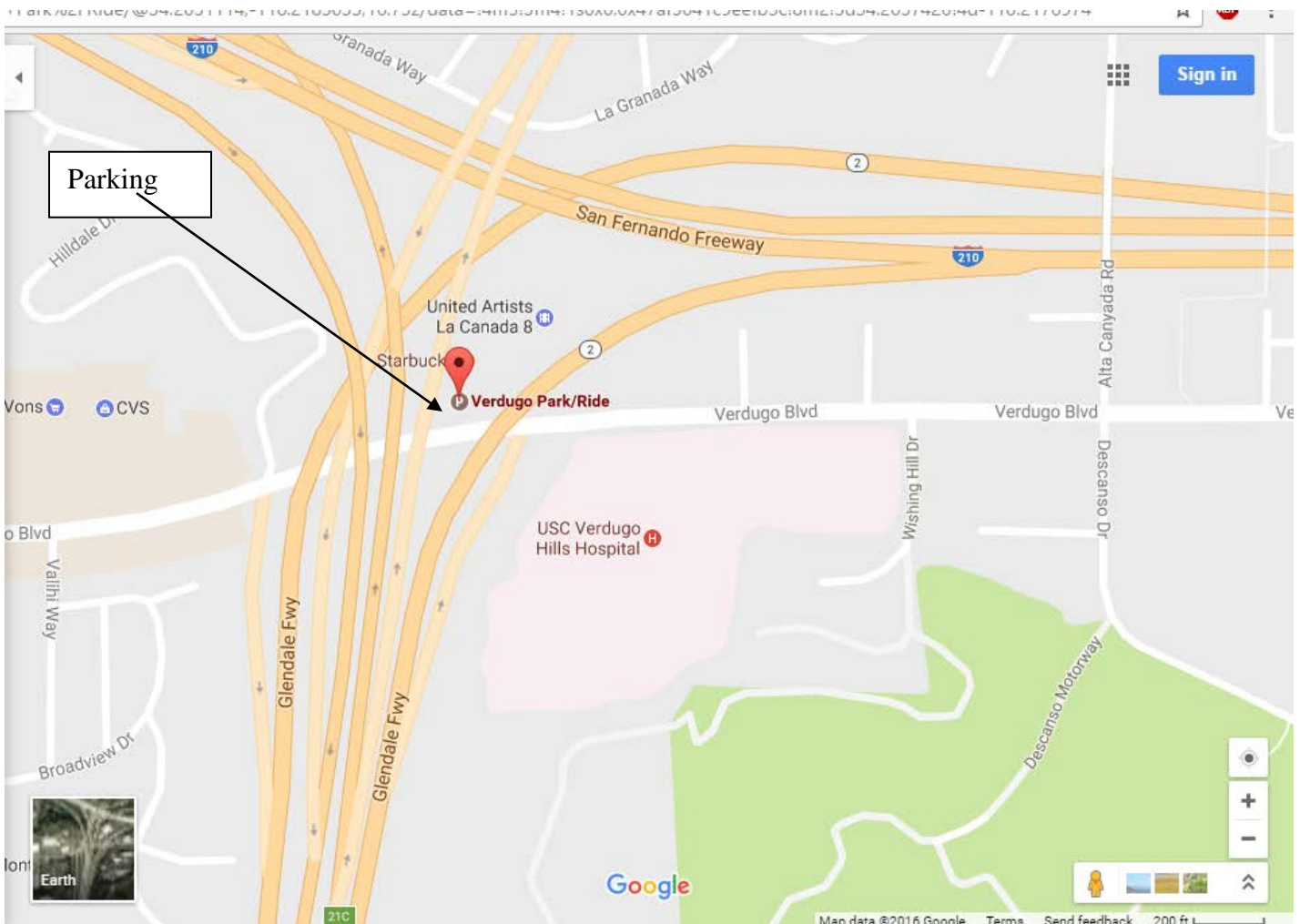

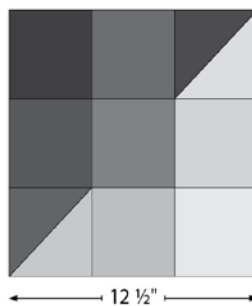

### Perkiomen Valley Block

Thomas Fire Relief Quilts

Thank you for joining us to give comfort to those who have endured the Thomas Fire.



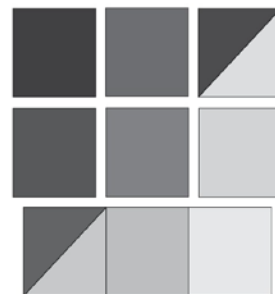
7 - 4 1/2" Squares  
4 Dark  
3 Light

4 - 5" Squares  
2 Dark  
2 Light

Draw a diagonal line on the back of both of the 5" light squares.

Place 1 of the light square on a 5" dark square, right sides together, and sew a scant 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn line.

Cut on drawn line for to create 2 half-square triangles, measuring 4 1/2". Repeat with other set. You will end up with 4 half-square triangles (you only need 2, so you will have enough to make another block.)



Sew pieces together as illustrated using 1/4" seam allowance.

