## **A Quirky Quilter's Alphabet** **May 11 Program Speaker: Sylvia Q. Davis**

Let's talk A to Z about quilting and about life as we view a variety of quilts. For each letter of the alphabet, Sylvia will present a quilt along with quilting tips and observations. Teaser Alert! "S" is for "Sex"!

Remember, the emphasis is on "quirky" and you are guaranteed to have fun!

Sylvia has been a "crosscrafter" almost all of her life. Her mother taught her how to sew, knit and crochet when she was 6 years old. These crafts continue to be a source of joy throughout her life. In 1993, Sylvia discovered quilting and all the other crafts went to the back of the closet. Shortly thereafter, she joined the African-American Quilters of Los Angeles.

Her quilts have been seen at PIQF, Road to California, the African-American History Museum, the Riverside Museum, and the International Quilt Festival/Long Beach. She is a member of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds, Northern California Quilt Council, Westside Quilters Guild and Los Angeles Modern Quilt Guild. Sylvia is a credentialed teacher and teaches workshops at local quilt shops, in an Adult Education program, and has been a teacher at the Glendale Quilt Show 2011. The Winter 2012 issue of Generation Q Magazine featured her in the "My First" section. Sylvia is also creating her own line of quilting patterns. Although she uses most of her quilts in classes, trunk shows, and workshops, she has sold quilts and has done several commissioned quilts.

Sylvia says, "My quilts would be considered "traditional" in style; however, my use of fabrics and design are richly colorful and exotic. Recently, Sylvia has enjoyed a new level of creative joy as she quilts custom designs on her HQ16 mid-arm machine. She is also finding the influences of the Modern quilt esthetic to be quite exciting.

Sylvia's 2016 goals are to become even more creative and to encourage her fellow quilters to "stretch" into new and exciting projects. She is expanding her horizon into the realm of art quilts and she plans to take her students there, too. Sylvia says, "The thought of experimenting with disparate fabrics, paints, threads, soldering guns, and maybe even power tools is oh so exciting!"

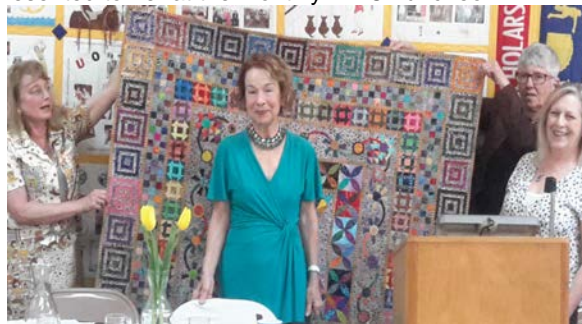

# Block of the Month – June 2016

Alice Turner, Mary Ann Kroening and Barbara Gibson

Sew a SCANT 1/4" seam (not quite 1/4")

STRIP color of the month MED- BLUE/reads as solid Always use white for light for the GUILD BLOCK exchange. Total of four colors, white, blue, and two additional colors.

Assemble assorted medium and dark fabrics of BASIC crayon colors for the 12 month quilt. Finished block 10 1/2", Unfinished 11".

For each block cut:

Pieced squares - 2 sets of 4 matching squares 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"

Squares - 8 matching squares 2 3/4" x 2 3/4"

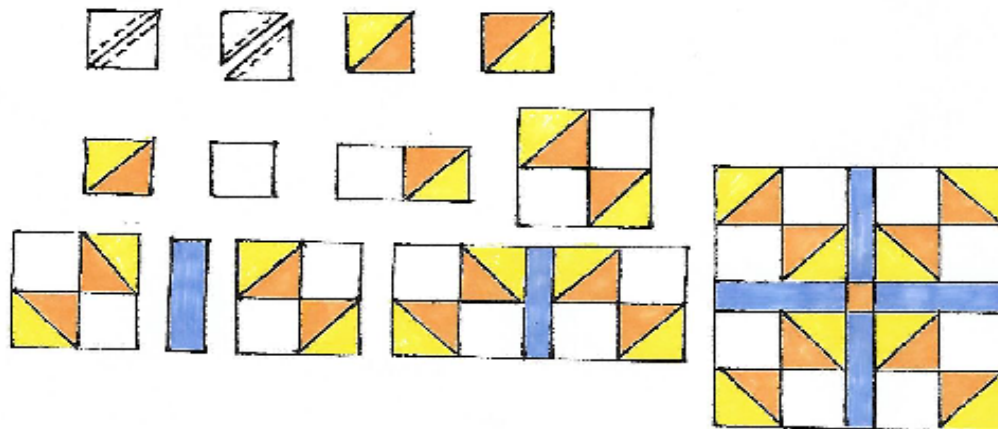
Strips - 4 matching strips 2" x 5"

Center square 2" x 2"

Block piecing instructions are for 1 block only. Use scant 1/4" seam!

Piecing the Blocks:

1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of print 3 1/4" square. Referring to top drawing below, place marked square on darker 3 1/4" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line, cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Square up blocks to 2 3/4" square. Make 8 matching pieced squares.
2. Using 2 3/4" matching pieced squares and 2 3/4" squares, make pieced block corner. Refer to second row below. Making 4 matching sets.
3. Referring to the bottom left side below, sew together 4 matching block corners, 4 matching 2" x 5" strips and one 2" square to make Crayola Crayon Block.

