Stories from the Road: A Quilt Teacher's Odyssey



This month the **Glendale Quilt Guild** is pleased to welcome **Sharon Pederson**, the internationally known Canadian quilt teacher, lecturer and author.

Sharon admits to have been sewing from a time when she "was so young that she could not reach the treadle of the sewing machine while seated. To sew she would stand on one leg and treadle with the other." Her passion for quilting began with the selection of a book on quilting offered by a book club as an inducement to join.

Her second quilt book purchase was about Double Irish Chains, so she made three and became the local expert. Thus began her quilt teaching career. She has been teaching and lecturing internationally for over fifteen years and has authored four books: **Color for the Terrified Quilter**, **Sensational Sashiko**, **Reversible Quilts** and **More Reversible Quilts**.

Sharon is a dynamic speaker. Join us as she shares her often humorous experiences on the road, including the first time she saw a reversible quilt. Her journey into the creative world of quilting from a career as a political organizer can inspire us all. Life is too short not to be doing what you really love.

Join us for Sharon's workshop on Saturday, October 11th, at the Glendale Public Library, where you will learn **Reversible Quilting**. "Do you hate to baste quilts? Have too little time to hand quilt and are to afraid to try machine quilting? Then this quilt method is for you. As you piece the blocks they are miraculously quilted at the same time. And, when you are finished, you have TWO quilts - a different one on each side. This class covers the construction of the basic block, how to join blocks together and reversible binding. In this hands-on class, you will get a good start and learn everything you need to know to finish your quilt."

Crystal's Choice: Smashing Sets by Margaret J. Miller

If you're stumped about how to set all those block of the month squares, this library book has some great ideas for setting a small number of blocks in unusual ways. Check this book out, you might just use up all those squares of different sizes and shapes.

Block of the Month

Galaxy of Stars ~ October 2008

Block will be 8 inches finished (8 ½ inches with seam allowances)

You will need:

1 square	9" X 9"	Dark Blue fabric	Background
1 square	6" X 6"	White fabric	Starburst
1 square	3" X 3"	Pale blue fabric	Star Center

Technique Used: ***Exposed Seams (Raw Edged Seams)***

1. Trace the dark line of the larger star shape onto a paper template or directly onto the white square of fabric. Cut out white star on the dark line. Place star on top of the 9 inch background square, right sides up. Baste in place with fabric basting spray or water soluble fabric glue if desired. Stitch, with a small stitch length, around the edge of the star, a scant ¼ inch inside the cut edge.
2. Repeat this process using the pale blue fabric for the smaller star which is sewn to the block on top of the white star.
3. Square up the block to be 8 ½ inches square.



You are encouraged to enter up to 5 blocks in the guild drawing.

Make sure you keep one for yourself. By the end of the year you will have a wallbanging of stars!

MEETING REPORTS

**Glendale Quilt Guild
Executive Board Meeting
Location: Glendale Central Library
Date: September 4, 2008**

Attendees: Heidi St. Royal, Sharon Bishop, Paula Thomas, Frances Brannon, Mary Ann Kroening, Alice Turner, Susan Edwards

With a warm welcome, Heidi opened the meeting at 7pm. Heidi requests that if board members are unable to attend these meeting to please call her.

The August minutes were reviewed and approved with the correction that the funds from the Long Beach bus trip were included in last year's income and expenses.

Corresponding secretary, Mia, will be notified that thank you notes need to be sent to New Moon Textiles for paying for the printing of the opportunity tickets and to the recently disbanded Designing Ladies for their donation to the guild. Thank you ladies! The guild really appreciates all of you.

Treasurer, Paula Thomas presented the August income and expenses. There was a discussion regarding the expenses of the merchant card which is needed so that people can pay for merchandise and classes using their credit cards. The guild uses this method of payment a few months before and at the quilt show for class registration and for purchases at the country store. The cost of providing this service is a lot more money that we can ever hope to recoup. The cost is \$220 a year, plus minimum \$240 and \$100 for Costco Card plus 2% and 27 cents per transaction. And we have 2 credit card accounts. It was agreed to close the 058 credit card account.

The final report from the quilt show is finished and will be discussed next meeting when Nancy Mraz is available.

Sharon Bishop announced that our guild and show information have been updated on the SCCQG web site.

Our new affiliate, Thrift Alley, will be added to the Newsletter.

Programs: The cost of hiring speakers who fly here (\$500 to \$900 depending on location), need lodging for 4 days (\$550), lecture fee (\$300+), workshop fee (\$600+), and meals for 4 days (\$140) can easily total \$2500. Paula expressed her concern about our budget supporting speakers. Barbara Gibson presented a mock-up of additions to speaker contracts so that board members

could comment. A speaker for August 2009 was proposed, Flavin Glover. Several board members are familiar with her work and suggest that Flavin would please all levels of quilters and traditional as well as innovative quilters. Since she is from Alabama, sharing costs of airfare with another guild and having a workshop on Thursday instead of Saturday will be considered.

