This month the Glendale Quilt Guild is pleased to welcome Ann Copeland certified quilt appraiser. Ann has been appraising quilts and textiles for many years. She was gracious enough to appraise our opportunity quilt last year!

Ann is a wealth of knowledge. Did you know that if you do not have your precious quilts appraised and disaster strikes they are considered ONLY BLANKETS when you itemize your losses. How sad to have quilts you have spent numerous hours creating, not to mention a considerable sum of money in the cost of materials, itemized as “just blankets.”

Ann is certified to appraise; quilts, textiles, wearables and dolls. At this month’s meeting Ann has invited our membership to bring ONE item per member for an informal appraisal. You may also bring damaged items. Ann will offer an opinion on whether or not the item is worth restoration. She will also offer appropriate restoration methods. If you have inherited quilt squares or an unfinished quilt she can give you some idea of their value.

Ann will give us recommendations for caring and storing our quilts. She has also promised to share her “secret method” for cleaning quilts.

Think of this evening as our own version of the “Antique Road Show.” Ann will appraise as many items as time allows. It is going to be a fun and informative evening not to mention a great opportunity to see quilts old and new. Be sure to bring only ONE item. Prizes will be awarded to the Guild members with the evening’s most valuable item and the least valuable item appraised. Mark your calendar and be sure to come and join the fun. This is your opportunity to find out if your Great Aunt Fannie’s quilt is worth a small fortune...or not.



MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Esther Norbut's Residence August 6, 2009

Members present: Corinne Gurney, Barbara Gibson, Judy Sellers, Caren Cooke Ryan, Nan Maples, Esther Norbut, Brandi Nalley, Heidi St. Royal, Margie Emmons, Mary Ann Kroening, Harriet Sartinsky and Frances Brannon

Heidi called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm thanking Esther for hosting the meeting.

The minutes were approved with corrections of "kimono" instead of "Pomono", "Esther" instead of "Ester" and the addition of "Heidi announced at the general meeting that we made \$13,000 at the last quilt show". Congratulations to the editor for a good August Newsletter. Door prizes for this month have been donated by the Quilt Emporium.

Margie Emmons gave the treasurers report and passed out copies of the budget for 2009-2010. The country store sales tax from the March show was paid in July because it took time to apply on line to pay the tax. This fiscal year's budget was a little late due to the process of finalizing last year's budget. Then, a discussion was held about the need for the general membership to vote to approve the annual budget. The by-laws are unclear and interpreted differently. Although Heidi announced that copies of the budget were available for any member to read and review and only 3 members stepped forward, it was agreed that at the next meeting copies would be placed at the membership table for members to pick up. Members are cautioned not to leave copies of the budget lying around the room after the meeting. Also discussed was the cost of renting a bus for a trip to Temecula in October for the outdoor fair and quilt show.

Barbara Gibson reported on the Meet the Teachers program at the SCCQG meeting. It is hard to keep in budget when local speakers are charging \$475 or more plus expenses for an hour lecture or while a well known name speaker with a workshop can be over \$2000. This coming year we will have one well known speaker, possibly Sylvia Pippen. This would be after June 2010. For September's meeting, we could have Sylvia Davis speaking on ethnic fabric quandary, or possibly a talk by quilt appraiser, Anne Copeland. The insurance value of a quilt today is only about \$100. The October meeting will be a garage sale where members can buy a table for \$15 and/or donation of part of proceeds to the guild. We could also have a 'give back' table on the stage and make this garage/craft sale a yearly event. There will be no library this month.

The big name speaker for this year is for August meeting - Flavin Glover. Mary Ann Kroening announced that 19 people have signed up for her workshop on Saturday. There is room for 1 more and expenses will have been met.

Frances Brannon is still reviewing the comments and suggestions on the membership renewal forms. One suggestion was "spare change" exchange. Frances would also like something to hand new members when they come such as a bookmark. She would also like to have a Welcoming Committee for new members and guests. An announcement in the Newsletter will ask members to be hostesses. The perk would be first in line for treats.

The bus trip to Long Beach was a great success with numerous comments from other attendees about all of our kimonos and hand outs for our 2010 Show.

With all the blocks that Caren Ryan has received, there are actually 3 quilts this year. One will be auctioned and the other 2 will be for selling opportunity tickets. They are titled "Imperial Fan" and "Flight of the Butterfly". "Imperial Fan" is the appliqué quilt and should be ready for Road to California. Pros and cons of selling tickets for 2 quilts were discussed. It was moved and seconded that each quilt will have tickets distinguished by color and title. People will pick which tickets they wish to purchase.

Corinne Gurney announced that she sent 2 cards in July. No one knew of anyone who needed a card.

