Supply List for Flowers (square or rectangle)

This project is machine appliqué, it is fun and easy to do. To learn this technique it is best to start with four applique squares. The applique squares are 8" in size. This sample above has 4 squares on one large background. The table runner on the side is the same supplies, but has five squares and the background fabric is cut in half and sewn together to make a long rectangle.

Supply List for 4 Flowers



- Fabric for applique squares 1/4 yd. of four colors (five colors if doing the rectangle) Fabrics with high contrast looks great, we will not get to the borders in class, but choosing a border fabric first, (1/2 yd.) will help to decide flower applique squares.
 - Fabric for background 1 yd. (light color)
- 1 yd. Wonder-under or any fusible paper-backed webbing
 - Sharp scissors and pencil
- An iron, a protective applique sheet, so your iron stays clean
 - I will also have two of them with me
- 12 1/2" square ruler, a 6" x 24" long ruler, rotary cutter, cutting mat
 - Tear-away stabilizer for machine applique (optional)
- Sewing machine (optional) with zigzag foot, I have used a blanket stitch, and a zigzag stitch with decorative thread around all of the raw edge appliqué. We might get to use the sewing machine in the afternoon. If you have done this technique before, you could be doing the machine appliqué later in the day.

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