Workshops: Ann Craig Calloway and Donna Hovartos have resigned their position. A motion was carried to install Mary Ann Kroening and Alice Turner as workshop co-chairs for this position. September's workshop on hand quilting with Andi Perejda is all set for the Thursday after the meeting at New Moon Textiles. Pat Rollie would like to do a workshop for the guild. Patricia Bemmer is scheduled to teach a delightful workshop on November 15th, 2008 involving crayons, paper dolls, and machine appliqué. Possible locations to hold workshops were discussed in terms of cost, accessibility to elevators, parking, lunch, and a large enough space for 20+ people.

Membership chair, Frances Brannon reported that renewal notices were mailed out and that 75 people have not yet renewed their membership. Also that 12 of the 19 affiliates have not yet renewed.

Fat quarter exchange for October could be Halloween and /or fall themed fabrics. We will probably just have fat quarter exchanges at holidays.

Everyone commented on the nice job Carol Jacobson is doing on block-of -the-month and the layout design for all 12 blocks.

Suggestions for meeting places for the Board meetings included rotating to homes of Board members, and other rental spaces. No solution was found so Heidi offered to have the next board meeting at her house.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30pm.

MEETING REPORTS CONT'D.

Glendale Quilt Guild General Meeting Glendale Central Library September 10, 2008

President, Heidi St. Royal called the meeting to order at 7 pm with a warm welcome to our guest speaker, Andrea Perejda.

The August, 2008 minutes were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

Corresponding Secretary sent thank you notes to New Moon Textiles for their large donation of paying for the printing of the opportunity quilt tickets and to Designing Ladies for their donation upon disbanding.

The treasurer's report was sent to audit.

Barbara Gibson, program chair, asked for a show of hands for those interested in hand vs. machine appliqué. There were a surprising number of members who would like a class in hand appliqué. Also surprising was the fact that the membership was almost equally divided between preference for hand and machine appliqué. Barbara then announced the programs for this October and November.

For the 2009 show, Nan Maples announced that there are new definitions and new quilt categories for judging. Please read the entry form carefully, because there are major revisions. "Take back your show" is our goal. In the recent past, 60% of the quilts shown were non-members! Susan Edwards asked members to pick up their opportunity tickets starting this month. The show committee is asking each member to sell 3 books this year. And there are prizes for selling books this year. If you sell 3 books, you will receive a show pin. Look for the prize list. There are many prizes not just one.

2010 Show chair, Caren Ryan send out 120 letters to possible vendors. Sandy White is no longer doing shows. If you know of a vendor who you would like to have, contact Caren. Secondly, ideas for show theme are being considered. And please submit plans for the opportunity quilt. One idea is 2010 is the Year of the Dragon with Asian fabric.

Frances Brannon, membership chair, announced that there are 86 members and 1 guest present tonight. This is the last day to renew membership and still have your name in the roster.

Block-of-the-month organizer, Carol Jacobson, received 35 blocks tonight and the winner of the drawing is Gloria Flores.

Next month the technique is raw edge or exposed seams. There are copies of the directions for all the blocks so far in the back of the room, or they are in the past Newsletters.

Pat Grim of Loving Hands announced resumption of the monthly Friday meetings start this coming Friday at the usual place and time. Packets to sew blocks together are available to take home tonight.

Door prizes were provided by Thrift Alley, our new affiliate, Pat Rollie, the country store, a free class to Sharon Pederson's workshop in October. The booby prize was won by Crystal Dudley.

After the break, Barbara Gibson introduced our speaker, Andrea Perejda. Andi's lecture was titled "Quilt Judging Mysteries Revealed" She answered questions and showed some of her award winning quilts featuring exquisite hand quilting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.

Supply List

- **Sewing machine** with a walking foot (essential!)
- **Option 1:** One square (9 3/8" x 9 3/8") non-directional fabric for each side of block & 5 strips of varying widths from 1 1/4" to 2 1/2" & varying lengths from 14" to 3". They should look random.
- **Option 2:** 1 FQ of a pretty fabric & 5 coordinating scraps at least 2 1/2" x 14". 1 FQ & scraps for side B.
- **Two 9" x 9"** squares cotton/poly batting (Hobbs Heirloom Cotton or Warn & Natural).
- **Cotton thread** 50/3 in neutral color (medium gray)
- **BSS**, DW & BCT with a large 12 1/2" square ruler.

Books Reversible Quilts – Two at a Time & More Reversible Quilts will be available for purchase in class.
