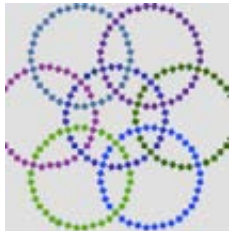
Quilters Division of Women's Athletic Club (WAC)

Tips and Tricks for Quilting

We learned two tips from Heidi Stegno's class that we want to share with you:

1. Winding the bobbin as tight as possible gives you more thread when you are sewing. The thread should feel so tight when you squeeze it in the bobbin that a ball could bounce off it. How do you get it that way if your sewing machine doesn't do that for you? By applying some pressure to the spinning thread spool. You can do this with your finger or an object that gives a bit of drag to the spool as the thread leaves it to wind around the bobbin.
2. Replacing your needle frequently will prevent major damage to your machine, your body (avoiding flying needle parts) and your quilt. A bent needle can also cause thread bunching, skipped stitches and lead to breakage. At the cost of about a dollar per needle, this is good cheap advice!

"Down by the Seashore" Block Exchange

A Guild Block Exchange for our June 14th, 2017 General Meeting

We need at least 9 participants for this to succeed, so please plan on joining the fun.

Here's how it works:

- Make 9 bathing suit blocks (your choice, 1 piece or 2 piece, or some of each).
- Save 1 of the 9 blocks for your quilt.
- Put 8 blocks in a zip lock bag with your name on the bag and bring it to the June 14th meeting.
- Turn in the bag **AS SOON AS YOU ARRIVE**.
- At the end of the meeting you will receive your bag back with 8 different Bathing Suit blocks.
- If you finish the quilt just like the pattern, it is 42" wide X 67" long...beach blanket size!

"Down by the Seashore" Block Construction:

1. Use scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam (scant just means 1-2 thread widths shy of $\frac{1}{4}$ ").
2. Please trim threads and press as you go.
3. Make your 9 bathing suits all the same or all different, whatever you want to do to use up your stash!
4. **Suits:** Please use bright prints (2 different per bathing suit).
5. **Background:** Please use white or white-on-white.
6. **Instructions:** just go to www.unitednotions.com/fp_sanibel.pdf and download the free pattern or find the pattern in our blasts.

The finished quilt will measure 42" by 67", a nice beach towel size.

If you don't have access to a computer we have a few copies available at guild meetings.

She considered herself a beginning quilter at that time, but since she did no quilting in London, she still considers herself a beginner. When back in Glendale, she joined Rita Streimer's quilting class and reconnected with our guild. Her favorite part of quilting is a technique which she attributes to being left-brained, but color and shade matching is a challenge (a right brain skill).

Members may have noticed Kate is accompanied by five-year old Roger who loves to attend the guild meetings (he also likes Rita Streimer's class and Kate's exercise class). Roger is fascinated with the words he hears at the meetings and asks Kate to write them down so he can remember them.
