Workshop: *Piped Binding by Machine* with Rasa Read

Rasa says: “I love to do quilt binding. It means a project is almost finished, and in this workshop I will show you how to make beautiful piped bindings with crisp mitered corners - ALL by machine. They are twice as pretty and take half the time. This technique will improve your binding abilities by 400%! Trust me, I can do math too, and, I’ll show you 3 distinct techniques!”

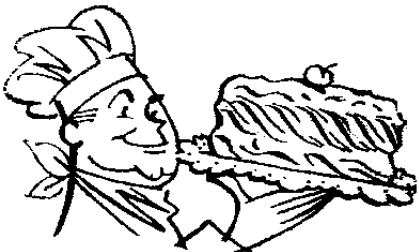

Workshops

JUNE WORKSHOP - Members Only

Rasa Read *“Piped Binding by Machine”*

Date: June 14th, 2008 *SATURDAY*
Time: 9:00 am - ??? (bring lunch)
Location: TBA
Cost: \$20. (one \$10. voucher may be applied)

In this workshop, you will learn to make a clean, mitered binding...without all the hand-work! As a GQG Master Quilter, Rasa has completed many of her own quilts using this method, and she wants you to be able to give your future projects the best possible “finish” as well.

Length: Half Day

All Levels

You will be learning 3 techniques:

- A. HOW TO MAKE PIPING & PIPED EDGE.
Use this technique to finish garment collars & edges, or an heirloom tablecloth, or any other project that needs a crisp finished edge.
- B. HOW TO MITER CORNERS.
A “must” for making a clean, squared off, professional-looking finish...
- C. HOW TO APPLY “A” & “B” TO PRODUCE AN IMPECCABLE BINDING ON YOUR NEXT QUILT!

SUPPLY LIST

- Bring a small project ready to be bound, no more than a crib size quilt. Maybe a placemat or table-runner. All corners should be 90 degrees – no sharp or obtuse or inner corners.
- Bring a sewing machine. It **MUST** have: a pin tuck foot, 5 or 7 groove & an edge-joining foot. (See pictures) Edge-joining foot is used for the final step, so you may be able to learn by observing the demo...
But you must bring the piping foot. Bring a screw-on seam guide, if you have it.(Or use masking tape instead)
- Bring basic sewing and rotary cutting tools, including a square ruler with a diagonal mark.
- Bring a mechanical pencil or a very thin sliver of soap for marking - whichever will show on binding fabric.
- Bring pre-cut fabric strips for binding. If you plan to work on a sample, neither color nor quality is important. If you plan to work on an actual quilt, you must pick “coordinating” fabric. The piping fabric should contrast with the quilt, preferably solid, and of a finer (thinner) cotton. This technique produces binding on the straight of grain; so the binding fabric should be sturdy, good quality cotton that is not too prone to ravelling.
- Bring sewing thread. If you plan to work on a sample, then color is not important. If you plan to work on an actual quilt, you will need three colors of thread:
 - 1 - to match the piping
 - 2 - to match the binding
 - 3 - to match the back of your quilt.
- Bring good glasses and patience - this is a precision technique class, and I am a mean teacher. (However, I might soften up if you bring snacks).

CUTTING DIRECTIONS FOR ANY PROJECT - MEASURING W” by L”:

- From piping fabric cut: 2 strips measuring 1” wide by W”+2” and 2 strips measuring 1” wide by L”+2” long.
- Fold all 4 strips in half lengthwise, press. This yields 1/2” wide skinny strips: two each for Width and Length
- From binding fabric cut 2 strips measuring 3” wide by W”+2” long.
- Cut 2 strips of binding fabric measuring 3” wide by L”+2” long.



LOVING HANDS QUILT PACKETS


This time of year we usually encourage members to think about putting together a few quilts for Loving Hands as these charitable donations are needed all through the year, not just during the holidays... Pat Grim has packets available for piecing tops together (see below), and other quilts that need finishing work. Both are a great opportunity for new members to participate in a simple guild activity and meet other members, or for beginners to "practice" honing skills. Loving Hands meets on the 2nd Friday of the month at 1038 E. Elmwood, Burbank and they hope to see you there soon. Thank you!

