MORE QUILT GUILD HISTORY

Recently Alice Smith met with Ivy Fiske, the first Glendale Quilt Guild President from 1982. Although unable to attend our GQG celebration, Ivy expressed her thoughts about the event. She said, "It's hard to believe the Glendale Quilt guild is celebrating its 25th Anniversary. I think back to the early days when it was a struggle to find a meeting place, gain members and find good programs. I am proud to say that I had a part in the formation of the Guild. Congratulations to those who have supported the Guild for this past quarter of a century."

Carol Andrews, our founder, presided as chair pro-tem at the first GQG meeting on January 18, 1982. Those present chose an official name, accepted by-laws, and elected a slate of officers. Carol then turned the meeting over to newly elected president Ivy Fiske. A logo symbol that was designed by Cathi Nixon was presented at the first meeting. She also won the contest for the design of our banner. The Guild took over running of the Quilt Show and Ivy became the 1983 Show Chair. In 1984, aprons with the logo on them were introduced to identify volunteers and members at the show. Also, the first Opportunity Quilt with a "Storm at Sea" pattern was presented.

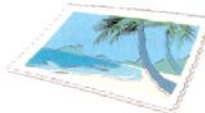

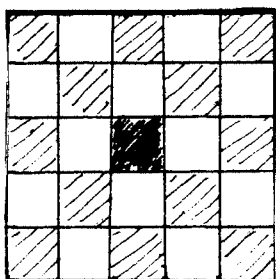

JANUARY 2007

This month's block is called

Silver Anniversary Block

In honor of the 25th anniversary of our Guild we are making a block with 25 pieces this month. The center piece is silver fabric with the remainder in two tones of lavender. With strip piecing this block goes together quickly. Happy Anniversary!

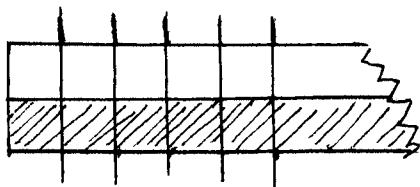


10 inch finished block
(10 ½ inches with seam allowances)

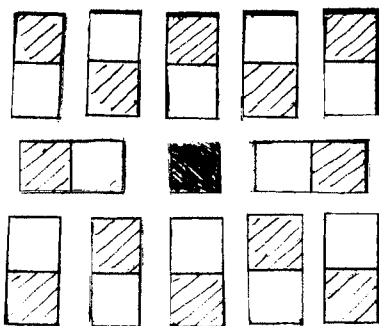
Cutting plan:

Cut 2 strips – 2 ½ inches wide by 30 inches long, one in medium lavender and one in darker lavender.

Center square — One 2 ½ inch square of silver fabric.



Seam the two strips together along the long edges and cut crosswise into 12 pieces that are 2 ½ inches wide.



Turn pieces as shown in diagram and sew together with the silver square in the center.

Three full width-of-fabric strips (2 ½" X 40") of each color will make 4 blocks quickly!
Four full width strips of each color are needed to make five identical blocks.

Make up to five blocks. If you don't want to win the blocks you can always sign your chances over to Loving Hands. Your blocks may all be identical or you may use various fabrics. At the December Guild meeting there will be a piece of silver fabric attached to each flyer. There is enough fabric to make up to 5 center squares. This Silver Anniversary present is a gift from our affiliate **A Quilter's Dream**, 150 N. San Gabriel Blvd., Suite 500, Pasadena, CA 91107 Tel: 626-744-2779. We thank them very much! The fabric is Michael Miller's D-CM376 Fairy Frost in Platinum. Unfortunately the fabric gift will not be available for those not at the meeting. Substitute any silver or white fabric.

2007 SHOW VOLUNTEER SHIFTS

It is that time of year when members need to start thinking about what day and shift they would like to sign up for to fulfill the 2 hour minimum quilt show volunteer duties required by the Guild By-Laws. Each member is expected to serve a 2 hour minimum shift as a White Glover or on one of the various committees during the Quilt Show in order to be eligible for membership renewal in June 2007. A member can also earn a ten dollar voucher if they volunteer for an additional 2 hours White Gloving, which may be used towards the purchase of any guild merchandise or towards any regular workshop given throughout the year. (It cannot be used for 2007 quilt show workshops). Vouchers are handed out within 1 to 2 months following the completion of the Quilt Show. Members aged 75+ are exempt from serving the 2 hours, so please make sure to give Mary Beth Kile or Susan Van De Vyvere your name so they can note your exemption. Any other members unable to work during the show must submit a letter stating the reason and send it to the Membership Committee for review. Reasons such as "I do not have time" are not acceptable as we really need every member's support to pull off a successful quilt show. There are 3 sitting and 2 sitting/standing jobs available per 2 hour shift, designed for those members who cannot stand for a full 2 hour period. We ask all members to please leave these positions available for the individuals that require them.

Please be aware some shifts may fill up faster than others, and if you are taking quilt show classes, it is your responsibility to find a time to serve. White Glove shifts are as follows: Friday 2 - 4 pm, 4 - 6 pm & 6 - 8 pm, Saturday 9 - 11 am, 11 - 1 pm, 1- 3 pm & 3 - 5 pm, and Sunday 10 - 12 pm, 12 - 2 pm & 2 - 4 pm. Quilt set up is on Thursday from 6 - 8 pm & 8 - 10 pm and quilt take down is on Sunday from 4 - 6 + pm. We will also need some extra White Glove help for 1:30 - 2 pm on Friday.