### OFFICER & COMMITTEE REPORTS

- **RECORDING SECRETARY:** (Maples) There being no corrections, the Mar 3, 2016 Executive Board minutes were approved as printed in the Newsletter.
- **VICE PRESIDENT:** (Shier) Layout for the April 13 Membership meeting was discussed.
- **TREASURER:** (Shier) Treasurer's Report February 2016 ME (**Attachment A**) and Budget Report ME February 2016 (**Attachment B**).
- **CORRESPONDING SECRETARY:** (Gibson) Absent, summary presented by President.
- **PARLIAMENTARIAN:** (Bishop) A full slate of Officer candidates (**Attachment C**) was presented to the Board which agreed to put it forth to the Membership at the April Membership Meeting. **MOTION:** (Maples) To approve Jackie Carlos to serve a third consecutive term as Workshop Co-Chair. Unanimously approved.
- **PROGRAM:** (Millman) Presented a written report (**Attachment D**).
- **WORKSHOPS:** It was agreed that if a minimum of six (6) registrations are not received for the May workshop at the April meeting, the May workshop will be cancelled.
- **MEMBERSHIP** (Spinn/Compean): 144 Members. A New Member event will be held May 21 at WAC to include new members from 2014 through 2016.
- **NEWSLETTER:** (Miyahara) Deadline Apr 18.
- **2016 FUND RAISING:** (Coleman/Wilson) The Alex Anderson event will take place this month and is under control.
- **2017 FUND RAISING:** (Curran) See Old Business.
- **Loving Hands:** (Golditch) Presented the Quarterly Report (**Attachment E**).

### OLD BUSINESS

- **Post Office Box:** (Fogel) Primary and secondary costs have been identified. Timing is still being researched.
- **Bylaws Review:** (Bishop) The planned Bylaws review scheduled for fiscal 2015-16 has been postponed indefinitely.
- **Procedural Manual Updates:** (Fogel/Shier) A recommended outline has been circulated to all Officers along with two completed examples. All Officers (outgoing and continuing) should submit electronic copies of their updated procedures for their Office to Kathy Fogel by the June Board Meeting. Hard copies for outgoing Officers are due at that time as well and, per the Bylaws, should be delivered to the Parliamentarian.
- **2017 Fund Raising:** A presentation covering pertinent issues and facts was presented by Tina Curran (**Attachment F**). A truncated version of this presentation will be shared with the Membership in April. **MOTION:** (Maples) To book the Pasadena Convention Center Conference Center for September 21 – 23, 2017 for a two-day (Fri-Sat) fund raising event. Unanimously approved. The 2017 Fund Raising Chairs Elect were instructed to enact the motion. Tim Spinn raised the issue that the 2017 Fund Raising Event would not take place within the 2016-17 Fiscal Year and that this might require a Bylaws revision relative to the term of office of the 2017 Fund Raising Chairs. The Parliamentarian is asked to follow up on this immediately.

### NEW BUSINESS

- **BookWhen:** Has malfunctioned in several ways, most involving the issue of attempts to make multiple purchases under one name, in the face of the Alex event bookings. This will be reviewed in detail at the Alex Wrap Meeting.

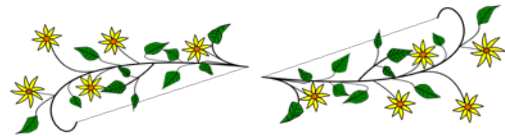
## Sunshine and Shadows

## "Capturing the Colors of California - Hues, Tints, Shades, and Tones" Entry Information

As you travel around the highways, byways, unknown locations, and surprising vistas in the state of California, what colors are unique to that particular spot? Is it the blues of the oceans, the greens of the forests, the neutral tones of the desert, the oranges of the poppy fields, the varied colors of the mountains or a cityscape? There is a continuous difference in the colors affected by the surrounding environment, temperature and the weather conditions from one moment to the next. Select a color scheme of your choice inspired by that particular place in California. Next, create a quilt utilizing the chosen colors. What traditional or contemporary block(s), appliqué pattern, or mixed quilting techniques could be used to enhance the colors? The quilt can be traditional, modern, or an art quilt.

### Parameters:

- ❖ Create a quilt based on the theme "Capturing the Colors of California."
- ❖ The entire quilt, oriented horizontal, must measure 24" horizontally and 20" vertically, including binding. Embellishments must not protrude more than ½" from the surface of the quilt.
- ❖ The quilt must be made with fabric and quilted either by hand or machine or both. It must consist of three layers, and be either bound or closed along the edges.
- ❖ On the reverse side include a label with your name, email address, mailing address, phone number, and quilt title and the guild to which you belong. A four 4" sleeve is required.
- ❖ Your entry must be free of any text or images protected by copyright, unless you have the expressed written permission from the person or institution that holds the copyright and you provide that written permission with your submission. Visit the SCCQG website for the entry form or send an email to [elke.miyahara@gmail.com](mailto:elke.miyahara@gmail.com).
- ❖ The entry form must be completely filled out including a brief statement sharing your inspiration for the quilt linked to the theme of the challenge of no more than 150 words. Include a photograph of your quilt with the entry form.
- ❖ An entrant must be a current member of a member guild of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds.
- ❖ By completing a Call for Entry, you are agreeing to allow your work to be displayed for the duration of the Festival.
- ❖ Further information to follow regarding where and when to send your quilt for collection.