There are basically two kinds of packets: those that have thirty blocks and those that have forty-eight. Most consist of six inch blocks and have a border. If the packet has seven inch blocks, there is no border. Sometimes a packet will consist of donated blocks or unusual configurations. In these cases you simply use your imagination to construct the top. Although there is no right or wrong way to put the blocks together, the following diagram illustrates an easy way to put together the conventional packets of thirty blocks.



Note that this does not necessarily mean that there are only two fabrics. You may have to determine what the like types are. We do try to use fifteen blocks of one fabric, but that is not always possible

If there are forty-eight blocks, a similar pattern can be used.



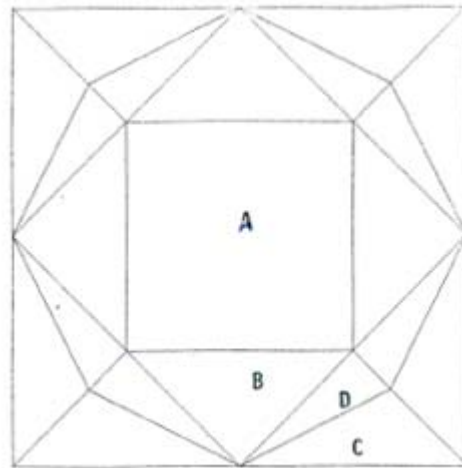
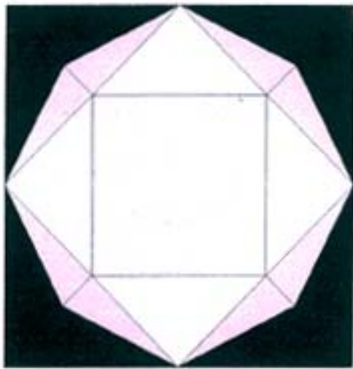
If your packet is missing a few blocks (or has too many), you may return it for another at the next meeting (please don't call Nancy or Pat about irregularities). Or you can use your imagination and your own stash to fill in. Remember, there is no single way to construct these tops. Your creativity may yield a really wonderful alternative to the standard pattern. Go ahead and play and have fun!

This month's block is called

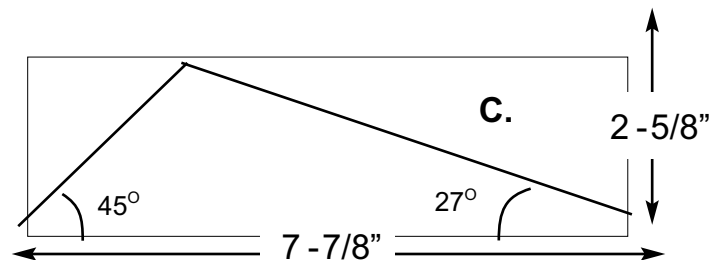
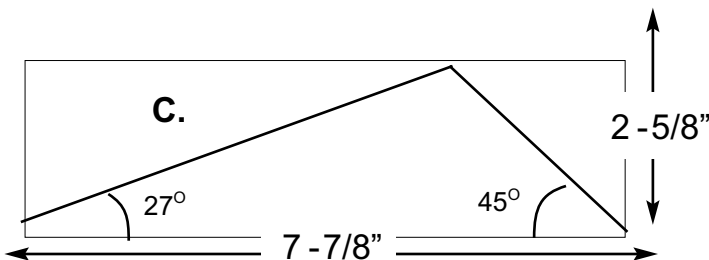
PEARL



FABRICS: Background - Kona Black
Pearl - Use pale shades of:
Gray, Blue, Pink Lavender
or White-on-White, or Beige (use several different shades for more depth)

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

- A.** Center Square: 6-3/4" x 6-3/4"
- B.** 4 Large Side Triangles: 7-1/2" cut on the diagonal 2 times
- C.** Kona Black: Cut strips 2-5/8" x 7-7/8"
Medium Triangles: Cut 4 at 45 degrees from left & from top to lower left corner.
Cut 4 at 45 degrees from right & from top to lower right corner.
- D.** Pearl fabric: Cut strips 2-1/8" x 6-1/4"
Small Triangles: Cut 4 on the diagonal from lower left to upper right
and 4 from upper left corner to lower right corner.



