**Why go to Workshops? Why go to Guild Meetings? Why go to Quilting Groups – Monday Sew, Three Day Sew, Mini-groups etc....? Why volunteer to help with a guild activity?**

The first and foremost reason could be to enjoy the *Friendship* and association with like-minded individuals who experience the same joy and sense of achievement in creating beautiful quilts from fabric. ## SATURDAY WORKSHOP REVIEW



# Holiday Sparkle Balls for December

This is for a Guild Block Exchange at our December 14th, 2016 meeting. We need at least 20 participants for this to succeed, so please plan to join the fun.

Here's how it works: Make 20 Holiday Ball Blocks. Save 1 of the 20 blocks for your quilt. Put 19 blocks in a zip lock bag with your name on the bag and bring it to the December meeting. Turn in the bag AS SOON AS YOU ARRIVE. At the end of the meeting you will receive your bag back with 19 different holiday ball blocks.

Holiday Sparkle Ball Construction:

Use scant 1/4" seams (scant just means 1-2 thread widths shy of 1/4")

Please trim threads and press as you go

Make your 20 balls all the same or different, use up your stash!

Balls: Please use 3 different Christmas colors and/ or Christmas prints

Background: Please use white or white on white

Ball Hanger: Please use grey or silver

For each ball cut these strips:

2 @ 2 1/2" X 7" (Color #1 top & bottom of ball)

2 @ 1 1/2" X 7" (Color #2 center top & center bottom of ball)

1 @ 1" X 7" (Color #3 narrow center strip)

For background cut:

4 @ 2 -1/2" X 2 1/2" (corners of snowballs)

2 @ 1 1/2" X 3 1/2" (top of ball)

For hanger cut:

1 @ 1" X 1 1/2" (hanger)

Sewing steps:


1. Sew 5 ball strips together to make a 7" X 7" unit. This will become the snowball shape.

2. Sew 4 corners to the 7" x 7" unit to make a snowball shape using the 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" background squares.

3. Sew hanger piece to center of the 2 background pieces that are 1 1/2" X 3 1/2". This makes a strip a bit longer than the ball so when you center the hanger you have a bit of "wiggle" room.

4. Sew hanger unit to top of snowball, trim if necessary to make a block 7" wide X 8" long and you will have a Holiday Sparkle Ball.


Finished ball

# MEETING REPORTS

## Minutes of the Executive Board Glendale Quilt Guild November 3, 2016

I. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Colleen Shier, President; Kathi Wilson, Vice President; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Mernie Meier, Communications Secretary; Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian; Cindy Abrams and An Burgess, Programs; Tim Spinn and Leanne Compean, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Newsletter; Tina Curran, Loving Hands and Beth Hasenauer, Fundraising.

II. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

**Vice President/Wilson:** The program for the January SCCQG meeting is still to be determined.

**Treasurer/Fogel:** The monthly Treasurer reports for October (Exhibit A and B) were presented.

**Communications Secretary/Meier:** A Thank You for a donation of fabric has been sent to Mary Ann Andrews. **Programs/Workshops/Abrams:** The speaker for November is Patricia Beaver and her workshop will be hosted by the Santa Clarita Guild and our members are welcome to attend. The Panelmania Grand Prize drawing will take place at the December Holiday Guild Meeting and Pot Luck and the Nestle Choir will provide the entertainment. The programs and workshops brochure for 2017 will be available in December at which time the sign-up and pay for 4 classes and receive the 5<sup>th</sup> class free promotion will begin.

**Membership/Spinn:** Currently we have 132 members and 6 affiliates. Work is proceeding on the Roster. It was suggested that next year we again allow using BookWhen for renewals.

**Newsletter/Miyahara:** Newsletter articles must be submitted in Word or pdf format. Photos should be in jpeg format. Please include subject names when sending photos.

**Fundraising/Curran:** Block kits for the Opportunity Quilt are currently being distributed. White Glove sign-ups for Road2CA are needed to meet our obligation so that we may display our Opportunity Quilt and sell tickets during the show. The next Quilt Show meeting is set for Wednesday, November 16.

**Loving Hands/Curran:** Loving Hands received a large donation of fabric from Bobbie Moon. At the next Loving Hands meeting on November 18, there will be a discussion on how best to handle fabric donations. Thirteen quilts were delivered to Quilts of Valor to be used for female veterans. Kits for the Karibu receiving blanket project are set for the Saturday edition of Loving Hands on November 12.

### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Rental agreement - We received the rental agreement for the upcoming year from the Church and are currently reviewing it.
2. 501(c)3 Update – We currently have a request in for a copy of the original paperwork that was filed with the IRS.
3. Trips – Since the bus is donated by our County Supervisor, we cannot request a bus until after the election November 8, when we find out who the new Supervisor is.