Nan Maples presented a comparison spreadsheet of costs for various sizes and types of printing from Nestle, Kinkos, Office Max and Staples. Folding and stapling is extra but very reasonable. And items should be camera ready. Not only is Nestle cheaper, but they are fast and amenable. For example, our roster is an odd size with unusual holes. It has cost us \$200; Nestle's bid is \$90. The Newsletter at PIP printing (with stamps) costs us \$400 a month. Nestle's bid is \$135 plus the cost of stamps. Quality and size of the bookmarks advertising the 2010 Show are great. Nan is willing to do this for the guild. Thank you, Nan, for saving us money.

Thank you to Frances for notifying those of us who signed up to read the Newsletter on line rather than the printed and stamped copy. It is convenient and saves the guild money.

The Young Piecemakers guild is coming to our August meeting to Show and Tell. They will be presented with our philanthropy gift of fabric which Doralee Dohnel organized.

Since there have been no takers on buying ad space for the roster, it was moved, seconded and approved that the cost of an ad be \$25 for a half page and \$50 for a full page. The deadline date for an ad will be August 16th, so that the roster will be ready for distribution at the September meeting.

Everyone on the board has a procedure manual except Harriet Sartinsky, historian, due to difficulty in contacting Carol Jacobson's family.

The fat quarter exchange for September will be animals and October will be sports.

Heidi has been negotiating with the Marriott about the room rate for 2010. She has them down to \$100, but they want us to sign contracts for 2011 and 2012. The other possible places for a show are Glendale civic and the Pasadena Convention Center. A field trip to see these spots will be planned.

The next board meeting, September 3rd will be at Judy Sellers home; October 8th - Mary Ann Kroening's home; November 5th - Susan Edwards home.

The meeting was adjourned at 9 pm.

August 12, 2009

At 6:30 pm, Heidi called the meeting to order and gave a big welcome to our speaker, Flavin Glover, who came all the way from Alabama. She also gave compliments to Las Pulgas for the gorgeous hospitality decorations, a summary of the great time had by all on the bus trip to Long Beach, and gave thanks that our 2 ill members are back and well.

Margie Emmons read the treasurer's report. Heidi announced, again, that this year's fiscal budget is available for all to review and that it was approved at the last meeting. Anyone with questions should contact a member of the board.

A condolence card will be sent to Penny Knapp for the passing of her husband.

Barbara Gibson announced the program for September will be Anne Copeland, quilt appraiser. Everyone is invited to bring one item only for an appraisal, or an older quilt to see if it worth restoring, or even old quilt blocks for evaluation. In October, we will have a garage sale and "give back". Members who want to sell their items or crafts may rent a table for \$15 or donate proceeds to the guild. See Mary Ann Kroening to sign up for a table.

The next meeting of the 2010 Show committee will be on August 25th, 6:30 pm at Alice Smith's house. Caren Ryan announced that if you rent a room at the hotel, you will receive one free lecture. The lectures are on Thursday and Friday evenings. There is no banquet this year. However, on Saturday evening there will be a "GQG College" which will be short demonstrations by teachers with the students traveling from one station to another. Students can learn a variety of techniques in one class.

Membership chair, Frances Brannon, introduced the guests and new members. Tonight, 120 members signed in. Frances asked for volunteers to assist Esther Norbut with welcoming guests and new members. Door prizes were donated by Pat Rollie, the Quilt Emporium, Thrift Alley, Patchwork Penguin, Mayhall's, and a member of our guild. Thank you, Sharon Bishop for gathering all the door prizes.

Brandi Nalley announced the new prices for roster ads. And Alice Smith asked members to sign the president's quilt for Heidi. Pat Grim announced that there is no Loving Hands meeting this Friday. The fat quarter (polka-dots) draw was won by Anne Wolfe.

For block-of-the-month, there were 3 winners of 9 blocks each. Alice Turner won twice, and Margaret McNeal was the third winner. Next month, the pattern will be one of Flavin Glover's blocks.

Doralee Dohnel introduced the leader of the Young Piecemakers Children's Quilt Guild, Renee Nolan and presented our donation of bolts of fabric for their use. Renee gave a brief history of their group, thanked our guild, and presented Heidi with the quilt she won by guessing the correct number of empty thread spools in a large jar at the Long Beach Show. The kids showed some of the charity quilts they have made. The Young Piecemakers donate all their quilts to the UCLA Hospital for children with HIV.

Show and Tell was ended by Heidi showing her cherry jubilee quilt and apron while imitating Julia Childs. There was lots of laughter during Heidi's performance.

After the break and before the speaker was introduced, Heidi called for a vote for the annual budget. A motion was made to approve the 2009-2010 budget, which was seconded and approved by the membership.

Flavin Glover was introduced by Barbara Gibson and presented with our guild pin. Flavin talked about her quilt designs using various log cabin blocks. She sews the block using strips usually 1 and ¼ inches wide and hand quilts everything. After the slide presentation entitled "A New Look at Log Cabin Quilts", she shared many of her quilts with us.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.


