Joy-Lily



Excerpted from the artist's brochure, Joy-Lily describes herself as:

"I am a silk painter, quilter, dyer, printmaker and surface designer. Plain fabric is not safe around me. I have taught fiber art for over 25 years. My fiber art has been exhibited in the U.S., Europe and China. My work has been published in Japan and the United States.

My teaching style is playful and collaborative. I present techniques and projects that are goof-proof. Workshop participants create work they love on their very first try! For experienced fiber artists, I offer new techniques and alternative materials to expand their creative possibilities.

I am currently working on a how-to book about quilting with color-gradient fabrics. You can see some of my fiberart work on the web at: www.joy-lily.com."

"Dyeing to Tell You" is a lively and informative slide talk about dyes and colors. It is suitable for quilt guilds and *anybody* who likes to work with fabric! The slides are of Joy-Lily's silk paintings, batiks and quilt art, plus diagrams demystifying how dyes work and colors blend. This presentation has valuable information for "dye-shy" stitchers as well as experienced dyers and artists.

Please check page 6 for a template to make a few simple 6" blocks (6.5" with raw edges)... for another fun (and easy) "Block Exchange" !

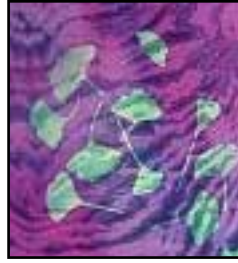

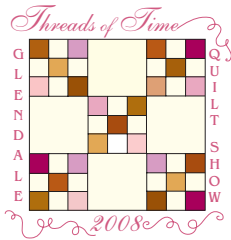

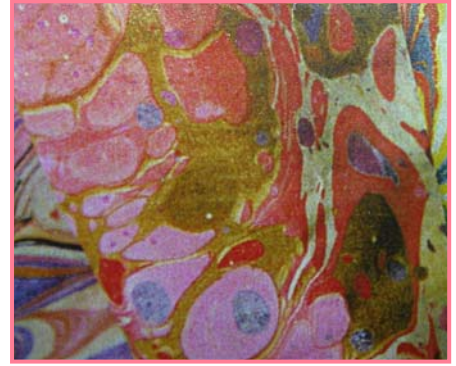

MAY WORKSHOP

Joy-Lily “*Marbling on Fabric*”

Date: May 15th, 2008 *THURSDAY*
Time: 9:00 am - 3:30 pm (bring lunch)
Location: Patchwork Penguin (address on back page)
Cost: GQG members - \$40.00 (or \$30. with voucher)
Non-members - \$55.00



You will float colors on water and print these swirling patterns onto fabric with colorfast inks. Gelatin recipes, fabric preparation, color mixing, traditional & experimental patterns will all be covered... By the end of the day you will be making large marble prints in a jumbo tray!

Length: Six hours

All Levels

SUPPLY LIST

- Fabrics to print, plain, non-nap, light colors. (It is fast and easy to marble, so bring lots of fabric)
 - Apron or preferably painting clothes
 - Waterproof gloves
 - Sharpie or other permanent marker
 - Plastic bags to take home wet stuff.
- 1 shallow tray about the size of a placemat, per every 2 students, as they will be working in pairs at first. (The lids of paper boxes from a copy store work well as do trays from canned soft drinks.)

At the meeting the instructor will provide participants with small packets of alum powder and instructions on how to pre-soak their fabrics and dry them before coming to class.

At the workshop site you will be using the following, (which will be provided for you):

2 or 3 five gallon (white plastic kind) buckets,
a bunch of small shallow trays,
about half a shopping bag of newspapers,
plastic table covers,
iron and big towel as a board,
clothes line and clips...

and the kitchen sink!

