## **"Making Stuff! Why We Do What We Do. Nick Coman and Chase Wong - Dragonfly Dyeworks**

The work of Nick Coman and Chase Wong, fiber artists who have collaborated to create beautiful ice dyed garments and fabrics for quilters, sewers, and fellow textile artists who appreciate the highest quality, will be presented during our August General Meeting in a trunk show entitled, "Making Stuff! Why We Do What We Do."

Since January 2012, when Chase and Nick Coman became friends, their shared backgrounds in design and love of surface decoration became a common denominator for them. Using color and texture to enhance the beauty of fabric and to create unique art was the goal each aimed for. So it was natural that later that year, Chase and Nick co-founded Dragonfly Dyeworks..

Roger "Chase" Wong, was born and raised in British North Borneo which is now part of the Malaysian Federation. Coming to the United States in the early 80's to attend the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Chase started in Computer Science but found it dry and boring so ended up in getting both of his degrees in architecture. Architecture perfectly combined his love for art and science into a perfect harmonious whole. Chase was hired by a renowned architecture firm and relocated to Los Angeles right out of college, where he practiced the profession for several years until a major downturn in the construction industry.

Nick Coman has had a life-long love affair with fiber and design. At age 6, starting with glue and fabric scraps, he made his GI Joe some new duds. He continued sewing through high school and college making costumes and garments for himself and others. At one point, Nick decided to go to fashion design school and has never looked back. After receiving his degree at FIDM he worked for costume shops, event companies, and commercial garment manufactures, but eventually settled in as a custom clothier and fiber artist. Somewhere along the way Nick developed a love for art quilts. Diving in with his usual abandon, he learned from teachers, books videos, and some osmosis how to use surface design to create one of a kind fabrics to use in his quilts and custom garments. Today Nick makes clothing for a private clientele and teaches clothing quilting, and design techniques around the country. He is also a published author, with a book and numerous sewing publication articles to his name. Nick has a studio in Los Angeles, where he lived with his partner, Jim, until his untimely death, and 2 cats, Tiger and Squeek.

Now traveling around the country showcasing their products and talents at quilt shows and arts and crafts festivals, they love to share their knowledge by teaching others who are eager to learn how to dye fabrics. And indeed, GQG is ready!

Join us in welcoming them to our General Meeting and our Saturday, August 12th workshop. Fun, fun, fun!





# 2017 Quilt Show Ripple Effect!

September 22 and 23



## 7 Weeks & counting!!!! It's almost ShowTime!

So many of you sent in quilt entries. We have the same number to judge as for the last show, but the major difference is this time, all the entries are from GQG members. That's totally awesome! We didn't need non-member entries at all to get a good number for Judging. Thank you all for entering!

Things are going to get very busy in the last weeks before showtime. Now is when attention to detail will really count.

- ~ Classes are filling, so make sure you reserve your space this month. Wait listing is no fun!
- ~ Book hotel rooms now! Our group discount will disappear after the cut-off date in September before the show, plus, sales of our Retreat Package will also end at the same time.
- ~ Volunteer now! Don't wait! It takes the whole Guild to put on a great show, so choose the duty you like while spots are still available. Work more than one shift, if possible. Remember, "many hands make short work" and we have many talented people in our Guild.
- ~ If you cannot be at the show, contact Beth to volunteer to help in August or September. There are many ways you can help out before the show. Just ask!

Now that quilt entries are in, special exhibits are finalizing, plus, our Featured Artist, Luke Haynes is preparing to ship his exhibit in August. Our layout is being approved by the Fire Marshall and things will begin to fall into place. This venue will be the perfect backdrop for our quilt show and, as Tina says, "The building will scream quilts!" We can't wait!

Since many of you are busily finishing your quilting, binding and making labels, now is the perfect time to finish up. Blocking insures that your quilt will be square, lie flat and hang straight. This is the perfect finishing touch for your quilt.

Review these "Blocking Tips from Mary Ann Andrews" for more information:

"You've put the last stitch in your quilt and it is ready for the show. But is it? Often our quilts are rumpled from being handled and benefit from being blocked. Blocking also gives you one last chance to be sure straight lines are straight, corners are square and the sides are the same length.

