Originally developed to meet the rugged demands of hard working men, this versatile fabric has evolved into a staple textile used for virtually everything. Just a bit of history: "Denim has been in American usage since the late eighteenth century. The word comes from the name of a sturdy fabric called serge, originally made in Nimes, France, by the Andre family. Serge de Nimes, as it was originally called, was later shortened to denim." It was first used in men's trousers...no surprise there.

This month's program will start with an extended *"Show and Tell"*. We are anxious to see what our Guild members have done using denim. Just walking around my home I spied children's clothes, a dog coat, jeans, dresses, shirts, vests, and totes. Have you made something fabulous from old jeans? Do you still have a pair of embroidered or appliqué decorated jeans from the 60's? Now is the time to share these treasures with the Guild. Help us get inspired as we begin to think about projects for next year's western theme quilt show.



In 2002 she received the Appliqué Society of America's Merit Appliqué Master. Mary Ann has exhibited at the Houston International Quilt Festival, the AQS Paducah show, Road to California and National Quilting Association. She won Best Hand Workmanship at Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara, CA in 2006. Mary Ann's quilt "Currants and Currants and Currants and Cockscombs" was the cover quilt on the December 2004 issue of Quilter's Newsletter Magazine.

Rasa Read has been sewing since she was a young girl. First came dolls, then people's clothing, and then quilting was discovered (Joy! No fitting!) She loves to apply garment sewing techniques in her quilt making. Now mathematician by day, quilter by night, she obsesses about flat seams, sharp corners, smooth curves and perfect miters. Block of the Month

“Denim Delight”

Finished block ~ 8” x 8”

Cut piece **A** 2-1/2 by 2-1/2” cut eight *(must be denim)*

Cut piece **B** 2-1/2 by 4-1/2” cut 4 *(can be any matching cotton fabric)*

1. Sew four center squares together alternating dark and light (right and wrong side of denim).
2. Sew piece B on opposite ends of completed square
3. Sew piece A on each end of piece B-alternating color- getting two strips; then sew these strips to your first piece

NOTES: look for denim where wrong side is a strong contrast to right side of fabric.

MEETING REPORTS

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Heidi St. Royal's Residence January 7, 2010

Attendance: Heidi St. Royal, Sharon Bishop, Barbara Gibson, Margie Emmons, Mary Ann Kroening, Caren Ryan, Corrine Gurney, Judy Sellers, Harriet Sartinsky, Brandi Nalley, Susan Edwards

Heidi opened the meeting at 6:30 pm reporting that the December gift exchange was a great success, that Esther Norbut was hospitalized over Christmas with pneumonia but is better now, and that Sandy Bradfield is out of town for the birth of another grandchild.

December's board minutes were approved as written. Nan Maples obtained the Articles of Incorporation from the state which should be kept in the official corporate minute's book. The recording secretary should be responsible for this. Susan Edwards agreed to create an official corporate minute's book with the required separate sections.

Margie Emmons gave the treasurer's report which was reviewed and discussed.

Sharon Bishop reported that door prizes are starting to come in. Also, the SCCQG meeting is in Placentia this coming Saturday and the program was recently changed from "Philanthropy" to "Interfacing with Quilt Shops". A discussion was held about taking the opportunity quilts to SCCQG. Caren Ryan volunteered that she may be able to take them since it is not too far from her house.

The layout and all the pictures in the Newsletter are much appreciated by everyone.

The December program comments included the phrase "out of this world" and "super". An option for next year is to have the Nestle choir. In February, Carol Lung and 6 to 8 of her merchandizing students from Cal State LA will present a fashion show of denim clothes that they designed. Barbara Gibson proposed that we present each of them with gift certificates from Jo Ann's and a ticket to our quilt show in March. Everyone agreed.

Future workshops could be to make quilts for fallen soldiers. July would be a good month. They like reproduction Civil War and plaid fabrics rather than bright colors. Since not enough members come to Thursday workshops, Saturday will be the workshop day. Next, a location for the Pippen workshop on April 15th was discussed. Since the library is a large space, we will try to book it for this and other workshops. Lastly, the cost of Nan's large bag class was discussed. Because Nan is donating her time, the cost of the dowel handles, insert and pattern is \$20, and the room rent is \$85, it was agreed that the charge will be \$30 for members and \$40 for non-member.

Caren Ryan reported on items concerning the 2010 quilt show including the cost of various security agencies, the contract for the DVD's, more pictures of the opportunity quilts when they are finished, and the web site credit card problems. It was moved, seconded and passed to eliminate all credit card transactions effective immediately. Caren will call Robin to change the web site immediately. Others involved will continue to try to correct the problems. The next show meeting is at Quilt N' Things in Montrose in January 26th at 6:30 pm.

Suggestions for publicity were accepted by Brandi Nalley included

contacting Time Warner weekly cable and posting quilt show flyers in Monterey Park. Linda Friedman has been asked to distribute flyers and pamphlets in the San Diego area.

Shirley Bertolino, a judge at our show and a friend of our guild is having back surgery. Corrine will send her a card.

The hospitality, block-of-the month, loving hands, publicity, library, philanthropy, telephone tree, and trip committees were acknowledged and have no new reports this month. The library fire sale is being organized. A list of GQG members who made quilts for Loving Hands is needed for our files, including the number they made. Also a list of the number of quilts distributed and where they were donated. The board would like to recognize the efforts of GQG members and keep a record for philanthropy.

Fat quarter draw for February is valentine and for March is green fabric.

Nan distributed the third section of proposed by-law revisions for review. Then, it was moved that the second section of the proposed by-laws be posted on the web site for membership review. It was seconded and approved.

Future board meetings sites will be: February 4th – Esther Norbut's house; March 4th Mary Ann Kroening's house; April 8th – Susan Edwards's house; May 13th – Judy Sellers house; and June 3rd – Heidi St. Royal's house. The new member's Tea will held in May. Susan Edwards will contact Frances Brannon about the details. The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm.

Margie Emmons gave the Treasurer's report. There are problems with using credit cards, so from now on it will be cash/check and carry only. Please give Honorary Life Membership ballots to Nancy Mraz, parliamentarian.

Nan Maples announced that proposed by-law changes are posted on the web site. There will be only 10 written copies available for review. Heidi thanked everyone on the by-law committee for their hard work.

Barbara Gibson reviewed up-coming meeting programs. February, we have "Salute to Denim". March, Terry Walden, a retired art teacher, will lecture on "Patchwork to Art". In June, do not forget the big bag class by Nan Maples. And by request, in July, Ann Copeland will return to appraise your quilts. Also, July 17th we will make quilts for the Fallen Heroes. Sylvia Pippen will teach a workshop on Thursday in April.

Tonight there are 132 members, 3 new members, and 4 guests present tonight per Frances Brannon. There are also 2 new members not present tonight. Door prizes are provided by Old Country Store, Pat Rollie, Ricky Tims, Anne Copeland, Quilt Emporium, and Quilt N'Things.

Brandi Nalley asked that members take flyers to quilt shops.

Pat Rollie showed the denim block for next month's block-of-the-month, which fits nicely with the denim fashion show. Cut up old jeans, use the right and wrong side for contrast and a coordinating light fabric.

Heidi has received over 200 brand new shirts that have a large hole where an embroidered design once was. Once repaired, we will send them to Haiti to contribute to the earthquake relief effort. Please return them in a month.

After Show and Tell, Sylvia Davis presented an inspiring lecture showing 3 suitcases full of quilts with several types of ethnic fabric as the focus or just the flavor of the quilt. At the end of the presentation, more than one member asked that she teach at our show next year.

The meeting was adjourned
at 8:30 pm.


