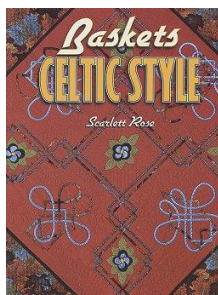
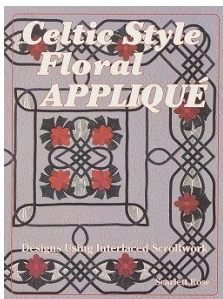

So go ahead and get those quilts entered ASAP. The size of the finished quilt does need to be accurate on the form for the layout and hanging chair.

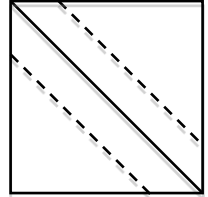

Block of the Month

JANUARY 2012

White Fabric: cut eight squares $3 \frac{7}{8}$ "
Blue Fabric: cut eight squares $3 \frac{7}{8}$ "

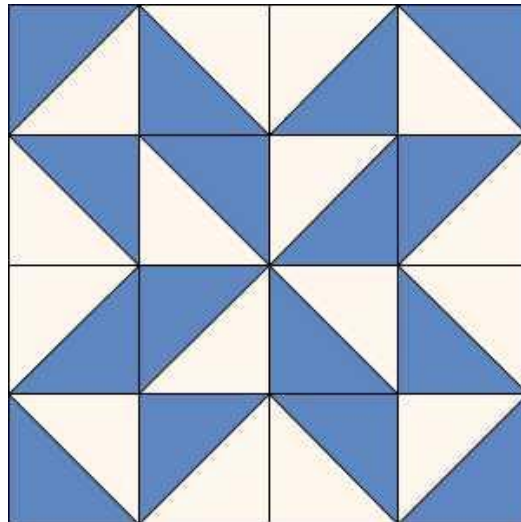
On the wrong side of the $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " square white fabric mark a diagonal line and pair with a $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " blue fabric with right sides together and sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the drawn line.



Cut apart at the drawn line to make 16 half square triangle units, press the seam to the darker fabric.

Arrange the units as shown in the diagram below. Block should measure $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " when complete.

Make up to five blocks for the drawing.

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting

Meeting Opening: Called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Barbara Gibson and issued a grateful "Thank you" to Susan Edwards for hosting our annual Christmas meeting. The President called for any corrections to be made to the minutes of the November 3 board meeting. There were no corrections and the minutes accepted as written.

Treasurer: Margie Emmons reported that all tax reports had been mailed on schedule and printed reports were shared with the Executive Board members. President Gibson called for a vote of confidence for Margie for her excellence in handling the Guild affairs.

Vice President: Mary Ann Kroening advised that the arrangement of tables and chairs at the next meeting was set, with no requests made at the meeting for additional tables beyond the 20 for 120 guests. Door prizes and gift and block exchange have been all arranged. Hospitality: Place mat production was arranged, the president will be getting the table cloths, plates and utensils, Barbara Stuart the table decorations, and the Board was requested to assist with the service.

Newsletter: Several newsletters were returned to the Guild due to the way it was printed (the Postmaster said the automatic scanner was picking up the return address instead of the mailing address). All will be re-mailed in envelopes. The printing problem will be corrected for next month.

Programs/Workshops: Colleen Shier announced the upcoming programs/workshops:

- December – **Start earlier – 6:00 p.m. instead of 6:30** - Holiday entertainment will be the Nestle Choir. (Note: The annual Holiday Potluck, Holiday Block Exchange and Gift Exchange are also scheduled)
- January – Scarlet Rose, famous for Celtic & Appliqué, Subject TBA, workshop Thursday, Jan 12 9:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. at Patchwork Penguin (see details on the website).
- February – Irene Schwall

Membership: Annette Guerrero advised she would be unable to attend the December Guild meeting, but Louise will handle the membership table at the meeting. Barbara Stuart said one more affiliate will be added to the Affiliate Passport via a tag to be attached to your passport. The tags will be available at the Guild meeting.

2012 Quilt Show: Rasa Read presented the beautiful

Quilt Show Programs (in full color!) and said Brandi had a large number of brochure printouts available in her car, and asked that members stop by her car as they leave and get a supply. All brochures are ready to mail out. Nan Maples said no quilt entries have been received as yet and asked that members not wait until January to send in their quilt entries for the Show.

Corresponding Secretary: Barbara Stuart said that Suzanne Curtis fell at home and is in the hospital and must have surgery.

Telephone Tree: Esther Norbut asked that the names of the 23-30 members who do not have e-mail be distributed to the Board members to make calls whenever we have information to be announced.

Loving Hands: Pat Golditch announced that 102 Loving Hands quilts have been distributed in the 3 month period, September through November 2011 delivered to Family Promise of East San Fernando Valley, Good Samaritan Hospital neonatal unit, St. Joseph's Burbank maternity/neonatal unit and Kaiser Hospice, with an anticipated delivery of 60+ quilts to County/USC maternity/neonatal unit and 40 quilts to the Salvation Army before Christmas (to be included in holiday gift baskets for needy families).

Unfinished Business: The President said the January Board meeting will be at Esther Norbut's home and February will be at Nan Maples' home. Frances Brannon handed out a suggested form for submitting items for sale at the Farmers' Market and advised that it will probably be January before we could get a space at the Americana Farmers' Market, but Caren Ryan is checking each Tuesday to see if we are up for the following Saturday. She also advised those who are selling merchandise be prepared to work the booth for 2 hours between 10am to 2pm on Saturday. Nan Maples said to send the form via e-mail to her to be put on the website, as The Farmers' Market Entry Form. As soon as we have the go-ahead for the Farmers' Market, Esther will advise the membership.

New Business: Nan Maples said that January is the time to start looking for candidates for the Executive Board for the year and asked that those interested in serving to let her know. Discussion of extending our Show advertising in the Quilt Navigator was held. This will be submitted to Caren Ryan for her decision as to include this in the advertising budget for the show. The President reminded everyone that it is time to start thinking about the 2013 Show, as this is where the Guild gets the operating budget. It is also time to start submitting ideas for the Opportunity Quilt for 2013 so it will be available for showing at quilt shows, etc. to raise as much money as possible. It was suggested that design ideas be submitted for voting for the membership for this Opportunity Quilt. Rasa advised that this quilt should be ready by April 2012 to be entered into international shows, as waiting until fall limits the availability.

After a delicious potluck meal, the meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Opportunity Quilt 2013: President Gibson announced that designs for the 2013 Opportunity Quilt are being solicited, as we need to get on this as quickly as possible.