The best way to block is to dampen the quilt and pin it to a special blocking wall. You can make one using insulation board. If the board is covered with a grid it makes it even easier to line everything up. Most of us do not have space to put up a board but can make do with towels over a sheet over carpet. Put the quilt down and spray with water until it is damp. Measure opposite sides to see if they are the same. Sight down any straight lines on the quilt to be sure they are straight and use one of your rulers to check the corners. By now the fibers of your quilt will have relaxed and you can do any nudging it needs to get it into shape. Pin through the quilt into the carpet every ½ inch to 1 inch just inside the binding. Putting the pins in the seam prevents the pin holes from showing. If the quilt dries out too much to be nudged, spray again. Leave until it is dry, then carefully remove the pins.

Congratulations! Now your quilt is ready for the show."

## Minutes of the Executive Board of the Glendale Quilt Guild July 6, 2017

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:35 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Colleen Shier, President; Tim Spinn, Vice President; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Mernie Meier, Communications Secretary; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian; Cindy Abrams and An Burgess, Programs; Karen Millman and Pat Golditch, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Newsletter; Beth Hasenauer, 2017 Fund raising; Tina Curran, Loving Hands; Craig Coleman 2018 Fund Raising.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. BOARD REPORTS

**Vice President/Spinn:** The SCCQG meeting is July 8 when will be handing out Quilt Show information packets.

**Treasurer/Fogel:** The Treasurer's Report for June was presented. Looking at the year-end financials the Guild is doing well staying within the budget. A new Income/Expense form will be on line shortly.

**Communications Secretary/Meier:** The Guild received a thank you note from the family of Mary Bolas who recently passed away. Susan Edwards is not feeling well. Congratulations to Tim Spinn on his retirement.

**Programs/Abrams:** Contracts for upcoming speakers are being processed and things are in order.

**Workshops/Shier:** Workshops are filling nicely.

**Membership/Millman:** Renewals are coming in and the new team is ready to take over with help from the previous Membership Chairs.

**Newsletter/Miyahara:** The current Newsletter was mailed with the \$.70 stamp. Deadline for the next Newsletter is July 24, one week later than usual.

**Fund Raising 2017/Hausenauer:** Another vendor has been added along with a Saturday afternoon class by Superior Threads. There will not be a Friday night event. Colleen sent an email blast to all SCCQG Guilds and asked that it be forwarded to their members. Paid advertisements will be in the Country Register and the Glendale News Press. Quilt entries are due July 14. Kathy Fogel is looking for Volunteers to sign-up. The next Show Committee meeting is July 27.

**Fund Raising 2018/Coleman:** The 2018 Opportunity Quilt is underway on Wednesdays at the WAC and needs a name. The team is calling for suggestions for the name of the quilt and also suggestions for what kind of event to have. Suggestion forms will be available at the Guild meeting and you can also email Kathi Wilson.

**Loving Hands/Curran:** A total of 283 quilts were distributed during the last quarter, April to June 2017, which included 32 camper quilts. The last Loving Hands day was spent preparing quilts for quilting. The next Loving Hands day, July 21, will also focus on the same thing. August 31 there will be a 12 hour Quilting Bee and Picnic to be held from 9 am to 9 pm at the WAC which will focus on quilting as many tops as possible so they can be gifted to those in need. Donna Ryan recently picked up a "truck-load" of 43 boxes of flannel from storage. She went through each and every box and was able to find appropriate donation locations for the unused flannel. Some of the places she found for the donations were: MEND – Meet Each Need with Dignity; a women's shelter for abused/battered women where they make flannel pajamas for the women and children; a Mormon group that uses flannel for female needs in third world countries; and a group of nuns. Thank you to Donna for undertaking this *huge* job which helped to free up a little space in storage. However, we still have a long way to go.

**Audit Committee/Shier:** Names were suggested for the Audit Committee and contacts will be made.

**Block of the Month/Shier:** Board members were asked to make suggestions for a Block of the Month Chair.

### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

**Donation Committee:** The Committee met and established guidelines for accepting and allocating donations. Only 100% cotton fabric will be accepted. Notions, quilting patterns, sewing machines and other quilt related items will be accepted on a case by case basis. Items that will not be accepted are magazines, books, clothing patterns and non-quilt related items. Due to a lack of storage, there is currently a moratorium on accepting any private party donations. Allocation priorities are Loving Hands and Guild use. Every effort will be made to find a good home for items deemed not suitable for Guild use.

V. The meeting was **adjourned** at 8:00 p.m.
