Wednesday, July 13, 2016 Program

Speaker: Linda Rasmussen, NQA-Certified Quilt Show Judge

Ever go to a quilt show and wonder why one quilt wins an award and another does not? What makes this quilt First Place and that one Second or Third? What can I do to improve my quilting so that I have an award winning quilt?

This month's program features Linda Rasmussen, NQA Certified Quilt Judge, who is here to present a program which may answer those and many other questions for you.

Linda has been sewing since the 1970s when she moved to Southern California. Since that time she has taught classes locally in many methods and techniques related to quilting. In 2001 she began to judge quilt shows. Her website lists a plethora of judging experience throughout California. We are also proud to say that she is one of us: a member of GQG.

During her program Linda will bring many of her own quilts to use as concrete examples of what judges are looking for in a quilt.

Here's the fun part! Linda invites members to bring their own quilts for a judging demonstration. She will offer praise and tell us what we did well and not so well, then offers suggestions on what to do to improve our chances of winning awards. Do we see some new Master Quilters in GQG's future?

Be brave! Take a risk! See you (and your quilt) in July for "What a Judge Sees".

Saturday's class with Linda Rasmussen, a certified quilt judge and teacher, is a lecture/show and tell versus a hands-on one. The time is 9AM to 1PM and the cost is \$25. The WAC is located at 600 S. Verdugo Road in Glendale.

Linda will help you troubleshoot areas that can become problems with your quilt and she will make suggestions to help you make the necessary changes to get your quilt ready for presentation in a quilt show. Bring your quilts to show Linda. She will have many good tips on how and what areas to fix your quilts.

Thank you for your support and confidence in both myself and your new executive board. I have gained much through belonging to our guild serving in several capacities, and am honored to have the opportunity to give back in serving as your new President. I was encouraged to take classes offered by the Guild and local shops. Then came my first experience with our guild quilt show. I signed up for every class I could fit into my schedule and loved it. And so here I am, still loving classes and enjoying the company of our wonderful, kind guild members.

We have a top notch guild board this year. The program/workshop team is working hard to search out top speakers and a variety of workshops for all of us to enjoy and learn from. The fundraising team is already planning a fantastic show in 2017 and considering alternative fundraising for this next fiscal year. It is great for guild presidents, program chairs, newsletter editors, fundraising chairs, treasurers, recording secretaries, and communications chairs to learn helpful tips and network with sister guilds in the Southern California area. The object is to share information and learn about how other guilds have handled day-to-day working issues within the guild or had great success with their events

New to many guilds is a chair to handle communications, e.g. website, email blasts, Facebook, Pinterest etc.... This will be a chance to find out how other guilds deal with today's social media. How it is handled in many guilds, who is assigned to social media, and how can they be more effective?

Block of the Month – August 2016

Crayola Crayon Quilt

STRIP color of the month: DARK BLUE/reads as solid. Use as the medium color. Always use white for light for the GUILD BLOCK exchange.

Assemble assorted medium and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt. Finished block 10 ½", Unfinished 11" Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam (not quite 1/4").

For each block cut:

Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"

Squares - 8 matching squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"


Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"

Center square 2" x 2"

Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Use scant 1/4" seam!

Piecing the Blocks:

1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 1/4" square. Referring to top drawing below, place marked square on darker 3 1/4" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line, cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 ¾ square. Make 8 matching pieced squares.
2. Using 2 3/4" matching pieced squares and 2 3/4" squares, make pieced block corner. Refer to second row below. Making 4 matching sets.
3. Referring to the bottom left side below, sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make the Crayola Crayon Block.

The June 2, 2016 meeting of the Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board was called to order at 6:38pm by President Sandy Bradfield at Glendale Womens' Athletic Club.

ABSENT: Parliamentarian: Bishop, Corresponding Secy: Gibson, Advisor: Nalley

EXTENDED BOARD: Loving Hands: Pat Golditch GUEST: Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian elect.

