual Quilt Show, it was moved and seconded that the Guild withdraw support of Loving Hands and instead pursue a new outlet for the Guild's charitable quilt donations effective July 1, 2011. The motion passed unanimously.

Newsletter: It was pointed out that this is the last newsletter in Karen Waller's term of office and President Gibson thanked her for all her hard work.

Programs/Workshops: Corinne Gurney reported the following: May program: Annette Guerrero, workshop "Borders That Behave". June: Ice Cream Social and Sales – tables to sell your items \$10 each (can be shared). July: Pat Rollie 'The Magic of Mistakes'.

Membership: Barbara Stuart advised that the invitations for the New Members Tea slated for May 22 had been mailed, and presented the Board members their invitation as well. She also had printed up the forms for the membership renewals and they would be available at the May meeting. She advised that the incoming Membership chairman asked that the GQG post office box be used for the return of the renewals, not her home address.

Quilt Show: Heidi St. Royal thanked everyone for all the great work done to make the Show a profitable success. She announced that DVD's of the show (starring our own members!!) will be available at the May meeting for \$10 – quite a saving from the price of it on the HH show. The Huell Howser TV show second airing is May 19 7:30 p.m. and May 20 at 12:30 a.m. She was disappointed that the Show report was not in the newsletter last month, but said that the wrap-up report would be in the next newsletter.

Parliamentarian: Nan Maples announced that we have a full slate of candidates for the upcoming election. Annette Guerrero and Louise Rupp have volunteered to run for Co-Membership Chair; Program Chair – Colleen Shier.

Corresponding Secretary: Sharon Bishop sent congratulations to Kim Smith, whose twins were born April 26 – Jack and Lucy.

Meeting adjourned: 9:35 p.m.

MEMBER NEWS

STATEMENT AGAINST MOTION TO REINSTATE LOVING HANDS

- ☑ The Board does not propose that the Guild abandon the support of charitable quilt donations.
- ☑ The Board has simply withdrawn its support for the Loving Hands group as the Guild's official conduit for the production and distribution of quilts intended for charitable donation.
- ☑ In its place, the Board wishes to support a fully functioning and accountable Special Committee that will serve the ever expanding charitable needs of our community.
- ☑ Since the Board has no authority to disband Loving Hands as an independent sewing group, Loving Hands can continue to get together, make quilts, and contribute them to worthy causes – just like any other mini group.
- ☑ In recognition of Guild Members who have supplied Loving Hands with money, finished quilts, fabric, free labor, time, and energy, the Loving Hands group is welcome to keep its current supplies inventory.

Background

- Many of the requirements of Section 6.02 of the Bylaws have not been fulfilled.
- Frequent informal and formal attempts over at least a three year period to communicate these requirements to Loving Hands leadership have not produced a meaningful result.
- In spite of a failure of accountability over a number of years, **every issue was workable and open to dialogue until March 2011 when the Chair of Loving Hands refused to share a room with Project Linus in a display of quilts intended for charitable donation.** The Chair of Loving Hands told at least two Board members that the members of Loving Hands **voted as a group** to not participate in the show.
- Given that Loving Hands is a Special Committee of the Guild and receives Guild funding, it stunned the Board that Loving Hands would not participate in the Guild's major fund raising activity. The Board does not believe that this is consistent with the values of most of our Members.
- As a result, Project Linus beautifully represented charitable quilt giving on the Huell Howser show - recorded for posterity on the DVD.
- At this point the Board felt strongly that we needed to take immediate action.
- We recommend a vote **AGAINST** the motion to reinstate Loving Hands as a Special Committee of the Guild.

STATEMENT IN FAVOR OF MOTION TO REINSTATE LOVING HANDS

"I move that the Loving Hands be reinstated as a "Special Committee" of the Glendale Quilt Guild in accordance with our Bylaws, Section 7.09(d) as adopted by a vote of the general membership effective October 13, 2010.

Information on this motion should be included in the June newsletter and be voted on at the July General meeting. Notice in the newsletter should include reasons for and against this motion."

Moved by Alice Smith and seconded by Jean Giacomelli.

Communications between the Board and the Loving Hands representative over the past few months has generated negative actions, confusing, conflicting, incorrect conclusions and inflammatory statements and the method of reporting committee actions did not fulfill recent Board reporting requirements. The Board accordingly disbanded the committee.

The first knowledge of this action for most Guild members, including many Loving Hands workers, appeared only in an e-mail with a limited distribution. The Bylaws established this committee and the general membership should vote on the Board action to disband this Special Committee. Loving Hands is a charitable function of the GQG that helps the Guild qualify for non-profit status. Loving Hands strives to provide quilts to meet local needs. The general membership voted that Members may support other groups like Project Linus but do so as individuals.

Loving Hands operates at minimal cost to GQG. Materials are donated to Loving Hands. Storage of quilt materials and quilts is provided by Nancy Foote at no cost to the Guild. Many GQG members participate in making the quilts. Loving Hands workers make up packages of quilt materials that are handed out at GQG meetings. They also conduct a monthly workshop for those who want a place to work, learn and/or improve quilt making skills and enjoy a mutually satisfying social activity.

Positive cooperation between the Board and Loving Hands committee can solve the Board's reasons for disbanding this long time and hard working special committee of the Glendale Quilt Guild.
