Michael McNamara ("Mac") Trunk Show

Mac grew up in New England. His many influences come from seashore life, the White Mountains of New Hampshire, ice storms, floating in the Atlantic, living in Boston, and the famous autumnal foliage of the east coast. Like most of us, Mac was also influenced by the people in his life, his parents and grandparents and will share his stories during his trunk show in March. In college, his English degree gave him a love of the metaphor, symbolic irony, the zeugma, and other writing tools that he translates into imagery, visual puns, ironic humor, and other poetic expressions. His second degree is in Art History gave him the appreciation for iconic imagery, signs and signets that represent an emotion, a person, or a place, a person, or an emotion.

Mac made his first quilt in 1976. Later, while in Boston, he worked on the NAMES Project - making many panels for friends and loved ones, along with helping other folks make panels for their loved ones. He joined quilt groups which have also been a great influence on his work.

Mac will present a trunk show of his quilts and since he now lives just a few hours away in the San Francisco area, and will be driving to southern California, he will be bringing several of his quilts to show and share! He likes to reinvent and reinterpret blocks and give them a new setting, sometimes layering fabrics examples of which we will see in his many quilts.

Happy March, everyone! This year is flying by already!

Here in California, March brings warmer weather, even though we bounced around between cold and hot weather last month. I often long for the seasons which were present in my youth on the East coast & are sadly missing since moving to the Pacific Southwest. . My brain fails to understand 88 degree weather in February, so in March I am really confused by the spans of cooler weather, resulting in the inevitable colds and flu for family and friends.

Keep your fingers crossed for me. I need all the encouragement I can get!

Widely known for her popular television show, Simply Quilts, Alex has also written numerous books, taught many classes and annual retreats, and is now a busy cohost of "The Quilt Show" online quilting community. In addition to conducting two lectures, Alex will be bringing some of her popular quilts for us to see and will be available to autograph her newest books for us. Alex's personal mission is not only to share her love of quilting with anyone who will listen, but to educate and encourage those interested in quilting as clearly and simply as possible, so quilting can continue to be handed down from generation to generation. Alex graciously agreed to help with this fundraiser, even though she no longer has the time for guild events. I hope you will all be on hand to welcome her on behalf of GQG on April 16th.

February 2016 Program Featuring Tina Curran

The February program was extra special--to begin with because the presenter was "our own" Tina Curran. We celebrate Tina, her work, and accomplishments. Beginning in 2009, both Quilter's Newsletter and Quiltmaker have featured Tina's work—the most recent in 2015.

"Christmas Surprise" in Quilter's Newsletter and "Knot my Block: Spectrum" in Quiltmaker. Thankfully, she has developed many patterns from her designs so we can also create some of Tina's delightful quilts. Her quilt pattern note cards also certainly speak to quilt lovers. Do get on your computer to learn even more about Tina's talents.

Generally, when a speaker shows quilts, the quilts seem to have come together magically: we see only beautiful finished works of art. However, Tina took us to the beginning of a quilt and showed us the process she uses to create her "magic." Her example was the beautiful Christmas wreath quilt that features nine traditional Christmas symbols. To begin she transfers her basic idea to Word in her computer and then come many refinements of that original idea including the selection of motifs (trees, houses, snowmen, Christmas lights, candy canes, mittens, tree ornaments, stockings, and candles). Then she begins the sizing and arrangement process within the nine block designs. Next, she makes fabric choices and arranges the nine designs within the quilt. She even auditions spacing between the blocks as well as border sizes. The finished result is a wonderful 60 x 60" quilt (Let's hope this will become a pattern!)

Tina showed us the "magic" behind her quilting designs and illustrated the process that will inspire as well as explain a way for us to create our own designs. Certainly, this was a special and unique program that we thank Tina for sharing with us.



Block of the Month – April 2016

- Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam (not quite 1/4")
- STRIP color of the month: Medium yellow, reads as solid Always use white for light for the GUILD
- BLOCK exchange.
- Four fabrics, Medium yellow strip, green or color of your choice, and white.
- Assemble assorted medium and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt.
- For each block cut: Finished block 10 1/2", Unfinished 11"
- Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"
- Squares - 8 matching squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"
- Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"
- Center square 2" x 2"
- Piecing the Blocks Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Scant 1/4" seam.
- 1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 1/4" square. Referring to Diagram 1, place marked square on darker 3 1/4" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line, cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 3/4" square. Make 8 matching.
- 2. Using 2 3/4" matching pieced squares and 2 3/4" squares, make pieced block corner. Diagram 2. Making 4 matching.
- 3. Referring to Diagram 3, sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make Crayola Crayon Block.



SWEET POTATO CHILI FROM THE WAC FEBRUARY MEETING

(GREAT FOR THIS EL NINO WEATHER WE'RE HAVING)

- Onion - 1 cup (TJ's has precut onions in the salad section)
- Green and red peppers - 1/4 cup each (omitted in WAC recipe)
- Zucchini - 1 cup (more or less)
- Carrot - 1 cup (more or less)
- Garlic - 1.5 t
- Olive oil - 1 T
- Cumin- 0.5 t
- Water - 1 cup
- Tomato - 3 cups (can substitute some marina sauce instead)
- Salsa - 1 cup (omitted in WAC recipe)
- Sweet potato - 3 cups (Peeled and cubed or use the whole package that can be found, when in season, at TJ's)
- Beans (red kidney, or black-eyes peas or garbanzo) - 20 oz. can, drained. (at WAC used all - for small recipe use one can of either from TJ's)
- Corn -2 cups (used the whole package of roasted TJ's frozen corn).

Instructions

Put ingredients in a large saucepan. Cook until carrots and sweet potato are done. Serve Hot. At WAC it was served with Corn Bread Muffins made from Marie Calendars mix.
