Our October speaker, **Judy Sisneros**, has this to say about herself and her workshops:

"My goal as a teacher is that each student go away happy, with a unique quilt – not a copy of everybody else's in the workshop. My classes are not complicated – and I want students to like the quilt well enough to make more than one. As quilters, the most precious gifts we give, (other than our time), are those we make on our own sewing machines. I want to help you to make wonderful gifts for those you love!"

Judy has been enthusiastically sharing her techniques with students since early 1993. Her approach is casual and fun; she encourages originality and creativity, (even if the student doesn't think they have any!). She has been a quilter since 1987 and sewn many years before that. Her first workshop was a strip-pieced landscape resulting in her writing a book about that technique, "Simply Landscapes" which was published in 1994. Her next book "9 Patch Pizzazz", published in March 2006, sold over 58,000 copies. Her latest book, "Rectangle Pizzazz" published January 2008, has 5 projects using mostly rectangles.

Re-Cut, Re-Sew, Re-use Small Quilt Challenge

In keeping with the spirit of our 2012 Show, the small quilt challenge is recut and re sew a block from a poorly sewn 1970's quilt top.

The rules are (1) to use at least 3/4 of the fabric in the block OR 1/2 of the original block fabric plus 1/4 of other sheet fabric from the 1970's. (2) The other fabric and embellishments must be recycled or reused items. (3) The finished quilt may be between 12 to 15 inches square, rectangle or other shape within these parameters. The \$5 fee will go to award prizes for the best use of fabric, best use of color, and favorite.

Photos of the original block will be displayed next to the small quilt.

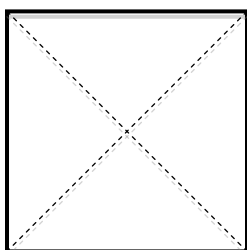
Block of the Month OCTOBER 2011

Center Square: 6 ½" square of a Halloween print

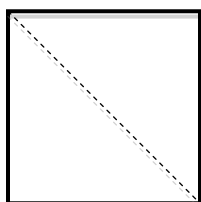
Large Triangle: 7 ¼" square and cut in half diagonally twice (any fabric that will coordinate with your Halloween print)

Small Triangles: cut four 3 7/8" squares and cut in half diagonally once (any fabric that will coordinate with your Halloween print)

Corner Squares: cut four 3 ½" squares of a black print



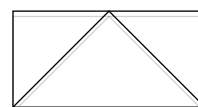
7 ¼" square cuts



3 7/8" square cut

Flying Geese Units:

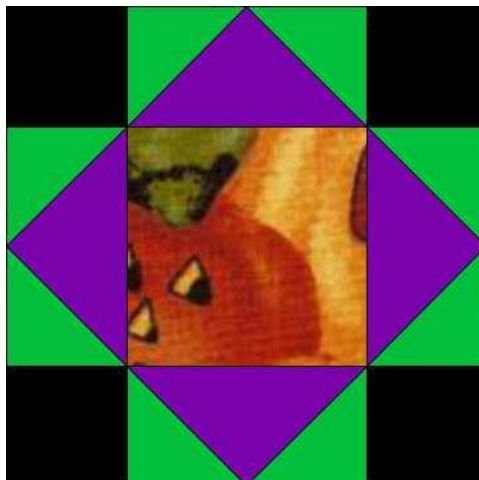
Sew a small triangle to the two short sides of the large triangle, seam towards the small triangles.



press the

Arrange the units as shown in the diagram below. For rows 1 and 3 press the seam towards the corner squares, for row 2, press the seam towards the center squares. Block should measure 12 1/2" when complete.

MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting

Place: Barbara Gibson's Home September 8, 2011

Present: Barbara Gibson, Mary Ann Kroening, Margie Emmons, Annette Guerrero, Frances Ramirez, Rasa Read, Heidi St. Royal, Barbara Stuart, Nan Maples, Brandi Nalley, Louise Rupp, Frances Brannon
Guests: Sue Williams, Alice Turner, Caren Cooke Ryan
Absent: Melinda Helscher, Homa Asef

Meeting Opening: Called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Barbara Gibson. The President called for any corrections to be made to the minutes of the August 4 board meeting. There were no corrections and motion to accept as written was made, seconded and approved.

Treasurer: Margie Emmons e-mailed copies of the August Treasurer's Report and the Guild budget to the Board ahead of time, saving time with the review at the meeting.

Vice President: Mary Ann Kroening presented a request from some of the members of SCCQG to join in a petition of protest regarding lack of communication within the organization. The motion was made to have President Gibson sign the petition. The motion failed and GQG will refrain from signing their petition. She advised the Board that the rent at the Library will be doubled as of October 1; \$150 for 3 hours and \$35 for set up and take down. Workshops will be \$185, plus \$50 for each additional hour, total \$285. It was discussed regarding the possibility of finding another venue, however, the charges are still lower for the space involved than any place we have been able to find. The lighting at night and the parking were also considered a plus. The Board will be looking for places to have workshops in the future.