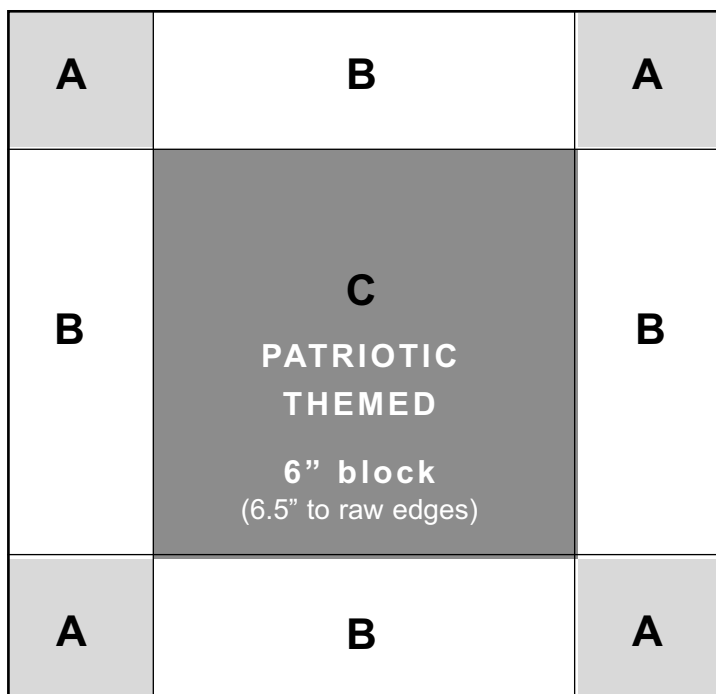

JUNE PATRIOTIC "SWAP" BLOCK

Our June meeting is traditionally reserved for members only as it is a business meeting at which we install new officers and begin the new year... however, that doesn't mean we can't have some fun too! As Independence Day will fall prior to our July meeting, we have decided on a patriotic-themed block: reds, whites, and blues framing either stars, stripes or an appropriately "fussy-cut" image (Statue of Liberty, Flag, Liberty Bell, etc.)

Using the pattern below, make as many of the same (or different) blocks to "swap" at the June meeting and then let's see some of you put them together for "Show & Tell" in July! A super easy block, and super fun exchange to participate in - Time to be creative!



Cut 4 pieces in Red, White **or** Blue fabric at 2.5" square for corners: **A**

Cut 4 pieces in Red, White **or** Blue fabric (to contrast with corners) at 2.5" x 4.5" for frame: **B**

Cut 1 piece at 4.5" square for center block: **C**

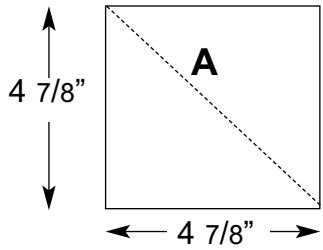
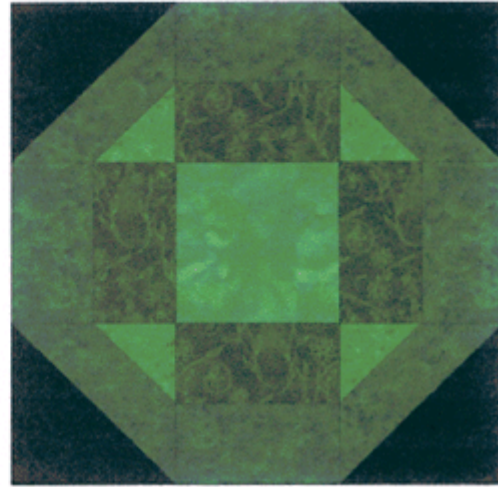
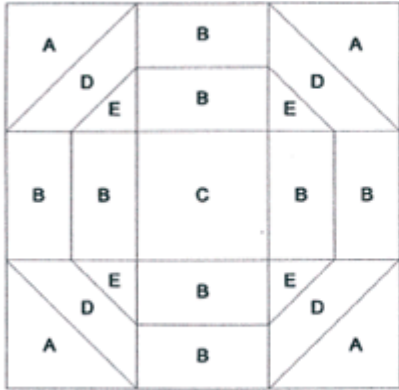
Sew together with 1/4" seams (right sides together): A-B-A, B-C-B & A-B-A. Assemble rows as a 9 patch & press.

