As most of you know, we have been diligently searching for a new location for our guild meetings. We have checked almost 70 places. Our search criteria: 1. **Day** - 2nd Wednesday evening of the month (if not available, asked about the 2nd Thursday of the month), 2. **Time** - 5pm – 9pm, 3. **Cost** - Goal to stay under \$200 a month, 4. **Parking** - Sufficient and ease of access, 5. **Location** - Glendale or adjacent, 6. **Size** – Accommodate 50 – 100 members, and 7. **Esthetics** –stage, microphone, setup etc...

After thorough deliberation by the Board – not an easy discussion as there was no ‘perfect solution’ at this time - we voted to go with the **Goodwill Enrichment Center, located at 3150 San Fernando Blvd.** This is a **fabulous facility**, in an up and coming area, easy on and off the 2 FWY, with **lots of parking**, reasonably priced and **available on our regular meeting night.**

Starting in January we are doing a **trial period of 6 months** at this location to give everyone a chance to see how it works and give input.

To make sure we haven't missed a better facility, we are putting together a committee to continue the search. (Who knows, the perfect place may be out there.) A Guild Block Exchange at our December 13th, 2017 Meeting

"In From the Cold" free Moda pattern by Kate Spain

Please plan to join the fun...we've been so successful the last few years with these exchanges....make a small quilt that can be a holiday gift, a wall hanging or a Loving Hands donation.

Here's how it works:

1. Make 9 (nine) "In From the Cold" Mug & Cup Holiday blocks.
2. Save 1 of the 9 blocks for your quilt.
3. Put the other 8 blocks in a zip lock bag with your name on the bag.
4. Bring the bag with your 8 blocks to the December 13th meeting.
5. Turn in the bag **AS SOON AS YOU ARRIVE**.
6. At the end of the meeting you will receive your bag back with 8 different Mug & Cup Holiday blocks.

"In From the Cold" Block Construction:

1. Use scant 1/4 " seams (scant just means 1-2 thread widths shy of 1/4").
2. Please trim threads and press as you go.
3. Make your 9 mugs and/or cups all the same or all different, whatever you want to do to use up your stash! The pattern is your starting point!
4. Decorate them anyway you like, or not at all...that's part of the fun.
5. Mugs & Cups: Use whatever holiday colors/fabrics that you like.
6. Background: Please use white or white-on-white.
7. Follow the instructions on the pattern. It can be found at:

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING REPORT

MINUTES OF THE GLENDALE QUILT GUILD EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 2, 2017

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Colleen Shier, President; Tim Spinn, Vice President; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Mernie Meier, Communications Secretary; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian; Karen Millman, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Newsletter; Beth Hasenauer, 2017 Fund Raising; Kathi Coleman Wilson, 2018 Fund Raising; and Tina Curran, Loving Hands.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD REPORTS

Treasurer/Fogel: The Treasurer's report for October was presented. The final figures for the Quilt Show won't be in until the end of November as there are still a few items outstanding. Colleen will be handling Treasurer's duties for the next three weeks while Kathy is out of town.

Parliamentarian/Ryan: Volunteers for the Nominating Committee are being recruited.

Programs/Shier: Work on printing the brochure is underway.

Membership/Millman: New members receive a number of items when joining for the first time, i.e. badge, Roster, etc. There was another discussion regarding efforts on an on-going basis to make new members feel welcome and encourage their participation in Guild activities. We are still working on having mentors follow-up with new members for several meetings. Social time was also discussed. Even with trying to make the business part of the meeting as brief as possible, there still did not seem to be enough time to socialize, see the quilts from Show and Tell, and sign-up for workshops. The cookies were a good idea but seemed to be a detriment with a long line ensuing and some members taking more than just a few cookies as intended. It was suggested we go back to our 6:30 p.m. starting time to give a little more time for socializing. No decisions were made.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Please send photos and articles in Microsoft Word format making them easier to manipulate space-wise for the Newsletter.

Fund Raising 2017/Curran: The Wrap-Up meeting contained reports with good critique and suggestions but there was enough criticism regarding Quilt Acquisition/Judging that an apology and explanation was requested to be included in the next Newsletter. A question arose regarding members who did not meet their obligations regarding ticket sales and working on the show. Kathy Fogel will compile a list for discussion at the next Board meeting.

Fund Raising 2018/Wilson: The new Opportunity Quilt has already raised \$1,000. The next planning meeting is November 15, 2017 at noon at WAC.

Loving Hands/Curran: Nineteen quilts were sent to victims of the Las Vegas shooting who are currently working with a therapist. Three quilts are going to a relative of Merylee Schaefer who lost everything in the Calistoga Fire. We will be participating in a Fat Quarter Drive for the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild who also lost everything in the Santa Rosa Fire. Nancy Turney will deliver the Fat Quarters. At the next Loving Hands meeting we will be cutting fat quarters for the drive.

