Making charity quilts is a great way for the beginning quilter to gain skill and confidence. At this month's meeting, a demonstration will be given for beginners on how to finish one of the kits. Let's all double our efforts and help "Helping Hands" meet their Christmas quilt goal.

With the changes in our economy, our local shelters are going to need our help more than ever. Bring bars of soap, shampoos, lotions, combs, toothpaste and brushes. ## 2010 Instructor Update



### HARRIET HARGRAVE-MOTHER OF MACHINE QUILTING

Harriet comes from a family of quilters. Her mother tried to teach her to hand quilt in the early '70s, but to no avail. Harriet mastered machine embroidery in the mid-1970s, and adapted machine quilting from there. She was machine quilting when the local quilt guilds thought machine piecing was not kosher, let alone machine quilting! In 1983, Harriet's antique reproduction pieces were recognized for how hand quilted they appeared. By 1984, she was demonstrating at Houston Quilt Market and teaching at Mary Ellen Hopkins' seminars. Harriet was asked to write a book - Heirloom Machine Quilting is now in its 5<sup>th</sup> edition. She has also written Mastering machine Appliqué, From Fiber to Fabric and The Art of Classic Quilt Making. She is currently working on a series of books for beginning quilters, which are due out in September 2009. In 1994 a panel of her peers chose Harriet as one of the 88 Leaders of the Quilt World and in 2006 was nominated for Professional Quilter's Teacher of the Year.

Harriet has a 2-day workshop, Precision Piecing that is designed to help all of us that are challenged with achieving precise points, square squares and flat quilt tops. As a previous student of Harriet Hargrave, I will be one of the first in line to sign up for her classes. She challenged me and showed me how to take my quilting to a new level. I look forward to being in her classroom again. Hope you will join me!

# Block of the Month

## “Gone Batty”

Finished block 8 inches

Call Pat Rollie at 323-224-8207 if any questions

**Notes:** ¼ inch seam allowance- use any black and any background

To create triangle pieces sew indicated squares on pattern right sides together and sew diagonal seam in direction needed to create pattern and then trim off excess leaving ¼ seam allowance.

For eyes: use button, embroidery, ribbon, whatever you'd like

### Cutting Instructions:


<b>Black:</b>	A & H	cut	2	2-1/2 X 2-1/2
	B & C	cut	5	1-1/2 x 1-1/2
	D	cut	2	1-1/2 x 2-1/2
	E	cut	2	2-1/2 x 4-1/2
	F	cut	2	1-1/2 x 4-1/4

<b>Background:</b>	A & H	cut	2	2-1/2 x 2-1/2
	B & C	cut	4	1-1/2 x 1-1/2
	D & F	cut	4	1-1/2 x 2-1/2
	E	cut	1	2-1/2 x 4-1/2

**Sewing Instructions:** Break this pattern into four quarter sections:

#1- top left head section # 2 right top wing #3 lower left wing # 4 lower right tail.

After each section is complete sew 1 to 2; 3 to 4, then sew two sections together.

# MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild  
Executive Board Meeting  
Judy Seller's Residence  
September 8, 2009

Members present: Heidi St. Royal, Margie Emmons, Mary Ann Kroening, Alice Turner, Barbara Gibson, Caren Ryan, Brandi Nalley, Frances Brannon, Nan Maples, Corinne Gurney, Ester Norbut, Pat Rollie, Harriet Sartinsky, Judy Sellers, Susan Edwards

The meeting was called to order by Heidi at 6:32 pm. Then, the minutes were approved as written.

Margie passed out the treasurer's report which included August's income from membership dues and the workshop. There were many comments about the great format which was clear and comprehensive, showing the yearly budget, expenses so far and balance. And the second handout itemized the August budget. The report was reviewed, discussed and approved.

Barbara distributed a program and workshop list for 2010 in a format that can be used to print bookmarks to hand out. The only change would be November (TBA to Shelly Swanland – Cathedral Windows). After a discussion, it was agreed that the bookmarks will be 8 inches long, double sided, easily readable, and contain information about our Guild. Nan volunteered to finalize the typing.

The response to Flavin Glover's program and workshop was critiqued. Her lecture went by fast, but her workshop was extremely well received, attended by 22 people, very professional, and a great success. For the October meeting, the garage sale for quilt related items, only 6 members have signed up so far. And for the November workshop on jackets, there are no sign-ups.

Frances reported that currently we have 198 members. She contacted the people that declined to renew and many stated that they could not come to the meetings or they had no time. It was suggested that some sort of symbol such as a bar be added to the name badge to indicate current membership so that past members could not come to the show wearing our name tag and getting in free. Everyone liked this idea.

