### The Dragonlady Comes To Glendale-- Sharon Wilhite

Please join us this month for Sharon Wilhite from Dragonlady Quilts. Sharon began quilting in 1988. Her big break in designing quilts was when she designed an (at the time) unusual quilt using the Florentine collection from Robert Kaufman Fabrics. Her first design was published in 2005 as a pattern sheet for the Florentine collection which was available to quilt shops ordering the collection as well as a download from the Robert Kaufman website.

Soon after, Sharon began teaching at various quilt shops in San Diego County where she quickly became known for her distinctive patterns, innovative techniques, timesaving methods, and love of technology in quilting. She specializes in designing quilts which look complex but in fact are very easy to make. All of her patterns are geared toward the confident beginner but are enjoyed by more advanced quilters as well. Sharon currently has more than 24 published patterns of which the most distinctive is her Reflection pattern, an easy strip cutting and piecing technique that produces a very exquisite look.

Sharon continues to design new patterns for fabric manufacturers' new fabrics before they are available in quilt stores. She still designs for fabrics from Robert Kaufman as well as Hoffman Fabrics, Exclusively Quilters, Elizabeth's Studio, and Timeless Treasures. One of her most recent patterns, Chained Stars, designed for the Imperial Collection 6 from Robert Kaufman, was kitted by the manufacturer for Hancock's of Paducah. The quilt can be seen on the cover of the 2010 mail order catalog, No. 52, as well as in the Imperial Collection section of the catalog and on the Hancock's of Paducah website.

Sharon has just published her first book, *Bending the Rules*, an easy an innovative technique for adding new life and movement to traditional quilt patterns. Not only does the book contain 8 fabulous quilts to make, it also teaches quilters how to go beyond the quilts in the book and learn how to Bend the Rules for themselves.


Civilized life as we know it had just come to an end! I won't say I'm microwave dependent but I have been known to re-



## Notes from the Judging Room

by Nan Maples

Hand Quilting "Hand quilting techniques need improvement."

Evenness and consistency of stitch is more important than size of stitch. Size will count, all other things being equal. Stitches should be the same size of on the back as the front. If that cannot be achieved, at least make your stitches even on the front and even on the back. There should be no skipped stitches on the back. All marking lines MUST be removed. Greater density of quilting is viewed favorably (i.e. "Quilt would have benefited from more quilting."). Strive to quilt all areas of the quilt with equal density. (It will lie more flat.)

### Organizations need many contributions from everyone to thrive. What works for you?

1. Graciousness Be quiet when people are speaking from the podium
2. Graciousness Make sure visitors and new members are first in line at the hospitality table.
3. Participation Attend at least half of the Guild meetings.
4. Participation Share something at Show and Tell.
5. Contribution Contribute door prizes (clean out hour stash - good stuff).
6. Contribution Help set up and take down anything that needs setting up or taking down.
7. Contribution Make suggestions to the Philanthropy chair for donations.
8. Contribution Eschew whining
9. Money Hold a yard sale, stash sale, whatever sale, and donate some portion or all of the proceeds to the Guild.
10. Money Support Affiliate Members by buying from them.



# Block of the Month

August 2010

## Summer Sailing


### Cutting Instructions

**Piece A-** cut 2-3/4" square  
(then cut in half as needed or follow easy directions for piecing and sewing before cutting)\*\*

**Piece B-** cut 2 at 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" (sky)

**Piece C-** cut 1 at 8-1/2 " x 2-1/2" (boat)

**Piece D-** cut 1 at 8-1/2 x 2-1/2" (water)




**Sewing Instructions:** Make AA units (sail pieces). Cut sq. in half and sew together. Sew B to AA unit. Sew half triangles to corner of C strip. Cut off underlying piece of C (see picture) Sew AC unit to D piece then join to top half.

Cut off after sewing on triangle to make boat



Place two squares right side facing (one sq. sky material and the other sail material)  
Draw a light pencil line diagonally across square  
Sew 1/4 inch seam on each side of drawn line  
Cut along pencil line

# MEETING REPORTS

## Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Susan Edwards' Residence August 5, 2010

Present: Barbara Gibson, Mary Ann Kroening, Frances Brannon, Sharon Bishop, Margie Emmons, Nan Maples, Barbara Stuart, Karen Waller, Corrine Gurney, Esther Norbut, and Susan Edwards.

Barbara Gibson opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m., thanking Susan for hosting our meeting once again. The minutes of the last board meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

Margie Emmons handed out copies of the July treasurer's report and reviewed it with the Board. \$3,379 was added to checking account from outstanding checks going way back. She will keep the list, just in case. Of this amount, there were 2 \$500 checks not cashed from 2006 – not valid any more. When the question was raised regarding whether or not the workshops pay for themselves, Sharon Bishop reminded us that while not all workshops are viable, part of our mission is education. IRS returns have been filed for the corporation. Paperwork is in motion for the permit for the Casino Night at the Quilt Show. It was moved and seconded that we get the corporate accountants handle the paperwork. VP & Treasurer working on this. Motion made and seconded to pay the \$800 for this filing to IRS. This was passed unanimously.

The question of charge accounts in the name of the Guild, which had been opened in the past. Motion made and seconded no charge accounts can be opened in the name of the Guild without prior approval of the membership. Nan Maples advised it is possible to add this kind of information to the By-Laws before the final copy is presented to the membership. A guild procedure manual was suggested in possession of the Executive Board. It was discussed that this should not be in By-Laws and the subject set aside for further investigation.