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS: Sew 4 large triangles (B) to center square (A), press & square up. Sew medium black triangles (C) to small triangles (D) as in drawing, then sew the 2 mirror images (C-D) together. Attach each corner piece to straight edge of center square.

Meeting Reports



Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Location: Glendale Central Library Date: May 8, 2008

Present: Alice Smith; Heidi St. Royal, Jean Giacomelli, Nancy Mraz; Sandy Bradfield; Susan Edwards; Sabine Steinmetz; Pat Grim; Sue Vite; Frances Brannon, Sharon Bishop.

Meeting called to order at 6:45 p.m.

Minutes: Correction was announced re: nominees for 2009 Program Chair – Barbara Gibson; and for Workshop Chair – Ann Calloway, assisted by Donna Hovartos. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Finance – Nancy Mraz announced no bill has been received from the Marriott as yet, so the show expenses are not complete. Final show expenses are expected to be under budget. The financial report was approved as written.

Parliamentarian – Pat Grim announced Mia Bloom has accepted the nomination for Corresponding Secretary. The membership will vote at the next General Meeting. Invitations will be sent out for the Incoming/Outgoing Board Pot-Luck on Thursday, June 26th at Susan Edward's home. The outgoing Board will host. RSVPs will be required.

Vice President – Heidi St. Royal announced the Country Store had approx. \$8,800.00 for the Guild, once all charges have been collected. She thanked her group for all their hard work in making the Country Store a success. She also suggested that the Merchandise Table be closer to the store next year & that all workers should wear the Guild shirts.

President Alice Smith thanked

everyone for the successful general meeting last month. The teaching & vendors' tables were enjoyed by the entire membership. Sue Vite suggested we invite the vendors again in the fall. Alice has also prepared a survey sheet to be sent with membership renewal letters. It will help to provide the Board with feedback from members.

Newsletter – Sabine Steinmetz announced last month's newsletter expenses were \$540.26, but this month costs were only \$296.16, due to the reduction in printing & mailing costs, representing a savings of \$244.10 for the Guild. Sabine mailed 123 newsletters this month. Postage will increase to \$.42 next week. SCCQG was sent a copy as usual.

Correspondence - Susan Edwards reported she has sent a sympathy card to Susan Ann Mause. It was also announced that a former member, Kay Shoaf Deckman has passed away.

Programs – Sue Vite announced the up-coming programs: May 14 – Joy Lily "Dyeing to Tell You". June 11 – Officer Installation & block exchange with Show & Tell of past exchanges, and Girl Scouts performing a Flag Ceremony. Guild Master Quilters will display their winning quilts & possibly speak. July 9 – Phyllis Binkley "Showing Depth & Space in Landscapes".

Workshops – Thurs. May 15 – Joy Lily "Marbling on Fabric"; Sat. June 14 – Guild sponsored event: Rasa Read "Piped Binding by Machine" for members only at \$20./person (one \$10 voucher will be accepted); July 12 – Phyllis Binkley "Painting with Fabrics".

Membership – Jean Giacomelli reported new membership forms with the new fees will be sent out along with Alice's survey. She needs to order more tri-fold Guild information forms for guests. Guild contact information needs to be changed to reflect the P.O. Box & web address only.

2009 Show – Rasa Read said she still needs volunteers & will begin holding show meetings in July. Our opportunity quilt should be ready for the Long Beach Show.

