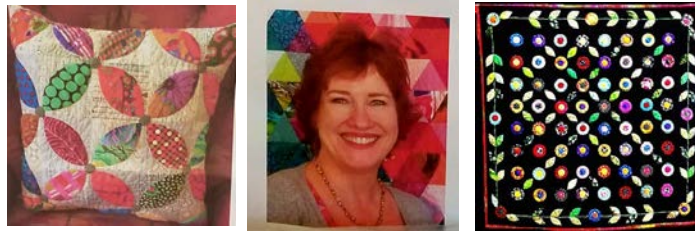

Becky McDaniel: My Quilting Journey



GQG is excited to welcome Becky McDaniel as our presenter during our July 12th General Meeting and as our Workshop teacher on July 15th. Becky, who specializes in both hand- and machine-appliqué techniques, states: "I have always loved quilts! When I was a little girl, I loved to pick out the squares and triangles in the quilts my great grandmother made and was amazed that she was able to figure out how to put all the shapes together so beautifully. I wonder if she ever thought about who would be enjoying her many quilts long after she was gone.... I took my first quilting class to make a sampler quilt in 1975 when I was 15. I didn't really do much quilting until I was married and wanted to decorate my house. When I set out to do a quilting project, I would find a pattern, buy the exact amount of fabric and then go to work. On one of these shopping trips to my local quilt shop, I overheard talk about a quilt show going on that day. I got the information and went to check it out. I was floored that there were that many women in the area who were interested in quilting too! I got the nerve up to go to a guild meeting, I felt that I had finally found my people! This was in 1999. Since then, my skill level and understanding of quilts has really taken off!"

Becky McDaniel's July 15 Workshop: "Orange Peel Pillow"

Machine Appliqué (with a foundation that puffs after washing)

Becky will be teaching a machine appliqué technique that will look like you did the appliqué by hand when you are finished with your project! Using a foundation paper on the inside of your appliqué, that when soaked will change to a puffed fiber we will construct a scrappy pillow. Because your appliqué fabric will be pre-washed and shrunk and the rest of your fabric will not, this will pull your stitches into your base fabric making the stitches disappear! Becky will have kits available for sale as well as the foundation paper to make the class easy to prepare for and easy to complete your project! Sign up today on Bookwhen or at the General Meeting.

In the June workshop, taught by Shawnee Miller, we learned how to make thread journals, got tips on using specialty threads in our sewing machines, and how to trouble shoot when the threads didn't work. 'Sew' much fun!

Where do all the donations go?

In May, Mary Sedgwick, a past guild member, gave our guild an extensive donation of fabric collected by her sister Frederica, who also used to be a member of our guild. Since our guild storage unit was at maximum capacity, Mary paid for a temporary storage unit to give us time to sort through this amazing collection, for our guild use, and to sell at the show.

In the past with most fabric donations we used the last in, first out method. Since newly arriving fabric was easily accessible, it would be used before fabric already in storage, causing the stored fabric to become buried. With that in mind, we now have a donation committee to handle all fabric and quilt related donations. We are going through the fabric and sorting it to bring the most benefit to the guild.

Our breakdown of fabric allocation is 1st Loving Hands; 2nd Door prizes, Workshop FQ promotions; and 3rd Fundraising - Opportunity Baskets, Show Boutique, etc. Quilt-related items, such as rulers, rotary cutters, mats, quilting notions etc. are allocated with the same priorities. Anything unsuitable for our guild use is donated to other organizations.

The current donation committee consists of myself, Tina Curran, Kathi Wilson, An Burgess, and Sharon Bishop.

Request for Baskets to be donated

One of the fundraising plans for our show is raffle baskets to take advantage of Mary's generous donation. We need about 20 baskets big enough to fill with fabric, notions etc. If you have a few spare baskets that would work and don't mind donating them, please bring them to the July meeting.