Programs/Workshops: Colleen Shier asked if everyone could open the e-mail she sent, outlining some possible future programs. She announced the upcoming programs/workshops:

- September: Margaret Tate, "Choosing Fabric and Quilts Best Suited for Dimension and Embellishing"; Workshop Sept. 17 "Sunflowers and More". Materials list is on the website.
- October: Judy Sisneros - "Imagination and Inspiration"; workshop October 13 "Batik Blast"
- November - "Giving Back" (bring items to put in boxes for seniors). Program to be announced. Workshop Nov. 5 "One Block Wonder" by Nan Maples - see the website for information.
- December - Holiday entertainment will be the choir from Nestle.

Membership: Annette Guerrero presented a copy of the new layout for the roster using 8-1/2"x11" paper. It was requested that some additions/corrections be made prior to printing. She requested leaving more space in the back of the auditorium by removing a couple tables and some chairs. This will encourage people to sit closer together.

Quilt Show 2012: Rasa Read said that at the first

meeting for the Quilt Show committee held at Patchwork Penguin, an analysis of the best ideas from past shows was presented, with emphasis on the workshops' financial/attendance records for 2006-2010. It is planned to repeat the Mystery Quilt Block class again this year, with the hotel stays counting toward the entrance to the class for the next years' show. Promotion ideas for the show were discussed, with increased enthusiasm within the community the goal. The Viewers' Choice ballots from previous years will be analyzed to glean information to assist in the 2012 show. A concentrated effort to send out information to other guilds regarding our show each month, starting in October will be done. The importance of outstanding teachers for the workshops to attract participants was emphasized. Rasa asked that ideas for the show be brought to her attention as soon as possible. Caren Cooke Ryan, Publicity for the show, asked for a team to visit other quilt shows to take advertising for promoting our show. She found that Raw Inspiration, who holds about 20 Farmers' Markets, could allow us to sell Opportunity quilt tickets at the markets (no charge as we qualify a non-profit organization) however in order to attract people to our area, we need to sell hand-made items (quilts, etc.) For this we need a 10x10 white fireproof canopy (if anyone has one, please let her know) and approval by a lady named Jenny, to participate.

Corresponding Secretary: Barbara Stuart said Anne Copeland, a well-known teacher at our Guild, had knee replacement surgery.

Loving Hands: Sue Williams said there was great support in the newsletter this month. She said long arm quilters have been taking the quilts, quilting them and giving them to others who do the binding, bring back the finished quilts. She said 6 rolls of batting makes 36 small quilts, and asked permission to put a 'kitty' up at the Guild meeting for donations to purchase batting for future quilts which was granted.

New Business: The October Board meeting will be at Barbara Gibson's home.

Old Business: It was generally agreed to proceed with the idea on the server for Annette's database and e-mail list on Google gmail. Nan Maples said that with this system, all updates to the roster would be posted to the website each month. Discussion of Esther Norbut's list of ideas, such as quilter of the month and no expense fund raisers was tabled for a future meeting.

The Holiday potluck was discussed, and several ideas presented, including having finger foods only, a catered dinner, with/without a charge to the members (costs to be explored by Barbara Gibson), and the regular entrée being purchased by the Guild and volunteers to serve. This was tabled until next meeting, awaiting the results of the costs report.

Meeting adjourned: 9:15 p.m.

Glendale Quilt Guild General Meeting Glendale Central Library September 14, 2011

Meeting Called to Order: 6:30 p.m. by President Barbara Gibson. She announced we are having a "Halloween Spooktacular" in October, and members are encouraged to wear costumes. We are also having a Halloween Hat Contest, with prizes, one being a collection of lovely batik fabric. Halloween treats are encouraged, she is making her world famous Witches Finger Cookies. She thanked Esther Norbut for getting a listing in the *Glendale News-Press* for our Guild meeting for 3 consecutive days. She reminded us that flyers were on the table for upcoming quilt events; Bluejay is having a quilt walk October 1-4. See to Sea Quilt Show October 22-23 in Long Beach. Next board meeting is at her home October 6, 6:30 p.m. She reminded everyone to pick up their new roster (in the new 8-1/2x11" size) as they sign in included are the Opportunity tickets for sale, part of the responsibility of the Guild members to sell the Opp. tickets.

Recording Secretary: The minutes of the August meeting were approved by the membership as written.

Treasurer's Report: Margie Emmons reviewed the income and expense figures for the month of August.