Block of the Month

MAY 2008

This month's block is called

EMERALD

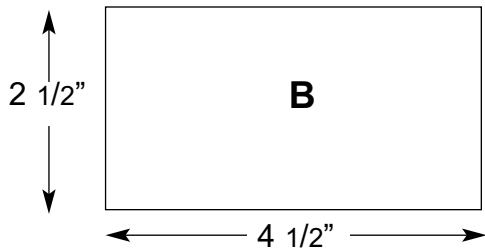


Cut 2 squares at 4 7/8" and trim out diagonally to make total of 4 triangles.

Net: 4 patches:
Kona Black

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Sew "ADE" corner blocks. (Sew D to A, & then E to AD). Total = 4 squares.
2. Sew each different B patch to another B patch for 2-tone effect. Total = 4 squares.
3. Sew into a 9-patch block as in diagram. Square up @ 12.5".

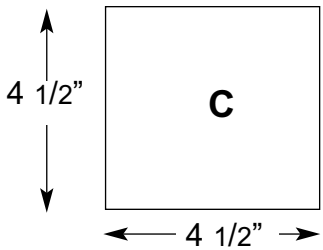


Cut 8 rectangles * at 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".

* 4 ea. of 2 shades of Green

Net: 8 patches: 2 Greens

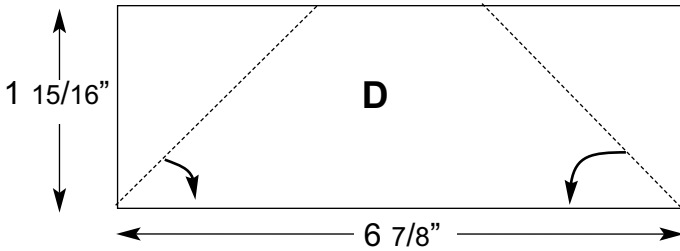
Make up to 5 blocks for the exchange.



Cut 1 patch at 4 1/2" square.

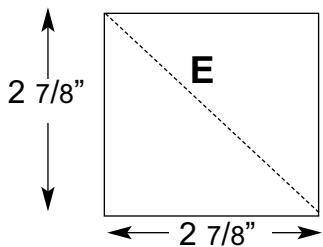
(For center of block)

Net: 1 patch: Green



Cut 4 rectangles at 1 15/16" x 6 7/8", then cut a 45° diagonal off of each end as shown.

Net: 4 patches: Green



Cut 2 squares at 2 7/8" and trim out diagonally to make total of 4 triangles.

Net: 4 patches: Green

Date: April 3, 2008**

Meeting called to order at 6:40 pm.

Pat Grim discussed the results from the Nominating Committee. The following were nominated for the new board: President - Heidi St. Royal; Vice President - Sharon Bishop; Secretary - Susan Edwards; Treasurer - Paula Thomas; Parliamentarian - Nancy Mraz; Program Co-Chairs - Barbara Gibson & Ann Calloway; Workshop Chair - Donna Hovartos; Membership Chair - Frances Brannon; Newsletter Editor - Sandy Bradfield; Quilt Show Chair 2009 - Rasa Read; Quilt Show Chair 2010 - Caren Ryan; Advisor - Alice Smith. Open positions include Corresponding Secretary; Website - Melinda Helscher; Loving Hands - Pat Grim & Nancy Foote. Board will continue to accept nominations until the vote at the June general meeting.

As Parliamentarian, Pat Grim also reminded the Board of problems with the show regarding those authorized to sign for charges at the hotel. This requirement must be added to all future contracts & every expense must be approved by the Board in order to maintain budgetary control.

Minutes were approved as written.