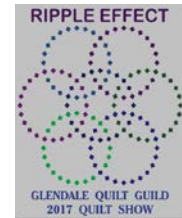
So, gather your sewing supplies and come on any Monday (9am-4pm) or Wednesday (9am-3pm). We always love new faces (and new ideas!)

2017 Quilt Show Ripple Effect!

September 22 and 23



“2 Months and Counting until Ripple Effect !!!”

It's hard to believe how quickly time is flying by! It will soon be Show Time and all the millions of details inherent to our Guild's Show will begin to fall into place. Until then, it's crunch time!

Now is the time to finish up your quilts. The entry deadline is **July 14th!**

Now is the time to reserve your classes. Don't wait until the last minute, or you might find yourself on a waiting list. Book now and be guaranteed a spot.

Now is the time to book your room at the Sheraton. Our room block and the discounted rate will disappear 3 weeks before the show. Don't wait to grab a friend & book your rooms. The best deal is the Retreat Package, which includes your room, admission and a class.

Now is the time to sign up to volunteer. Sign up early to have your choice of duty. Contact Sandy, Beth or Tina to volunteer to assist a Show Committee member with their areas for even more fun at the show. We need help with bus groups, vendor service, teacher assistance, to name a few.

Here is something important to consider while finishing up your quilts:

Binding - The Finished Edge to Your Quilt

Often, a Quilt Judge will note the following statement: “Binding techniques need improvement.” in their review of a quilt. This means the quilt would benefit from more attention to detail in the quilt's binding process. Remember, the binding is the finishing touch to your quilt.

A perfect binding should be 90 degrees at the corners, lie flat, be fully filled with fabric and batting and be stitched closed at the miter. Every judge is taught to pinch along the binding edge to test fullness and make sure basic binding standards are met. They also look for an equal amount of binding on the front and back of the quilt. The width of the binding and choice of a butted or mitered corner is always your choice, but in competition, it should appear balanced with the quilt's design. The binding should also be firmly attached, with regular stitches anchoring it to the quilt. It is quite common for a judge to run a fingernail along the finished edge to make sure no gaps are evident. For all these reasons, “Binding needs improvement.” is a very common response to be found in the judge's feedback.

If confused about binding techniques, attend a workshop, take a class, join a mini-group, or ask a friend at a GQG meeting to refer you to someone who can help you. One of the most valuable benefits of membership in our Guild is the wealth of skill, experience and willingness to share among our members. With practice, you will soon become a binding expert. Enter your quilt into the next show and pay attention to the Judge's feedback to continue to improve your quilting techniques.

Remember, access to a professional Judge is a valuable resource. We are fortunate to have a certified judge at our show. Be sure to take advantage of their expertise whenever possible and you will be amazed to find that your skills will improve following a show.

Call for Entries due on 8/1/2017 SCCQG 2018 Road to California Special Exhibit "Emerging Light"

Light has always been an inspiration. Artists over time have defined light in different ways.

* *"Look at light and admire its beauty. Close your eyes, and then look again: what you saw is no longer there; and what you will see later is not yet."*

Leonardo da Vinci

* **Emerge** is defined as rising up, coming forth from a place shut off from view or from concealment coming into sight and becoming noticed, as it comes into existence.

* **Light** is the natural agent that stimulates sight and makes things visible. When we think of light, we think of sunshine, candles, halos, fire, lighting, laser or neon light. Yet there are far more kinds of light whether natural or manmade. In the absence of light, there is darkness.

* The challenge is to create a quilt that illustrates the concept of "Emerging Light" in some form. Consider the possibility of light appearing within a traditional set of blocks, a modern composition, or an art statement. Any quilting technique from traditional block(s), appliqué patterns to modern modes, or mixed quilting techniques can be combined into the quilt.

At the June guild meeting, nine quilt tops were turned in all, created by Cathy McNassor! And 27 finished quilts were turned in (including the last seven camper quilts), completed by Homa Asef, Ann Bagne, Sharon Bishop, Joanne Brown, Lisa Burroughs, Craig Coleman, Kathy Fogel, Lou & Evette Gallo, Rasa Read, Donna Ryan, Alice Turner and Kathi Wilson. Additionally, three flannel receiving blankets were completed by Crystal Dudley.