Nan reported that we saved a lot of money printing the custom cut, hole-punched, large print rosters this year. The Newsletter printing will be transferred to Nestlé's soon. There should be a campaign to encourage members to sign up to read the Newsletter in color via the web site which could potentially save the Guild hundreds of dollars every month in postage and printing costs.

Regarding the opportunity quilt (OQ) tickets, Nan Maples, our "Printer Liaison", described the new ticket format and method of turning in tickets and payment. It was decided to distribute them in the October Newsletter.

Caren announced that the next quilt show meeting will be Tuesday, 9/29, 6:30 pm at Quilt N' Things. The almost completed O.Q.s were unveiled to the group. Wow.

Brandi suggested that to increase publicity we could establish Facebook and it is free. Everyone liked the idea. Brandi agreed to do it and to educate us about Facebook.

Pat discussed the goals of block-of the month: fun and many winners. She would like to institute a policy that all the

winners be different people, for example, if a person's name is drawn twice, the second draw will be invalid so another person has an opportunity to win. Everyone agreed that this policy is fine.

Flavin Glover donated her book to the Library.

Compliments were given to Doralee for inviting Young Piecemakers to the last meeting. Everyone enjoyed seeing them and viewing our philanthropy work. Thanks to Harriet for all the pictures in last month's Newsletter.

Nan moved that a Bylaws Review Committee be formed to update, re-organize, add an index and table of contacts, and change some by-laws to standing rules. The motion was seconded and carried. Committee members will be Nancy Mraz, parliamentarian, Nan Maples, chair, Brandi Nalley, Lettie Williams, Margie Emmons and Sharon Bishop.

Next, Heidi reported on the negotiations with the Marriot. If we sign for 2011, they will give us a reduced room rate and a free morning to move in. Food purchase amount still needs to be negotiated. The other choices are the Pasadena Convention Center (which has all kinds of high ticket items because of the union) or the Glendale Civic which is much smaller and no room for classes. Corinne moved that (1) Heidi be authorized to continue negotiations with the Marriott to reduced food expenditure, (2) pending the outcome of these negotiations for 2010, Heidi be authorized to sign a contract for 2011, and (3) if even better terms are negotiated, a contract for 2012 is authorized. The motion was seconded and carried.

Tomorrow's meeting agenda reviewed: members will be given numbers as they enter for the quilt appraisal by Anne Copeland; the fat quarter draw was supposed to be animals instead of fall fabrics to as printed in the Newsletter. The next board meeting will be at Mary Ann Kroening's house on October 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. The meeting adjourned at 9 pm.

Margie Emmons read the treasurers report. It was approved as read.

Barbara Gibson asked members to talk up the October meeting, the garage sale and giving back. For the November meeting, the speaker has requested volunteers to model her jackets. Volunteers must be at least 5'3", size 10 to 14 and one model size 6 to 8. The speaker has 78 jackets and will whittle it down to 50. For the jacket workshop in November, if you have a jacket pattern that fits you, it may be made in the class or you can use her patterns.

Pat Grim announced that there are lots of tops to quilt which are needed by Christmas for Loving Hands donations. Pat also asked members to sign a block for Alice Smith's president's quilt.

Sandy Bradfield asked members to send digital pictures for the Newsletter because she does not have a scanner. Heidi announced that if you sign up to receive an email notification that the Newsletter is ready for viewing via the internet, you will be first in line for the break goodies.

Caren Ryan asked people to sign up for white gloving and selling opportunity tickets at Road to California. Our day to sell tickets is Friday, but white gloving can be done any day during the show. You will receive free admission the day that you volunteer. The next show meeting is 9/29, 6:30 pm at Quilt N' Things in Montrose. Caren announced the new events for the 2010 show, including kid's classes and a box lunch awards auction. There are still positions available for the 2010 show committee. If anyone is attending a quilt show, please take book marks to distribute. The 2 opportunity quilts were shown and described. Judy Sellers announced that Harriet Hargrove will be teaching two 2-day workshops at the show. And, everyone is encouraged to take at least one class.

There are 95 members signed in tonight and 2 guests whom Frances introduced. Door prizes were

provided by Patchwork Penguin and our guild.

Pat Rollie explained the new policy of no double winners of the block-of-the-month drawing to meet the drawing's goals of fun and lots of winners. Tonight there are 45 blocks, so 3 winners will get 15 blocks each. Pat Rollie, Beverly Underwood and Margaret McNeal were the 3 winners. Next month's theme will be Halloween, a bat, a pumpkin or a witch.

Brandi Nalley announced that GQG will begin using Facebook.

Ann Wolfe won the fat quarter draw.

After Show and Tell and the break, Barbara Gibson introduced Ann Copeland, who spoke about "**How Quilts are Appraised**". After a short talk, Ann commented on individual items brought by members. The highest valued quilt won a book and the lowest value received a fat quarter.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50pm.
