August also brings the launch of **Panelmania** a celebration of philanthropic quilt making, friendship and fun.

Due to generous donations made by GQG members last year, more than 300 fabric panels are yearning to be made into quilts. A variety of quilts constructed from panels will be on display to engage your curiosity, spark creativity and unleash your sense of adventure.

During this three month challenge, quilters who donate finished quilts (top, backing, batting, quilting and binding) will be eligible to win valuable prizes which include facials, massages, gift baskets, and more. Everyone who enters will receive a small token of thanks for participating. All completed quilts (minimum size 34 1/2" X 40" and larger) will be donated to Loving Hands. More details will be presented, distributed on handouts and discussed at the August meeting.

declared Linda Rasmussen as she chose her panel.



## The President's Block



What a wonderful Program and Workshop we had last month! After hearing Linda Rasmussen's program and attending her workshop I now understand better some of the comments made by the quilt show judges.

For example, one of the most puzzling comment to me was "**Straight lines should be straight**". Every time I saw this in judges' notes, I found it confusing. Of course my lines were straight, my sewing machine only sews straight lines. Obviously, if I squared off my blocks and sewed the seams the same, measured my borders, sewed them in a straight line, my straight lines should be straight, right? Wrong!

Linda demonstrated how even with the best sewing and perfect measuring a quilt's lines could be distorted during the pin basting and quilting stage. Using a square, (you know, the large metal tool used by carpenters – looks like an L and hangs in the garage), pinning with a Kwik Klip tool, correctly – (Who'd guess there was a right way to use that thing?), and pin basting the quilt from the outside toward the center, Linda showed how to keep the straight lines straight through the pinning process. She then went on to explain how sewing EVERY SINGLE SEAM in the ditch before quilting was also important to maintain those straight lines. The tradeoff of first sewing every seam is that the quilting process is more fun....and the straight lines are straight! That was only one of Linda's quilting tips and they were all well worth the price of admission. It was a fabulous class, possibly one of the best common sense quilt classes we've had.

During the break at last month's meeting several members came up to me inquiring about the financial status of FCC (First Congregational Church) which was mentioned at the June meeting. We've just had news that FCC has taken care of their financial problems for the time being and that the rents will remain the same for the remainder of this year. In the fall they will announce a planned increase for 2017.


Since our show isn't until September 2017, we are still tossing around possible ideas for a fundraiser this fiscal year. Please contact me if you have any suggestions or would like to help.

## Loving Hands Activities

On June 15<sup>th</sup>, Pat Golditch and I took 100 of our lovingly crafted quilts to Los Angeles County/USC Medical Center. The young ladies who received our donation told us that they are often used for "palliative care." If this phrase is new to you (as it was to me), palliative care is similar to hospice care, but is administered at a facility, like a hospital, instead of in a home. Hence our quilts will be given to comfort people who are truly in need of a caring gift. We received a nice thank you note from the hospital for our donation and we also received a lovely note from Kristin Hale, a church friend of Doralee Dohnel, who received one of our quilts.

Once again, our members were very generous with their time and talents for the benefit of Loving Hands. At the July meeting, a total of 56 quilt tops were turned in, with a dozen (!) or more crafted each by Margaret McNeil and Cathy McNassor. Tops were also created by Doralee Dohnel, Maria Paolone, Norris Freed, Judy Hine, Joliene Blanchard, Nancy Turney, Bev Underwood and Karen Millman. And an additional top came in from New Moon.

Another five quilts were turned in for binding after being nicely quilted by Leah Bessey and Maria Paolone.

And 66 completed quilts were turned in, with Donna Ryan leading our production with 15(!). Other quilts were completed by Cathy Euler, Cindy Abrams, Nancy Condit (sister of member Joanne Brown), Joanne Brown, Craig Coleman, Kathy Wilson, Bill Pelka, Kathy Fogel, Denise Koch, Peg Barber, Mary Ann Andrews, Nan Maples, An Burgess, Mary Bolas and Cindy Abrams.

July was also a month that saw Loving Hands receive a large amount of donated fabric. Fabric donations were received from members Flo Cohen and Nan Maples. We also received fabric donations from a non-member friend of Leah Bessey and a guest at our July meeting, Susan Washburn. Much thanks to all!

Additionally, on July 14<sup>th</sup>, Sandy Bradfield and I went to Candy's Quiltworks to pick up bolt ends that they wanted to donate to Loving Hands. We received 28 cuts of fabric, each of at least three yards and most were batiks. So I estimate we received about 100 yards of fabric from Candy's, hence a thank you note was quickly dispatched to them for this incredibly generous donation. And we were told there is more to come!

## Block of the Month – September 2016

### Crayola Crayon Quilt

STRIP color of the month: **PURPLE** reads as solid. Use a complementary color as the medium color. Always use white for light for the GUILD BLOCK exchange.

Assemble assorted medium and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt. Finished block 10 ½", Unfinished 11" Sew a SCANT ¼" seam (not quite ¼").

For each block cut:

Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 ¼" x 3 ¼"

Squares - 8 matching squares 2 ¾" x 2 ¾"


Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"

Center square 2" x 2"

Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Use scant ¼" seam!

Piecing the Blocks:

1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 ¼" square. Referring to top drawing below, place marked square on darker 3 ¼" square, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam on each side of marked line, cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 ¾" square. Make 8 matching pieced squares.
2. Using 2 ¾" matching pieced squares and 2 ¾" squares, make pieced block corner. Refer to second row below. Making 4 matching sets.
3. Referring to the bottom left side below, sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make the Crayola Crayon Block.