Equipment – Sharon Bishop announced we still have badge holders

in stock & suggested that we use them for the 2009 Show. There are a lot of 2008 lanyards left over that we can't use again. She also has 2 sewing machines in storage – 1 works & 1 needs repair. Sharon suggested the Guild sell them at the Country Store next year.

Loving Hands – Pat Grim said the next meeting is on May 9th. (It's always the 2nd Friday of the month.) She asked that a Thank You be sent to Rebecca Bricker for her donation of children's & holiday fabrics.

Philanthropy – Pat Grim made the recommendation that \$2,000. be donated to the Pasadena History Museum this year. The Board voted to send \$500. to the Pasadena History Museum specifically for the acquisition of quilts & \$500. for the San Jose Museum of Quilt History.

Alice Smith discussed the proposed Bus Trip to the Long Beach Quilt Festival on Friday, July 25th. A sign-up sheet will be available at the May general meeting. We can get a free bus from Congressman Adam Schiff if we have 40 to 57 people guaranteed. The cost to Guild members for the trip will be \$15.00 & includes the \$8.00 entrance fee. The Bernina Fashion Show is extra. Attendees will meet at a Park & Ride (location to be determined) at 9:00 a.m. & return at about 7:00 p.m.

Alice also asked that the Board create a committee to brain-storm ideas, review survey info. & make recommendations to the Board.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

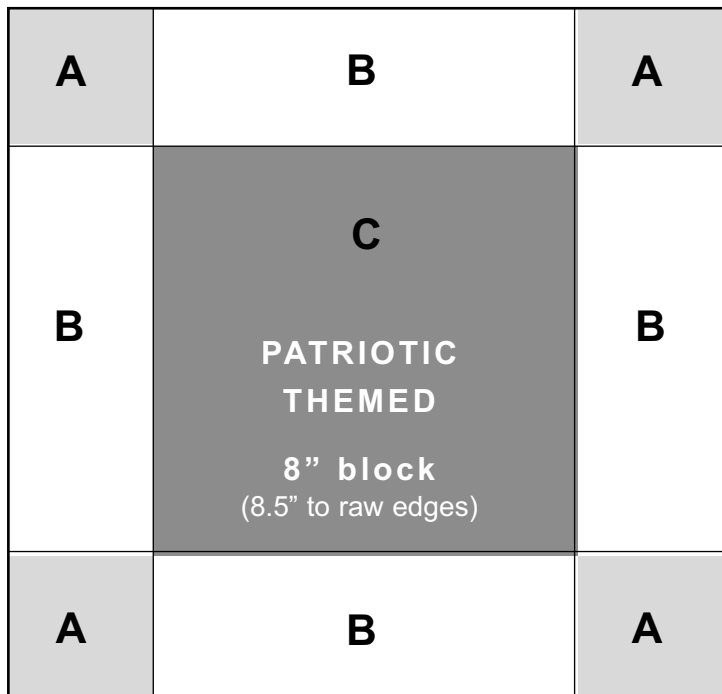
8" PATRIOTIC "SWAP" BLOCK

OOPS! We measured wrong!!!

As a few of you have already pointed out to us - the instructions we gave last month for the block below will yield an 8" square, not 6"...

We apologize for the confusion, but it will still be O.K. for the exchange and we hope you had fun making them!

and for those who like to work at the last minute - here it is again:
out 8" Patriotic Block !



Cut 4 pieces in Red, White or Blue fabric at 2.5" square for corners: **A**

Cut 4 pieces in Red, White or Blue fabric (in contrast to the corners) at 2.5" x 4.5" for frame: **B**

Cut 1 piece at 4.5" square for center block: **C**

Sew strips with 1/4" seams (right sides together): A-B-A, B-C-B and A-B-A. Assemble rows as a 9 patch.

NOTE FOR FUTURE:

To make a 6" block, cut corners **A** at 1.5", and framing strips **B** at 1.5" x 4.5". Center unit **C** & assembly remain the same.