Trips/Shier: Flo Cohen is making plans for the bus trip to Road2CA at a suggested cost to members of \$20 which includes admission at \$16.00 per person and tips and treats. Our 2018 Opportunity Quilt will be there on Saturday.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Meeting Location/Shier: Board members will be meeting November 3 with a representative of the new owners of our current meeting location to find out what our options will be going forward in 2018 and whether they will honor our existing contracts for the November and December meetings. Currently we are exploring other locations and not having much luck finding a location meeting our criteria.

December Block Exchange/Wilson: The pattern and directions are available and looks like another fun exchange.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Future of Guild Quilt Shows/Shier: The Guild will need to decide soon whether a 2019 Quilt Show is viable. A meeting of the Executive Board and interested members was subsequently scheduled for November 30, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at WAC to focus on future fund raising and the bigger question of whether to have a quilt show in 2019 or not.

Opportunity Quilt 2019/Shier: An idea for a 2019 Opportunity Quilt was presented by Colleen. The Board decided it was jumping-the-gun to bring up an Opportunity Quilt for 2019 before knowing the outcome of the meeting to discuss whether or not to have a Quilt Show in 2019.

The **meeting** was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING REPORT

GLENDLAE QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 8, 2017

I. The **meeting** was called to order by President Shier at 6:45 p.m. at the Glendale Grace Church.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Tonight's speaker is Sandra Bruce.
- Future meetings: The next Board meeting is December 7th and the next General Membership meeting is the holiday potluck, December 13th.
- There will be a special meeting on November 30th at 6:30 p.m. at WAC to discuss future fund raising and whether or not that will include a quilt show. Interested members are invited to attend.
- Our last meeting at the current venue, Glendale Grace Church, will be December 13, 2017. We are actively looking for a meeting place in the Glendale or Glendale adjacent area that can accommodate 50 to 100 members with good parking and ease of access. The budgeted goal is \$200 per month or less with a time of 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday of the month. It is imperative we find a location for meetings to start in January 2018. A list of suggested places is available for members to review in the hopes of finding a suitable location.
- Members were asked to indicate by a show of hands if they absolutely could not attend Guild meetings if they were on Thursdays. Three members indicated they absolutely could not attend on Thursdays out of 66 attending.

IV. BOARD REPORTS

Parliamentarian/Ryan: It is time to form a nominating committee in order to put forth a slate of officers for election next year. Members wishing to serve the Guild are asked to contact Donna Ryan.

Treasurer/Shier: The October Treasurer's Report was presented.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Please continue to submit articles photos and send them in Word.

Programs/Workshops/Abrams: Upcoming programs and workshops were presented. Work has begun on the brochure for 2018 but release is dependent on a final decision on a location and dates for the programs.

Fund Raising 2017/Curran: The Quilt Show was very well received with lots of compliments and very few complaints. The budget for the Quilt Show was \$60,000 and we stayed under budget, spending \$44,600 or less than 75% of the amount budgeted for the Show. As for Show income, we had hoped to make more money, but lower-than-expected attendance contributed to our income totaling \$50,500, for a lower-than-expected profit of approximately \$6,000.

It was felt that that was a lot of work for such a small return and is why a meeting has been scheduled to look at future fund raising and whether or not that should include a quilt show.

Fund Raising 2018/Wilson: The 2018 Opportunity Quilt has already brought in \$1,000. It will be at Road2CA on Saturday that weekend. If anyone would like to take a turn selling tickets at the show, please see Kathi or Craig. Don't forget that the prize for selling the most tickets is a smaller version of the opportunity quilt and there will be other prizes for selling tickets along the way. Save the Date postcards are available for the 2018 event and a search for locations is underway. Another planning meeting will be held on November 15, at noon at WAC. Members interested in participating are encouraged to attend.

December Block Exchange/Wilson: Patterns for "In from the Cold" are available on-line and at the meeting. **Bus Trip/Cohen:** The bus trip to Road2CA is Saturday January 20 and the cost will be \$20 cash or check only. The bus will depart from the Park and Ride on Verdugo in La Canada at 8:00 a.m. and will leave the show at 4:30 p.m.

Loving Hands/Curran: With the recent tragedies so close to home, we were pleased to be able to send quilts to 19 victims of the Las Vegas shooting that are currently working with a therapist. Three quilts were sent to a relative of Merylee Schaefer who lost everything in the Calistoga Fire. Donna Ryan is working with The Quilt Emporium to collect fat quarters and other supplies for victims of the Santa Rosa fire. Candy's has given us another generous donation of fabric. The next Loving Hands meets November 17 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at WAC.

Membership/Millman: There were 66 members and 3 guests attending. Rosters are available for pick-up. Thank you to Tim for preparing them.