### Loving Hands Activities

At the December guild meeting, understandably a slow night for the Loving Hands table, Cathy McNassor turned in five quilt tops. Also turned in were 12 finished quilts. They were completed by Leah Bessey, Joliene Blanchard, Joanne Brown and Tim Spinn.

December is a month when we distribute a large share of the quilts we've made over the year and total up what we've donated. In 2017, we donated a total of 570 quilts plus another 14 flannel receiving blankets.

As part of Colleen's effort to reevaluate the guild's charitable status, we were asked to document the last few years of Loving Hands donations. All totaled up, in the last five years (2013-2017), as a guild we have donated 2,524 items – that's 2,395 quilts and 129 flannel receiving blankets. How impressive is that? We should all be very pleased with the difference we are making.

Remember that Loving Hands now meets the third Friday of the month. So in January, the regular work session will be on Friday, January 19<sup>th</sup> at the WAC from 10 am – 3 pm. We hope to see you on the 19<sup>th</sup>!

# OH MY STARS!!

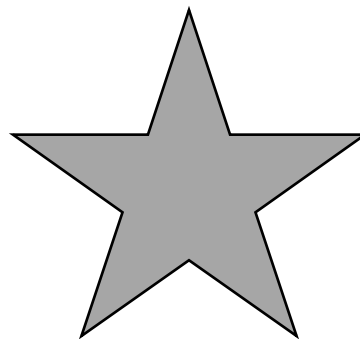
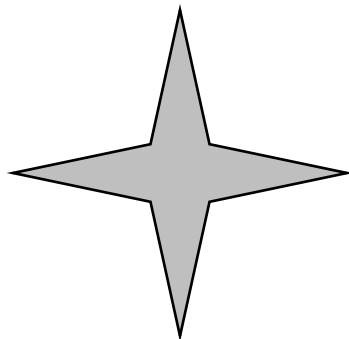
At the January 2018 Guild meeting, we will be introducing the 2018 Block of the Month, starting with the first of 9 months of beautiful star quilt blocks.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. BOARD REPORTS

**Vice President/Spinn:** The next SCCQG meeting will be January 6, 2018 and the topic will be getting and keeping new members. April 14 will be Meet the Teachers. Tim will provide a synopsis of the meetings to be shared with members. A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the seating arrangements for Guild meetings at the new venue.

**Treasurer/Fogel:** The Treasurer's Report for November was presented. We have one member who has agreed to be on the Audit Committee and we need two more. The President will contact the suggested members.

**Parliamentarian/Shier:** Donna Ryan has resigned as Parliamentarian, effective immediately, because she will be unable to get to Guild meetings held at the new location. Suggested members will be contacted to fill the vacant position. A Nominating Committee needs to be elected at the January meeting.

**Programs/Abrams:** Programs are set and no contract changes are necessary since we will still be meeting on the second Wednesdays.

**Workshops/Edwards:** Workshops are set and Susan is trying to get a handle on using BookWhen.

**Membership/Millman:** The Roster is out and the Membership team would like to do a bookmark as soon as feasible.

**Newsletter/Miyahara:** There was a problem with the Post Office regarding the November Newsletter and we are not sure if members received them late or not at all. Elke has found another Post Office where the mail goes out promptly and will use it for future mailings. She asked for articles on Workshops along with some photos to try to generate more interest in workshops.

**Fund Raising 2018/ Wilson:** The La Crescenta Women's Club has been contracted for the luncheon part of the "Under the Big Top" Fund Raising event.

**Loving Hands/Curran:** Quilts were delivered to San Diego and the Alzheimer Study program. We are currently on track to end the year with 500+ quilts having been donated. We received another generous donation from Candy's.

**Electronic Media – Email Blast/ Shier** Keep photos coming. **Website/Fogel:** The website is currently undergoing updating. **Facebook/Fogel:** Beth Hasenauer will be doing Facebook.

**Trips/Shier:** Forms are available and the cost is \$20 and Flo Cohen is in charge. The bus will leave from the La Canada Park and Ride at 8 am with an additional pick-up in Glendora.

### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

**501c(3)/Shier:** Progress is being made on submitting our request for a change in status.

**Library/Bookcase/Shier:** After a discussion on what to do about the Library, Board Members were asked to come to the next meeting with suggestions on what to do with the Guild Library.

**2019 Fund Raising – Quilt Show or Not?/Curran:** A synopsis of the recent meeting on whether or not to have a quilt show in 2019 is available to members. Tina gave a brief explanation. Basically, while the meeting was favorable to having a quilt show on some level, without leadership to undertake a show no matter how big or small, there can be no show. Members were asked to think about stepping up to take charge of a show for 2019. The biggest issue is that a decision must be made ASAP and at the latest by February.

### V. NEW BUSINESS

**Dinner with the Speaker before meetings** – Cindy said it has been her experience that guest speakers are more interested in getting to the meeting venue in order to get set up rather than in having dinner beforehand. It was agreed that Cindy ask each speaker what they would prefer and offer to pick up something for them before the meeting.

**Future Meeting Time** – Colleen suggested a change to 6:30 p.m. for the General Membership meetings in order to get through the business meeting and thereby give members a bit more time to socialize. Board members were in agreement to change the meeting time to 6:30 p.m. beginning January 10, 2018.
