She loves teaching and sharing her quilts with others, she also continues to take classes from other instructors, thus staying current in the "how to" quilting department. In 2015, she completed the certification process to become a Quiltworx Certified Instructor.

Born and raised in California, Josephine and her husband decided to move to Riverton, Utah. In Utah, she has served as a board member of the state guild, newsletter editor, and coordinator of vendors and quilt show chair for the annual quilt show for many years. In 2016, she was voted as 2017 President-Elect of the State Guild, a step-up program to President. Having made more than 110 quilts in just the past 10 years, she was honored to be chosen as Artist in Residence for Empty Spools Seminars held at Asilomar in 2015, where she exhibited 40 quilts. She will be teaching at Empty Spools in 2017, and is very excited about that. Josephine was recommended to us by Guild member, Susan Edwards.

Quilters Division of Women's Athletic Club (WAC)

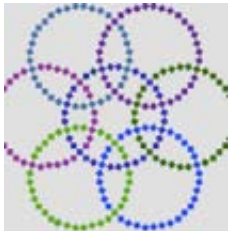

Block of the Month – February 2017

Lopsided Logcabin

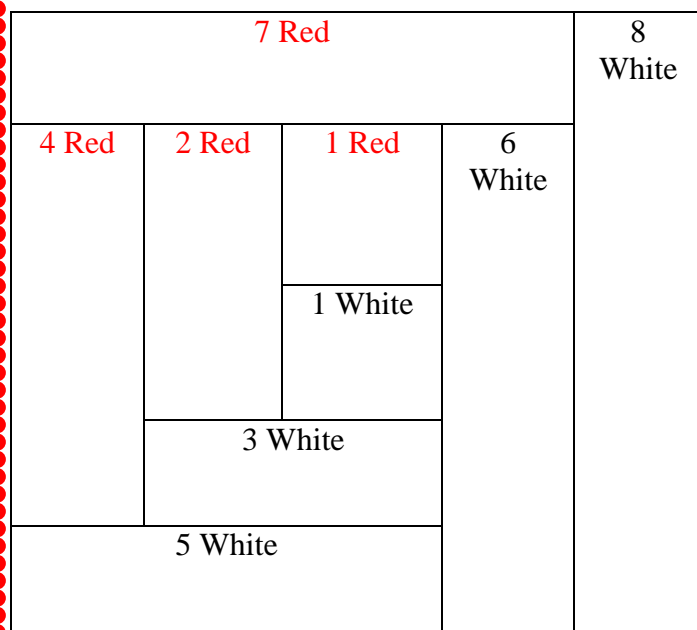

Fabric: a variety of reds and whites/white-on-white

Cutting: Cut the following sizes from a variety of red fabrics: 3"x 3", 3"x 5.5", 3"x 8", and 3"x 10.5". You will have four (4) strip sets of red fabric.

Cut the following sizes from a variety of white and white-on-white fabrics: 3"x 3", 3"x 5.5", 3"x 8", 3"x 10.5", and 3"x 13". You will have 5 strip sets of white or white-on-white fabric.

- Sew:**
1. Sew the red and white 3"x3" squares together. Press towards the red square. The piece now measures 3"x 5.5".
 2. Sew the red 3"x 5.5" rectangle to the left side (see diagram, note that the 3"x 3" red square is oriented to the top). Press outward towards the red side. It now measures 5.5" x 5.5".
 3. Sew the white 3"x 5.5" rectangle to the bottom. Press towards the white side. It now measures 5.5" x 8".
 4. Sew the red 3" x 8" rectangle to the left side. Press towards the red side. It now measures 8 x 8".
 5. Sew the white 3" x 8" rectangle to the bottom. Press towards the white side. It now measures 8"x 10.5".
 6. Sew the white 3" x 10.5" rectangle to the right side. Press towards white side. It now measures 10.5" x 10.5".
 7. Sew the red 3" x 10.5" rectangle to the top. Press towards the red side. It now measures 10.5" x 13".
 8. Finish sewing the white 3" x 13" rectangle to the right side. Press towards the white side. The final block now measures 13" x 13".

- I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Colleen Shier, President; Kathi Wilson, Vice President; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Mernie Meier, Communications Secretary; Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian; Cindy Abrams and An Burgess, Programs; Jackie Carlos, Workshops; Leanne Compean, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Newsletter; Tina Curran, Loving Hands; Sandy Bradfield, Advisor; and Craig Coleman, Equipment and Inventory.
- II. The **minutes** were approved as published in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Vice President/Wilson: The next SCCQG meeting is January 14 and the topic is finding speakers for guild meetings.