Corresponding Secretary: Barbara Stuart announced that Anne Copeland, a 'regular' lecturer at the Guild each year, had knee replacement surgery. If you would like to send her a card, Barbara has her address, just e-mail her.

Programs: Colleen Shier thanked everyone for helping her set up for the nights program and reminded us of upcoming programs and workshops: October - Judy Cisneros - "Imagination and Inspiration", Workshop Thurs. Oct. 13, "Batik Blast" Patchwork Penguin. November - "Giving Back" - Workshop November 5 - Nan Maples - "One Block Wonder" at Patchwork Penguin Info on Guild website. December - Holiday entertainment by the Nestle Chorus. She thanked Margarette for donating both a pattern for the door prizes and a book for the library.

President Gibson said the reason we are moving the workshop to Patchwork Penguin is that the library has doubled our fee for workshops, and although we have a terrific deal at the library, we save money by doing the workshops at Patchwork Penguin. The Board is looking around for other options for the workshops.

Newsletter: Deadline for newsletter items is Monday, Sept. 19.

2012 Quilt Show: Rasa Read reminded us that our negotiated deal with the Marriott is still the same rate from 2 years ago - \$105 per night, and those who stay at the hotel get free entry in the Mystery Quilt workshop for next year. The next Quilt Show meeting is September 20 at 7:00 p.m. at Patchwork Penguin, and everyone who is even thinking about helping should be there. We do have spaces available. We are trying to think of ideas for things we have never tried before and while some committees that have a person, a lot of times one person is not enough. Every member needs to get involved in some capacity. That's the only way we can pull off this Show. If you are worried that you don't have the experience, Caren Ryan asked for members to join her publicity team, going to the various quilt shows, taking our flyers and perhaps getting permission to show our Opportunity Quilt and selling tickets. Caren plans on going to the quilt show September 24; join the e-mail team and we will carpool. There is another quilt show October 1 (This is the great way to get better acquainted. The other exciting news is that she found this place that does farmers' markets and they do about 25 of them, the Americana on Saturday, Sierra Madre, La Canada. They allow people who sell crafts. We are a non-profit organization and I explained we wanted to sell Opportunity Quilt tickets. We can sell things that are handmade, like we do in our boutique, where the Guild gets 15% and the member gets the rest. We need a team for this one to keep up with the merchandise (all must be handmade) and if you are selling your merchandise, you need to be there and also sell Opportunity tickets. Corrine Gurney, on the

subject of workshops at the Show, listed off names of some teachers for the Show: Bonnie Hunter from Quiltville, Mickey Lawler (fabric painting), David Taylor (how to use a photograph and how to use Photoshop) Larkin Van Horn (beading), and a teen quilting class (reduced price to encourage teen quilting)

Librarian: Susan Edwards said she was wearing a different hat - the Quilt Show. She showed a quilt she purchased on e-bay, the pattern is Sunflower Star, from about 1970. She has taken the blocks apart and the challenge is to use at least three-quarters of the fabric in the block and re-designing the block. You can add any other fabric (re-used) that you wish. There are only 20 blocks, first come, first serve. Prizes will be awarded for the best design.

Loving Hands: Sue Williams said she was very appreciative of the support she was getting from the membership. Long arm quilters are taking up to 20 quilts at a time, donating their time, effort and supplies. They then take them to members who do the binding and bring them back to Loving Hands, ready for the final check and the label. This month they are checking for the binding to go with the kits, and a new quilt pattern was available to see at the meeting. Loving Hands just finished 150 labels, ready for the quilts. The first quarter shows 56 quilts sent out, 2 to members with serious illnesses, 14 as a community service project for the Girl Scouts and 40 delivered to Holy Cross Hospital Neo-natal. Forty more were finished up last meeting, and sent to Good Samaritan Special Infant Care. They are working on 40 more, hopefully to be sent to USC Women's and Children's, now a part of USC. She is working on a history of donations of Loving Hands. A case of batting has been ordered for smaller quilts. President Gibson said Loving Hands has a glut of 359 quilt tops ready for quilting and binding, and invited those willing to quilt and/or bind to get in touch with Loving Hands so the quilts can get out into the community.

Block-of-the-Month: Brandi Nalley presented the October Block of the Month "Halloween". The 36 September blocks were awarded to three members in the drawing, Margaret McNeal, Alanna Lee, and Leah Bessey.

Membership: Some of the door prizes were donated by the Sewing Machine Warehouse, Quilt 'n Things and Patchwork Penguin. Also included were chocolate and fabric, and the patterns from Margarette Tate. Annette Guerrero announced we had 3 new members, Gail McCartney, Marsha Corocko, and Karen Scott. The Mystery Member was Rasa Read and the winner of the fat quarter was Margie Emmons

Show and Tell: A very good showing of quilts and quilt projects was presented by the members and enjoyed by all.
