

Class supply List for 1 Day ice dye class

The Guild or sponsoring agent is responsible for making sure there is an ice supply close to the teaching venue. The ice will be purchased by the instructors, but must be sourced and picked up prior to class, making sure there will be enough for approximately 30 lbs./student. There must also be water available on site for use during class. This is just for clean-up purposes and will not be used for the actual dyeing.

Kit fee: 15\$ per student. This includes all supplies needed except for fabric.

This includes all dyes, ice, chemicals, gloves, measuring and application tools, containers for dyeing, plastic bags for transport, industrial detergent and written instructions for techniques covered.

The following Pimatex Cotton is needed for each student:

At least 7 to 10 yards for ice dyeing. If you are bringing your own fabric you do not have to bring Pimatex, but it must be PFD (prepared for dyeing) or it must be washed prior to class. NO Softeners, NO Bleach...Bring the highest quality fabric you can if you are not purchasing it from us. It really does make a difference in the final product.

Pimatex is a finely woven high quality, high thread count cotton that gives superior results when used for this type of dyeing. It is the only fabric that we use for our ice dyed cotton.

We can supply Pimatex for your group @ 7.50/yd, preordered.

If you wish to dye more fabric at the time of the workshop. it will be available for purchase from Nick and Chase for \$8.00/yd.

We will also have some other fabrics available. Some silks, linens, cotton lawn, cotton and rayon jersey... What ever gets thrown in the truck that day! prices for the other fabrics will vary from \$8.00 – \$25.00 per yard.

Workshop supplies provided:

Procion Dyes, Synthrapol (industrial detergent),

2 plastic shoe boxes, Ice, Squirt bottles, Plastic Mesh, Sifter,

Plastic spoon, Measuring cups, Rubber gloves, Masks, Soda Ash

Urea, Salt, Buckets for soaking the fabric. Written instructions for the dye process.

Students provide the following:

Aprons, or grubby clothes

Containers to dye your fabric and transport it home. We often use plastic shoe boxes from Lowes or home depot. We will also have shoe boxes for sale at the workshop.

Optional T-shirts or any garments you want to dye. Be sure fabric is cotton, silk, rayon, or bamboo. No polyester or polyester blends.

If you choose to bring extra items to dye, please bring extra plastic shoe boxes to carry them home in.

Usually 2 yards or 2 small - medium T-shirts will fit into a shoe box. If anyone has a spare ice chest they can bring it is appreciated. The teachers will bring 3 large ones.