Treasurer/Fogel: The monthly reports for November (Exhibit A and B) were presented.

Communications Secretary/Meier: Donna Ryan took a bad fall. Thank you cards will be sent to Candy's for additional fabric donations. A meeting was held to discuss how best to handle the duties connected to electronic media.

Parliamentarian/Ryan: Time is approaching for a nominating committee to begin its work. Board members were asked to consider continuing for another term if they are eligible. A sign-up sheet has been available on the membership table at meetings per the Bylaws with no one volunteering so far.

Programs/Abrams: The program brochure will be handed out at the General Membership Meeting. Thanks to Kathy Fogel for putting the brochure together. December will be the grand prize drawing for Panelmania and the Nestle Choir.

Workshops/Carlos: Members will be encouraged to sign-up for workshops for the coming year.

Membership/Compean: The Roster and dues cards will be handed out at the General Membership Meeting. We currently have 132 members and 6 affiliates.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Filler articles submitted are appreciated and will be included when there is room.

Fundraising/Curran: The layout for the Convention Center is done and the opportunity quilt is 2/3 put together. Outstanding blocks are due by the December meeting in order to get the quilt to Sherryl Zurek for quilting in time for Road2CA. The next meeting will be January 26, 2017.

Loving Hands/Curran: A core group met prior to the regular Loving Hands Friday meeting to discuss ways to increase interest and production by redesigning the standard quilt kits. Several new, simple quilt patterns will be offered using jelly roll strips in addition to the traditional Loving Hands quilt kits. Participation in the Saturday Edition of Loving Hands was outstanding. 115 flannel receiving blankets were made for project Karibu. Quilt distribution for 2016 is projected to be over 500 quilts, not including the 115 receiving blankets. December Loving Hands will be a holiday party at Susan Edward's house as a means of thanking all those who took part in Loving Hands during 2016. A request has come in from a camp in Big Bear that hosts children from Gold Star families. We have committed to 25 quilts but there is a need for 125. The size needed is from 55"- 66" x 70"- 80". Plans were made for a marathon workshop was scheduled for January 31, 2017 from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. to work on the quilts. Members can come for all or part of the 12 hour workshop. The January Loving Hands day will be used to prepare the strips to be used in making the quilts.

Trips/Shier: We have a bus for Road2CA on Thursday, the day our quilt will be there. Sign-ups are underway.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. The rental agreement for the church has been signed and we are awaiting a copy of same.
2. 501(c)3 update – We received a copy of the original request and discovered that the Guild actually filed for 501(c)7 status. We have been advised that there should not be a problem filing for and receiving a change to 501(c)3 status. Colleen will pursue this matter.
3. The recently donated sewing machine has been listed on ebay thanks to Colleen and her son.

V. NEW BUSINESS

1. The \$500 donation budgeted to give to the Glendale Women's Athletic Club was approved with \$300 going towards the ongoing upkeep of the WAC facilities; \$100 to Montrose Search and Rescue; and \$100 going to Alexandria House, a facility for homeless kids.
2. June Block exchange – The board approved an idea for a Cutie Patutie Swim Suit block exchange to be held in conjunction with the June Pot Luck meeting.
3. Philanthropy – Kathi Wilson **moved** that we approve a donation of \$115 to accompany the 115 receiving blankets that were made for project Karibu to help with mailing costs. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

VI. The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

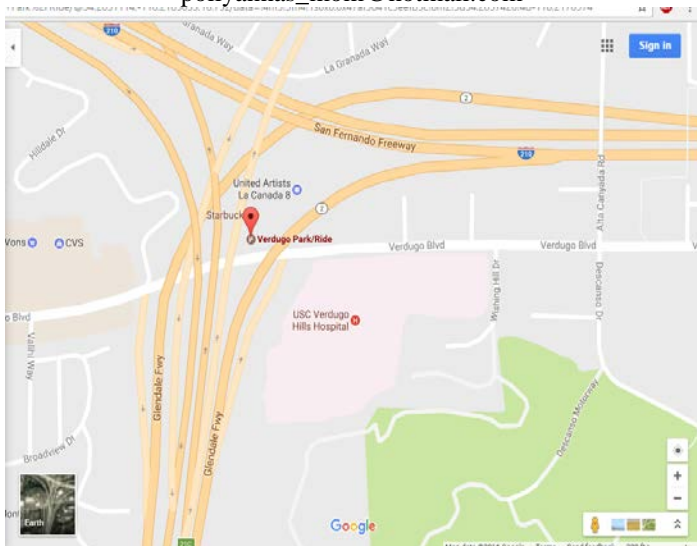