### V. NEW BUSINESS

1. A suggested survey was presented for review with the thought it be handed out to members in order to see how we are doing meeting our members' expectations and to elicit suggestions. Colleen will fine tune the survey with a distribution target date of January 2017.
2. There was a discussion regarding the recent Bylaws change affecting the Past President dues policy. The resulting consensus was that Past Presidents who served at least one full year prior to 2016 may continue to be exempt from annual payment of dues.

VI. A motion to adjourn was made and the meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

- Thanks to everyone for pitching in on sewing labels on the Loving Hands quilts.
- The Guild has received a donated Husqvarna Viking Designer I Embroidery/Sewing Machine. After asking for a show of hands of those who would be interested in the machine if the Guild were to auction/sell it, members indicated there was very little interest in doing that.
- Hope everyone is enjoying the Email Blasts. Be sure to send photos for Facebook if you have them.
- After Show and Tell, please put your quilts on the table to the side of the stage so members can see them.

### IV. Reports

**Vice President/Wilson:** The next SCCQG meeting is January 14, 2017 in Rancho Cucamonga.

**Treasurer/Fogel:** The Treasurer's reports for October were presented.

**Communications Secretary/Meier:** A note of encouragement was sent to Harriet Sartinsky who is undergoing more treatment.

**Newsletter/Miyahara:** Articles are due by November 14<sup>th</sup>. Please submit them in Word or pdf format and if you send photos, they should be in jpeg format and please identify the subjects.

**Programs/Abrams:** The Panelmania Challenge produced 44 quilts tonight. Congratulations and thanks to all who participated. The prize drawing will be held at the December Holiday Potluck. The Nestle choir will again provide the entertainment.

**Workshops/Carlos:** Sign-ups for 2017 workshops will begin the new program of sign up and pay for 4 workshops and receive the 5<sup>th</sup> workshop for free – a \$35 value.

**Membership/Spinn:** The Roster is in the works and along with dues cards will be available at the December meeting.

**Fundraising/Curran:** The Opportunity Quilt block kits are available and some are already being tuned back in. The next meeting of the Quilt Show Committee will be November 16.

**Opportunity Quilt/Curran:** Volunteers are needed to white glove at Road to fulfill our commitment so we can display our quilt and sell tickets.

**Loving Hands/Curran:** Thank you to everyone who helped by sewing on labels during the meeting. Bobby Moon has donated heaps of fabric since she closed her shop. She will be doing on-line sales and long arm quilting. Loving Hands donated 13 quilts to Quilts of Valor to be given to female veterans. Thirty quilts will be delivered to the Alzheimer's Project in San Diego. The November 12 Loving Hands Saturday Edition will be making flannel receiving blankets for a birthing clinic in Kenya.

**Block of the Month/Edwards:** There were enough blocks submitted to have two winners. In lieu of the December Block of the Month we will have the Sparkle Ball Block Exchange. Block of the Month will resume in January.

**Holiday Block Exchange/Wilson:** A sample of a finished quilt using the sparkle balls was shown. Members are encouraged to make 20 blocks. Place 19 completed blocks in a ziplock bag with your name on the bag, keeping 1 block for yourself, and bring the bag to the meeting. At the end of the meeting you will go home with 19 different blocks.

### **Loving Hands' Flannel Receiving Blanket Event**

On Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, the guild had a highly enjoyable – and productive! – gathering. Twenty-three GQG members spent the day making flannel receiving blankets for birthing clinics in rural Kenya. Crystal Dudley kicked off our day by arriving with 16 blankets she had made at home with her own flannel stash. And then she proceeded to set up her sewing machine and make more blankets with us. Later, Donna Ryan arrived with another 15 that she and a couple other women had made the previous day at Baron's Sewing Center in Woodlands Hills, with fabric donated by the store. And she too joined in to make even more.

We had prepared enough fabric to make 50 blankets and had additional flannel on hand – with large donations from Nan Maples and Maria Gonzales – in case we needed to cut more flannel to keep the blanket production going. And we did!

Before the lunch break, Dr. Lynne Davidson, director of the non-profit, gave a short but compelling presentation explaining the work her clinics do to provide safer birthing experiences for both the mothers and their babies. Then she answered many questions our group had about the work they do.

Lunch featured a delicious Kenyan stew made by Cindy Abrams and wonderful Kenyan cake made by Kathi Wilson. And the room was decorated with African artifacts bought in for display by An Burgess and Kathi Wilson.

The hope was to end the day with 50 blankets and we ended up with 115! Lynne was completely overwhelmed with how many blankets we made and how colorful they were. The day was such a positive group experience as we helped a worthy charity do even more good. Everyone went home feeling great about what we had accomplished as well as knowing how to make flannel receiving blankets for the babies in their own lives.

Thanks to the Workshop folks (especially Jackie Carlos) and the entire Programming team for pushing this volunteer effort. And thanks to everyone who came and participated.