OFFICER & COMMITTEE REPORTS

- RECORDING SECRETARY: (Maples) There being no corrections, the May 5, 2016 Executive Board minutes were approved as printed in the Newsletter.
- VICE PRESIDENT: (Shier) July 9 SCCQG Meeting will cover an informal survey of job duties generally assigned to various positions in member quilt guilds.
- TREASURER: (Shier) Treasurer's Report May 2016 ME (**Attachment A**) and Budget Report ME May 2016 (**Attachment B**). It was generally agreed that a presentation similar to Budget 101 is useful to share with the Membership early in the next fiscal year. Maples will send the format she used to Fogel as a structure upon which to build.
- CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: (Gibson) None.
- PARIAMENTARIAN: (Bradfield) Bylaws proposed revisions will be voted upon at the June Membership meeting. Several questions were raised by Board members and were addressed sufficiently to allow the proposed revisions to proceed.
- PROGRAM: (Millman) Presented a written report (**Attachment C**).
- WORKSHOPS: There are 7 registrations for the Loving Hands workshop.
- MEMBERSHIP (Spinn/Compean): Renewals are coming in. Formal notices will be sent in July.
- NEWSLETTER: (Miyahara) Deadline June 13 – drop dead.
- 2016 FUND RAISING: (Coleman/Wilson) None
- 2017 FUND RAISING: (Bradfield) The first meeting is likely to be in September. A timeline for the 2017 Show is being finalized. Ideas are welcome for an interim fund raising activity for the 2016-17 fiscal year.
- Loving Hands: (Golditch) Annette Guerrero quilted 86 quilt tops. 40 quilts will be delivered to St. Joseph's NICU tomorrow. 100 are ready for delivery to County USC.

OLD BUSINESS

● Open Positions:

Librarian – The future of the Guild Library was examined. We don't know the needs or desires of the Membership relative to Library use, and we have not been able to fill the position of Librarian for at least two terms. In addition, the inventory as posted on the website, while accurate in content but not up to date, is currently unusable since a previous librarian renumbered all of the books and there is no public record of that act. 1) There is administrative work to be done to bring the inventory up to date; 2) A purge of the current inventory is required to reduce the number of books to a level that will meet Member needs; 3) The possibility of having a cabinet at WAC containing the Guild Library will be explored with both the WAC and the Membership.

Block of the Month: Susan Edwards has ideas and is willing if she can receive assistance in writing the instructions.

- **Post Office Box: (Fogel)** The transition is complete with the exception of some bureaucratic details that need to be worked out to guarantee forwarding of mail from the former PO Box to the current PO Box.
- **Procedural Manual Updates:** (Fogel/Shier) These are now due unless arrangements have been made with Kathy Fogel. Hard copy to incoming Officer. Electronic copy to Kathy.

NEW BUSINESS

- **Electrical Upgrade at WAC: MOTION** (Miyahara): To use \$1000 from the current fiscal year shortfall in the Workshop budget to specifically support electrical updrades at the WAC clubhouse pending WAC Board approval to proceed with the project. Unanimously approved after extensive discussion.
- **Proposed 2016-17 Budget:** (Fogel)The proposed budget (**Attachment D**) was examined line by line. **MOTION** (Fogel): That the Proposed Budget for 2016-17 be recommended to the Membership for approval as presented. Unanimously approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm.

- **VICE PRESIDENT:** (Bradfield) An ongoing issue relative to the availability of the current meeting space at First Congregational Church was shared with the Membership. The President will update as this issue evolves.
- **TREASURER:** (Fogel) See Treasurer's Report in the Newsletter. Going forward the Treasurer will make available for review by the membership the year-to-date expenses against budget. SPACER BORDER © 2000

Have you ever made a quilt center and then designed and made a fancy border to go with it and then realized that there was space between the two? How do you fill it and make everything look good? Below is one answer:

To make your pieced border fit your quilt center you will need to add a spacer border. To figure the width to cut the spacer border, measure the length of the pieced border at the edge that would normally attach to the quilt center. Then measure the length of your quilt center down the middle. Subtract the quilt measurement from the border measurement and divide by 2 (you have to split the amount between the two sides.) Then add ½" for seam allowances and this is the width you cut that spacer border. If your quilt is square, the spacer border will be the same for all four sides. However, if your quilt is rectangular, you may have a different width spacer border for the sides (length) then for the top and bottom (width). So you will need to measure both length and width and make two calculations as above.

The border width that you arrived at for the top and bottom is the width you cut the side borders. And in turn, the measurements for the sides are added to the top and bottom lengths. The length of the spacer border is determined by the length of the quilt center plus twice the width of the spacer border.

Remember to match your quilt and border at first and third quarters and in the middle. It is best to sew with the quilt towards the feed dogs.
