


November's speaker, Rod Kiracofe is an author, collector, and artist. His program - *Unexpected American Quilts Below the Radar 1950 - 2000* is his newest exploration into what quilts can be. It was assumed that quilt making had disappeared by the 1950's but his collection of quilts that were made in the last half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century proves that notion wrong.

His personal collection includes extraordinary, eccentric, and soulful quilts that feel modern in comparison to their traditionally pattern counterparts. It was 1973 when he slept under the first quilt he ever saw; and then, the next year was the first time he saw a quilt hung on the wall as art. He enjoys helping others see and view the world in new ways.

The quilts that he is most passionate about are pieced, often crudely quilted or tied, and full of printed fabrics. They are quirky, funky, and soulful expression from a quilt maker who broke the rules. He loves how quilts and photographs document people's lives.

## Block of the Month – December 2015

Alice Turner, Mary Ann Kroening and Barbara Gibson

Block of the Month December, 2015 Alice Turner, Mary Ann Kroening, Barbara Gibson

Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam (not quite 1/4")

STRIP color of the month Green/reads as solid Always use white for light for the GUILD BLOCK exchange.

Assemble assorted medium, and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt.

For each block cut: Finished block 10 1/2", Unfinished 11"

Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"

Squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"

Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"

Center square 2" x 2"

Piecing the Blocks Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Scant 1/4" seam.

1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 1/4" square. Referring to Diagram 1, place marked square on darker 3 1/4" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line, cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 3/4" square. Make 8 matching.

2. Using 2 3/4" matching pieced squares and 2 3/4" squares, make pieced block corner.  
Diagram 2. Making 4 matching.

3. Referring to Diagram 3, sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make Crayola Crayon Block.

### A Good Time with Lyn Mann

Lyn Mann's program at the October meeting was a treat. She showed us about 50 quilts, explaining the inspiration of many, pointing out features like how she extends blocks to avoid having borders. She talked about creating curves in a quilt as well as many other techniques. (She will send directions on sizing borders for the next newsletter.) Lyn does not have a stash, but humorously said she has a S.A.B.E. (Stash Acquisition Beyond Life Expectancy) instead! Amazingly, Lyn has created 572+ quilts; she keeps a record of every quilt and various notes about each. That is a good idea for any of us even though we have not created that many quilts—or do we have members who rival this number?

The birthday quilt workshop was another treat. With two colors in half-square triangles, one block was pieced with four triangles for one's birth month, and another four triangles followed the layout for one's birth day. Then the quilt maker arranged these blocks in a fashion that pleased her. This meant that even if one shared a birthday with another person, each was a different, individual arrangement. Lyn offered many helpful construction tips such as chaining blocks in sets (as the pattern might require) and not cutting them apart until after all were pressed. Certainly this workshop was a challenging pleasure, and Lyn is as good at instructing as she is presenting a program.
