November Speaker

Roderick Kiracofe

Roderick charmed and amused us with his program *Unexpected American Quilts Below the Radar 1950-2000*. Not a quilter himself, he is a quilt collector and author. His presentation did not feature the prize-winning quilts our speakers usually show that demonstrate wonderful workmanship and design. He is partial to printed fabrics so many of the quilts he showed featured prints in a utility quilt fashion. It was fun to see fabrics resourceful quilters resorted to before cotton choices were plentiful. We were amused with incomplete designs that slid off the quilts and quilts composed of hunks of fabric not coordinated in color or size. However, we admired these resourceful quilters who made quilts for warmth using whatever they had available. And thanks to Roderick's presentation perhaps we are inspired to continue our quilting adventure without all the self doubts we often have about our design, color, and technique abilities. We enjoyed both Roderick and his program.

Block of the Month – January 2016

Alice Turner, Mary Ann Kroening and Barbara Gibson

- Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam (not quite 1/4")
- STRIP color of the month Light blue/reads as solid Always use white for light For the GUILD
- BLOCK exchange.
- Assemble assorted medium, and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt.
- For each block cut: Finished block 10 1/2", Unfinished 11"
- Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"
- Squares - 8 matching squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"
- Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"
- Center square 2" x 2"
- Piecing the Blocks Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Scant 1/4" seam.
- 1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 1/4" square. then place marked square on darker 3 1/4" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line, but apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 3/4 square. Make 8 matching.
- 2. Using 2 3/4" matching pieced squares and 2 3/4" squares, make pieced block corner. Making 4 matching.
- 3. Sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make Crayola Crayon Block.

OFFICER & COMMITTEE REPORTS:

RECORDING SECRETARY: There being no corrections, the October Executive Board minutes were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

VICE PRESIDENT (Shier): The topic for the January SCCQG Meeting will be how to save and distribute Guild documents such as procedure books so as not to lose important data. It will be hosted by the Kaleidoscope Quilt Guild. A reminder that the WAC Annual Fundraising Parking Lot Sale is to be held Saturday, November 7 from 8am to 4pm, and that remnants of our Bazaar Sale have been donated. All were encouraged to support it. Set-up for the November Guild meeting was discussed.

TREASURER: (Fogel) Treasurer's Summary Report October 2015 (**Attachment A**) and Income/Expense Report October 2015 (**Attachment B**) were reviewed.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: No Report

PARLIAMENTARIAN: (Bishop) Will be starting to look at getting the Nominating Committee for next year's Board Elections

PROGRAM: (per Millman's notes to Bradfield) The listing for the back of the directory has been sent to Nan Maples. The flyer for the upcoming year was submitted by Sue Vite. There are still some additions to be made, Bradfield has reminded Program Chairs that it is not to be printed until complete. Fogel has provided information regarding past number of copies and printing company. The November speaker is Rod Kiracofe. The December meeting will be a pot-luck. Helpers will be needed and will be recruited at the November meeting. Sharon Bishop volunteered to assist with the placements along with the Monday Sew folks. Members are encouraged to participate in the 16 Christmas Blocks Kathi Wilson is coordinating. There will be a slide-show of the past year activities shown during dinner, and the Nestlé Choir will perform.

WORKSHOP: (Edwards): 5 people have signed up for the November Loving Hands workshop. Work is continuing on finalizing the 2016 Workshop schedule.

MEMBERSHIP: (Spinn): 141 members have joined or renewed to date. Non-paying Members and Affiliates will be taken off the list after giving one additional month. Newsletter donations and Opportunity Ticket purchases at the same time as renewals have proven to be very popular. An event will be held in the Spring for new members.

NEWSLETTER: (Kellam): Deadline: November 16.

2016 FUNDRAISING: The estimated Income/Expense information for the Midnight at Oasis Bazaar was also handed out for review. The Alex Anderson information is up on the Website Home page, Events page and Calendar. Work is continuing to make the tickets available for online purchase. 2017 SHOW: (Hasenauer/Bradfield): Still looking for Venues. The team visited the Glendale Hilton. It is a much smaller venue, and did not have very many open dates – some in the Spring, none in the Fall. The proposal received from the Hilton was discussed and did not look very promising. Everyone was encouraged to continue to look for a Venue. There is the possibility of becoming a "sister guild" to the new Valley Modern Quilt Guild and to work together on future events. Bradfield will follow up on this.

NEW BUSINESS:

FCC Rate Increase: The First Congregational Church has given us a 60 day notice of a rent increase. Their fiscal year is Jan-Dec, and the rate increase will become effective in January, 2016. We expect that they will hold to a 4% increase annually and will reflect that in the budget.

A1 Storage Rate Increase: The Storage unit has given us notice that they will increase our rent from \$216 per month to \$233 per month.

Guild Workshops

Loving Hands Weekend Edition

On Saturday, November 14 workshop participants gathered at WAC for the first of two workshops dedicated to making quilts for Loving Hands. The quilt-as-you-project is the brainchild of our own Nan Maples. 16 kits were prepared in October using beautiful fabrics from Loving Hand's stash and all but one kit was started.

The goal for the November workshop was to get 4 sets of 5 coordinating 2 ½ inch WOF strips sewn down on 11 x WOF backing and batting, then after measuring the resulting width, then cutting squares from the resulting strips. If all goes well, each kit will produce 16 squares.