The question was raised regarding exceeding the amount budgeted for any line items. It was agreed that if there is a possibility of exceeding a line item by \$100, it must be pre-approved by the Executive Board. Motion made & seconded that the approval must be made for this by the Executive Board prior to the expense made. This too passed unanimously.

Barbara Gibson thanked Margie for the report and said she was happy to see we are starting out the year with enough money to hold us.

Two corrections in the minutes of the last executive board meeting were pointed out – the word “next” should be “last” and the date at the bottom corrected. Frances thanked everyone for their input in helping get out her first effort as Secretary.

Karen Waller announced that there will be 2 months with a shorter time to get the information to her so she can get the newsletter to Nan Maples for printing. August is one, with the deadline to get everything to Nan the 20<sup>th</sup>, and for Nan to get it printed by the 25<sup>th</sup>. October will be the next month. She announced that volunteers were needed to help with the folding of the newsletters. Barbara Stuart said she had complete list of those members who indicated interest in assisting with mailing and she would get the list to Nan and Karen immediately. For the month of August Barbara Gibson volunteered to fold and seal.

Membership Chair Barbara Stuart said not

everyone has paid for their membership renewal, and they have till 8/15 to pay to remain a member. She will announce this from podium.

Margie Emmons proposed that we have a notebook, kept in storage, not assigned to anyone's possession, containing all the legal papers for the Guild. In the following discussion, it was proposed to have 2 notebooks, one with the originals and one of copies in the possession of the Parliamentarian. Suggested items to put in the notebook were presented. This will be discussed further at the next meeting, along with a list of the possible contents.

Oct. – Annual Strip Poker Party.

Dec. Christmas party – Chanteurs

Sharon Bishop announced that the Quilt Show T-shirts and denim shirts will be for sale at the next general meeting and the Totes at the September meeting.

Barbara Gibson congratulated Alice Turner on the meal and décor at the last general meeting and said the aprons were a great hit.

Barbara reported that the bus trip to Long Beach was a great success, and Judy should try to make sure we have the bus next year.

Fat quarter draw for August is Western patterns and September is Plaids patterns.

Nan Maples gave out copies of the current edition of the By-Laws, which are to be read and suggestions, corrections brought to the next Executive Board Meeting so that a final submission can be presented to the membership.

Esther Norbut's e-mails were great. She announced there are 20 more DVD's left from the quilt show. They will be on the table next to the membership table at the next meeting. It was agreed that we need to get more people on the list to e-mail notice of the newsletter being ready, as the cost of getting the newsletter mailed each month is still going up, due to increases in postage and membership.

Susan Edwards reported that the list of the library contents was almost completed, however, when categorizing the books, it was found that there are not enough of the subjects that are more popular now and thoughts were exchanged as to how to alleviate this problem. She will be pricing the smaller containers for the library books, as now that we have to keep the library off-premises, the old containers are just too big and heavy to cart back and forth. Nan Maples is working on getting the library list on the website, so members can decide what they want her to bring for them to check out at the next meeting.

The next board meeting will be September 2 at 6:30 p.m. at Mary Ann Kroening's house. October board meeting will be at Barbara Gibson's house.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Barbara announced that the Santa Monica Quilt Guild will have Melinda Bula, award winning quilter, who will teach a class on September 2 (class will cost \$45) and they have extended an invitation to our Guild members to attend.

She then called for approval of the minutes of the last meeting as reported in the newsletter, with two small corrections, the final approved by unanimous vote.

The treasurer's report was presented by Margie Emmons. Barbara thanked Margie for a great report and commented that the outlook this year is looking up.

Programs Chair Corinne Gurney announced upcoming programs scheduled: September, Sharon Wilhite of Dragon Lady Quilts; October, we will have our annual Strip Poker Party, November Shelley Swanland (Cathedral Windows) and December, our Christmas Party and the Chanteurs will be back to entertain us again.

"Deputy" Sharon Bishop advised that the t-shirts and denim shirts were available at this meeting for \$50 if you bought both at the same time. The totes are scheduled to be at the September meeting. The decorated hat contest will be at the September meeting. Also a roundup of ideas of the Quilt Show will be held at 5p.m. September 8<sup>th</sup>, at the library. Come and share your ideas for the 2011 Show. Letters have gone out to the vendors.

Barbara Stuart, Membership Chair, announced the new affiliates: Cotton and Chocolate, Monica's Quilts and Beads, Quilter's Studio and Pollards have re-joined both stores. Our guests for the evening were welcomed and door prize tickets were drawn – among those contributing prizes were New Moon, Quilts and Things, Quilt Studio, Kelly Misere, Pat Grim, and Nan Maples.

Pat Grim of Loving Hands presented a beautiful quilt to past president, Alice Smith, and promised there

is one more in the making for Alice.

Librarian Susan Edwards explained the new procedure for getting library books starting with next month. Nan Maples is working on getting the library list onto the Guild website. Susan announced that in inventorying the books, it is obvious we need to augment our selection with some of the newer editions and asked that anyone who had books they would like to donate to the library, to let her know.



Nan Maples said the draft of the By-Laws for the Guild had been handed out to the Executive Board, with feedback for the final draft at the Executive Board meeting and the By-laws to be presented to the membership at the September meeting for final approval, so the printed copies can go to the membership in October, if all goes according to schedule.

Our guest speaker and member, Daniel Marlos then presented a fascinating program of the history and everything down to the nitty-gritties of the cinaotype method of imprinting fabric with pictures, plants, etc., using, of all things, solutions of cyanide, hydrogen peroxide, glass and other common items. His presentation ended with a drawing for blocks of the cinaotype method on fabric.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 p.m.