Camper quilt update: at the June meeting, we handed over a total of 32 quilts to Laurie Landaker of the Seven Stars Foundation for kids of military personnel heading to her summer camp in Big Bear this July. It was great to hear her story and she was thrilled to receive our beautiful and generous gift. Thank you, thank you, thank you to ALL the guild members who had a hand in this very meaningful project.

As you may be aware, in January, we gave five quilts to a co-worker of Tim Spinn, Yvonne Morales, and her four teenagers. The family lost their home in a fire. An excerpt from her thank you note reads:

"...My children and I are adjusting to our new home, making the best of it and leaning on one another for emotional support in surviving the house fire. Both of my daughters are currently in therapy to assist them in dealing with our loss. By the way we each have our quilts on our beds, we love them! They are so beautiful! Thank you again for the kind gesture, we really appreciate them."

Also at the June meeting, we raised nearly \$150 from the raffle of the jelly rolls made from the novelty and graphic print fabrics we used in some of the camper quilts. That money will go to buying more batting for our future community gift quilts. Thank you to all who participated in the raffle.

As a sequel of sorts to our fun piecing marathon in January, from 9AM – 9PM on that day we're going to see how many Loving Hands quilts we can quilt up. EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING REPORT

Minutes of the Executive Board of the Glendale Quilt Guild June 8, 2017

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:35 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Colleen Shier, President; Kathi Wilson, Vice President; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Donna Ryan, Parliamentarian; Cindy Abrams and An Burgess, Programs; Jackie Carlos, Workshops and Susan Edwards incoming Workshops; Tim Spinn and Leanne Compean, Membership and Karen Millman, incoming Membership; Elke Myiahara, Newsletter; Beth Hasenauer, Fund Raising; and Craig Coleman, Equipment and Inventory.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD REPORTS

Vice President/Wilson: Checked on the layout for the coming meeting and spoke about the Guild fabric sale.

Incoming Vice President/Spinn : The next SCCQG meeting is July 8 in Santa Clarita and the topic is Bylaws and Standing Rules. Those interested in attending should email Tim in order to car pool.

Treasurer/Fogel: The Treasurer's Report for May was presented. A tentative Budget for the coming term was presented, discussed, and approved with some minor changes. Good job by Kathy and the Budget Committee.

Parliamentarian/Ryan: Installation of new officers will be at the June General Membership Meeting. Officers were asked to remain standing after installation for a group photo.

Programs/Abrams: A tentative schedule of Programs and Workshops for 2018 was presented. Arrangements have been made for a well-rounded array of speakers and workshops that should delight Guild members.

Workshops/Carlos: Sign-ups for upcoming workshops are filling up nicely. **Incoming Workshops/Edwards:** Purchasing design wall fabric and additional cutting mats to be used for workshops was discussed. We recently received a bolt of white flannel that can be used for the design walls. It was decided we purchase only one additional cutting mat. Cindy will assist Susan in purchasing the mat online using a coupon. Workshop attendees are to be encouraged to bring their cutting mats when needed.

Membership/Spinn: Membership records will be ready to hand over to the incoming Membership team.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Some newsletters were returned for postage due. In checking to see why, Elke was told by the USPS that the newsletter postage is actually \$.70 and we've just been lucky getting by with less. We will need to allow for the increase postage cost in the budget.

Fundraising/Hasenauer: Quilt entries began June 1 and run until July 14. Entry forms are available on line and at the June Guild meeting. Sandy will be available to take photos of quilt entries at the June meeting. Everyone is encouraged to make their hotel reservations and to sign-up for classes which are starting to book up. The committee is still working on vendors and they have recently gotten some good leads from the Montrose Craft Fair. In addition, the focus will be on advertising as well as buses and pre-sale tickets. The next Show Committee meeting is June 22.