Nancy Mraz gave Treasurer's Report and it was approved as written. She also reported expense categories

need to be redone for next year and we need to secure more sponsors for show awards. It was agreed that 2008's show program was smaller and cheaper to operate for the Guild.

Newsletter - Sabine Steinmetz asked for a copy of the award winners from Nan Maples for the newsletter. This is the last month to sign up for mailed copies of the newsletter. Effective in May, it will be available on the website only. Sabine will report the numbers for mailing at the next Board meeting.

Correspondence - Susan Edwards reported she sent the following cards on behalf of the Guild: Violet Bos & Dona Garding - sympathy for brother & get well for Violet's injury; Mary Kay Busalacchi - sympathy for mother; Kim Smith - sympathy for grandmother.

Programs - Sue Vite reported Erwin Bear is anxious to attend one of our meetings. He will bring fabrics to the meeting and present a short program at no charge. Sue also said she received positive comments from Rob Appel's presentation and class, and that he is anxious to be invited to teach at our show. We were then informed the show committee has already filled the list of instructors for 2009, although the Board has not yet approved this list. The Girl Scouts are asking for donations of fabric from the Guild to make insulation scarves for donation packages to be sent to the troops abroad. This will be proposed for philanthropy this year. Sue announced the upcoming programs: May 14 Joy-Lily "Dyeing to Tell You"; June 11 - Officer installation, block exchange, July 9 - Phyllis Binkley "Showing Depth and Space in Landscapes".

Alice Smith announced Anne Batiste will attend our general meeting this month and her students will present their quilts at 7:15 pm. In June, the Girl Scouts will open the general meeting with a flag ceremony.

Alice will conduct a demonstration of quilt blocks made with 2 1/2" strips at the next General Meeting. Cindy Rimer has agreed to display her photo transfer materials at this meeting. We need a couple more affiliates to participate as well. Sue said 7 affiliates have shown interest in attending the meeting. Vendors will be around the outside of the room. Members will

provide a salad & dessert potluck.

Workshops - Louise Rupp advised we may have to cancel Joy-Lily's workshop if we don't have enough attendees for May 15th. On June 14 we will have a Guild sponsored block swap using red, white & blue colors plus demonstrations by Guild master quilters. July 12 workshop is Phyllis Binkley's "Painting with Fabrics".

The Guild gives a huge "Thank You" to our affiliates for their generosity during our show. Heidi asked the Board to encourage membership to patronize these affiliates.

Alice Smith announced the wrap-up meeting for the quilt show will be Tuesday, April 15th. She asked Board members to attend and present suggestions or share problems in order to make the 2009 show better. Members of the Board discussed the issue of refunds for vendors who were delayed in set-up due to the hotel space being unavailable until later. Vendors who did not show up are not entitled to a refund. This will be discussed further at the wrap-up meeting. Changes in contract procedures and Guild-authorized signatories will also be discussed further.

Membership - Frances Brannon discussed changing the membership form to include the newsletter choice (mail or website).

Equipment - Sharon Bishop reported the Guild needs new quilt stands to replace those damaged: of 12, 2 no longer hold height adjustments. She is collecting quotes and will present them at the next Board meeting.

Road Trip - Katsy Chappell is still collecting information for the bus trip to the Long Beach Quilt Festival on July 25th. It was suggested we use a Park & Ride location for pick-up and drop-off, as well as plan to leave by 8 a.m. for a full day at the show. Katsy will have quotes ready for the next Board Meeting.

Alice Smith has prepared a survey form for guild members, particularly Board & Show Committee. She also asked that a committee be organized to brain-storm ideas, review the surveys & make recommendations.

Upcoming Board Meetings at the Glendale Library are May 8th & June 5th. There will also be a Potluck hosted by the Outgoing Board at Susan Edward's home June 26th to celebrate Outgoing/Incoming Boards.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:55 pm.

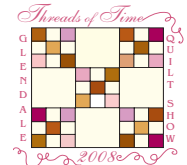
