

Here's how we made a profit of \$16,000 plus:

- The additional "goodies" sold at the event raised another \$5,690.

We are so grateful for the enthusiastic participation by the planning team, the helpers on site, and the participants. We have said many times: "It took a village (and two village idiots!)."

Website Coordinator Needed

Kathy Fogel has been the Guild's website coordinator since our web redesign. She has done a fantastic job, but now it is time to hand over the responsibilities to a new person in 2019.

The Website Coordinator is the go-between for the Guild and the Web Master, who makes all of the actual updates to the website. The duties to be performed include: Review the content of the GQG website on a regular basis to make sure that it is kept up to date, verify information with the appropriate Guild Chair and provide updates and corrections to the Web Master as needed. Manage the Calendar for activities for the Loving Hands and Event Chairs. Unless there is a time-sensitive change, updates, corrections and additions are combined into a monthly notification to the Web Master. At times, the site will need refreshing with new pictures, re-arrangement of pages, etc. Board members work directly with the Website Coordinator to ensure that the site information stays current.

"Holiday Taffy" Block Exchange

Make 12 blocks measuring $10\frac{1}{2}$ x $10\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Save one for yourself and put 11 in a baggie with your name on it. Turn the baggie in at the beginning of the December 12th Holiday Guild Meeting. At the end of the meeting you will receive your baggie back with 11 different taffy blocks... ready to make a quick Holiday Quilt.

Taffy pieces: Your choice of holiday colors and patterns


For each block cut: one $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center) and one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Taffy corners).

Background pieces: Use white or white-on-white. Please DO NOT use off white, beige, tan or another color. For each block cut:

- 1 square at $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for the Taffy corners), 2 squares at 2" (to 'snowball' the Taffy Center)
- 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (pieces around the Taffy Center)
- 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " (border strips)

To make each Block, follow the steps below and match the diagram:

1. Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on all pieces.
2. Use both $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (taffy and background) to make Half Square Triangles (HST) trimmed to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (the corners of the Taffy piece). You need 2. (See below for how to make HST.)
3. Use the two background 2" squares to "snowball" the opposite corners of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center). (See below for how to "snowball".)
4. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to each side of the Taffy Center.
5. Sew the Half Square Triangles (follow the diagram) to the end of each $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.
6. Sew each strip from step 4 to the top and bottom of the Taffy Center, aligning the corners carefully to the Taffy Center. See diagram below.
7. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the opposite sides of the Taffy Center.
8. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the other sides of the Taffy Center.
9. Square up the block to measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".



To make HST:

Put right sides together, draw a line diagonally across the back, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " down each side of the line, cut the pieces apart on the line. Iron seams to the dark side, or iron them open if you wish.

To "snowball":

Put right sides together with small squares in opposite corners of the large square. Draw a diagonal line across the small square from edge to edge. Sew along the line and fold white fabric out and Taffy fabric towards Taffy Center. Trim excess fabric if you wish.

MINUTES OF THE GLENDALE QUILT GUILD EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 8, 2018

I. The **meeting** was called to order by President Spinn at 6:35 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Tim Spinn, President; Sharon Bishop, Parliamentarian; Mary Jamora, Treasurer; Nancy Turney, Workshops; Jean Giacomelli & Alice Smith, Programs; Karen Millman, Membership; Craig Coleman, 2018 Fund Raising; Rasa Read, 2019 Fund Raising; Cindy Abrams & An Burgess, Loving Hands; and Colleen Shier, Advisor.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

President/Spinn: An update of the search for a meeting facility was given. After due discussion and consideration of the many venues that were explored, The First United Methodist Church of Glendale seems to be the best fit. A **motion** was made to approve the selection. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. We will begin meeting there in January of 2019.

Treasurer/Jamora: The October Treasurer's Report was presented. The Audit Committee should meet soon.

Sunshine and Shadows/Spinn: Marie Watterlond will undergo surgery for a kidney stone. Sadly, the husband of Mary Kaye Bussalacchi and father of Kim Smith, passed away.

Workshops/Nancy Turney: The list of workshops for 2019 and suggested prices for participating were outlined with regular workshops costing \$40 and open sew which includes lunch \$20, the September workshop \$25 and the November workshop benefitting Loving Hands would be free. A **motion** was made to approve the workshop costs as presented. The motion was seconded and passed.

Programs/Smith: A discussion took place regarding the December meeting and whether to have entertainment and/or a pot luck. It was decided that since the summer pot luck was so well received, we would have a pot luck of finger foods, but would not have entertainment in order to allow the members time to socialize.

Fund Raising 2018/Coleman: The Opportunity Quilt was very popular and made \$6,234.28. The Home Tour and Luncheon Netted \$4,366.37 with additional income from: donations (\$130), pots and plants (\$104), silent auction (\$981), quilt sale (\$1,420), centerpieces (\$784), and raffle baskets (\$2,190) for a total of \$5,609. Grand Total Combined Net Income of \$16,137. Kathi and Craig are to be congratulated for an outstanding event that was well received and made a lot of money.

Fund Raising 2019/Read: The 2019 Opportunity quilt will be ready for its debut on Saturday at Road2CA in January. White gloves have already signed up. The next meeting will be November 29, at 6:30 p.m. at WAC.

Loving Hands/Abrams: Things are going well with lots of quilts that need labels before distribution ahead of the holidays.

Block of the Month/Spinn: Kathi Wilson will conduct a 2 month challenge followed by a 9 month Block of the Month conducted by Tina Curran.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- **Stitches SoCal 2018** – Thanks to some great GQG team work under Tim's leadership and the donation of a stunning raffle quilt from Tim, our participation was well received and we made \$636 (raffle ticket sales \$476, quilt sales \$150, and a \$10 donation). Thanks to Susan Edwards for her hexie demonstration. That demonstration and our Challenge quilt display were big hits. The organizers of the event are looking forward to our participation next year.
- Since no one has stepped up to head a committee to interact with the Glendale Library we will drop that idea.

V. The meeting **adjourned** at 8:10 p.m.

SAPPHIRE CELEBRATION: CELEBRATING 45 YEARS

Get ready to make a blue and white quilt for the 45th anniversary of the International Quilt Festival in 2019.

- Entries may be Traditional, Modern, or Art
- Entries must have been made between 1974 and 2019
- The minimum size is 50" x 50"
- You may enter up to five quilts.

The quilts will be kept for three years from August 2019 to August 2022.

IMPORTANT DATES:

December 1, 2018 - Entry forms go live
February 18, 2019 - Deadline for entries