Loving Hands/Shier: We will be presenting 30 camper quilts to Laurie Landaker of the Seven Stars Foundation at the Guild meeting. Also at that meeting there will be a raffle of jelly rolls. June 16 is the next Loving Hands day and we will be spray-basting tops and backs to prepare for quilting. **Currently we have 450 tops waiting to be quilted.** Members are encouraged to hold Thursday, August 31 from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. for another marathon event where the goal is to quilt as many tops as possible. Facilitators will help members who are not proficient in machine quilting learn machine quilting techniques.

Sunshine and Shadows/Shier: Long-time member Mary Bolas, has passed away. A motion was made to make a donation in Mary's name to her favorite charity. The motion was tabled to give time to check the minutes for precedence. Suzanne McGinnis of Project Linus, fell and injured her hand.

Electronic Media/Fogel: We need someone to take over our Facebook page. Let Kathy Fogel know if you are interested.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. WAC update: Thank you to Lou Gallo for making the quilt hangers and to Craig Coleman for mounting them at WAC.

2. Donation Committee: The committee was unable to meet and in the interim we received a huge donation. The donor paid for a U-haul and a temporary storage unit to house the enormous donation of fabric. Six members wrestled with removing, hauling and storing the fabric. Because we have reached critical mass, a **motion** was made that, due to storage constraints, at this time the Guild will temporarily cease accepting donations of fabric from private parties. Non-fabric donations will be considered on a case by case basis. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

V. NEW BUSINESS

1. 2018 Opportunity Quilt: Plans are underway for a fabulous quilt using dots. Members are encouraged to donate dot fabric to be used for the quilt and can stop by WAC on Wednesdays to help Kathi make it.

VI. The meeting was adjourned at 8: 40 p.m.

IV. **Installation of Officers/Ryan**: The officers for the 2017-2018 term were introduced, duly installed and then had their photo taken.

V. **Loving Hands Presentation/Curran** again introduced Laurie Landaker who spoke about founding the Seven Stars Foundation and its goal of sending children of fallen, wounded, or active and deployed military to Camp Whittle in Big Bear. The children get to spend a week enjoying outdoor activities and making new friends. This year they are sending 209 children from all across the United States to camp at a cost of about \$480 per child. On arrival, each child is given a quilt that they can then take home.

The Glendale Quilt Guild proudly presented 32 beautiful quilts to Laurie for the Seven Stars Foundation.

Upon investigation, we found out that we actually should have been paying \$.70 for the newsletters for some time now. Programs/Abrams: Upcoming programs were outlined with lots of wonderful speakers to look forward to.

Workshops/Carlos: Future workshops are filling up. Members were encouraged to sign up as soon as possible in order not to miss out.

Fund Raising 2017/Bradfield: The Quilt Show is just three months away. Quilt acquisition is underway.

Please contact Kathy Fogel to sign up for Volunteer positions. Members are encouraged to volunteer for more than just their required two hours of service. There are lots of positions to be filled. Forms for the Boutique are available from Kathi Wilson and Craig Coleman. Classes are filling up and so are hotel rooms.

Fund Raising 2018/Wilson: Work has begun on an Opportunity Quilt for 2018 using fabric with dots. Donations of dot fabric that can be used in the quilt are welcome. The goal is to have the 2018 Opportunity Quilt ready to debut at our Quilt Show in September.

Membership/Spinn: Renewals are due. Thanks to all who turned in their renewals tonight.

Loving Hands/Curran: We currently have a backlog of about 450 quilt tops that need quilting. Since we do not want to be in the business of quilt top storage, the next Loving Hands day will focus on basting quilt tops to prepare them for quilting. August 31 we will have another marathon event which will focus on machine quilting as many of the basted quilts as possible. Drawings were held for the fabulous fabric jelly rolls.

Donations/Shier: The Guild recently received a huge donation of fabric that has subsequently overwhelmed our usage and storage capabilities. Because of this the Guild is temporarily unable to accept any more private donations of fabric or unwanted sewing-related items. A committee has been established to determine how donations will be dealt with in the future.
