Program: **Challenge Yourself** and Workshop: **Walking Foot Wow**

Mel Beach is a San Jose, CA based quilt artist, teacher and lecturer, who breaks away from tradition by adding her own modern, beautifully textured and colorful twists. She loves stretching her creativity through her completion of 60+ quilt challenges at the local and international level. Her quilt challenge entries draw upon her inquisitive nature of asking "What If?", working in a series, comedy improv studies along with her love of nature, photography and sketching.

Mel is a Featured Artist on The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims (episode 2112). Many of her challenge quilts have been exhibited locally, juried into national quilt shows and traveling exhibits, published in books/magazines, earned awards/ribbons and selected as Finalists. Her most recent exhibited quilts include: "Spinning Stars" - 3rd Place in 2017 Pacific International Quilt Festival Modern Quilt Competition, "Technicolor Trellis" -2017 Hoffman Challenge Travel Collection, "Van Gogh's Blues & Hues"-Cherrywood Van Gogh Dutch Exhibit, "RE\$!\$TANøE"-Threads of Resistance Travelling Exhibit, "Peace of Mind"-2nd Place Ribbon in Modern Quilts-Small at 2017 California State Fair, "Thunderstruck"-Finalist in 2017 Riley Blake Creative Rockstar Fabric Challenge, "Lime Light, Star Bright"-Modern Quilt Guild's QuiltCon 2017/Michael Miller Lux Fabric Challenge, "Always Follow Your Heart" - 3rd Place Ribbon in Modern Quilts-Small at 2017 California State Fair and Mancuso's New Modern Quilt Competition. Who knew that Tyvek (the stuff they make white priority mail envelopes out of) could be painted and blasted with a heat gun to create leaves? Using white puff paint, letting it dry, then giving it the heat from the heat gun became a dimensional tree on our projects. There were unique techniques that you may be seeing in future quilts.

As we often say, take advantage of the many opportunities our guild offers to get to know your fellow quilters. Show up for Loving Hands, volunteer for helping with the opportunity quilt or sewing room tour, take workshops, check out Monday or Wednesday Sew at WAC (not a guild activity, per se, but run by guild members). We are all very appreciative of those on our board who keep our guild running, but sometimes forget these positions take a lot of work behind the scenes. 


OH MY STARS! - May 2018 - Diamond Star



Cutting Directions:

All blocks this year use a 1/4 inch seam allowance and will be the same size: 12 1/2 x 12 1/2 unfinished.

From fabric provided with pattern:

C Fabric: Cut one (1) 7 1/4" square, cut twice on the diagonal for 4 pieces

From coordinating fabric:

D Fabric: Cut Four (4) 3 7/8" squares, cut each once on the diagonal for 8 pieces

B Fabric: Cut four (4) 3 7/8" squares, cut each once on the diagonal for 8 pieces


From Background fabric:

A Fabric: Cut four (4) 3 1/2" squares (corner squares)


Sewing Directions: (refer to diagram on upper left)

- Sew 4 "B" pieces to 4 "D" pieces, then sew together to make the center square of the block (you can also have created Half Square Triangles for these)
- Sew a "B" and a "D" to a "C", being careful to follow the diagram. Repeat for 4 rectangles (Flying Geese)
- Sew an "A" piece to each side of two Flying Geese for the top and bottom rows
- Sew a Flying Geese piece to each side of the center square created by the B/D pieces.
- Sew 3 rows as noted in the diagram

MINUTES OF THE GLENDALE QUILT GUILD EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING APRIL 5, 2018

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

President/Shier: The June Board meeting will combine the in-coming and out-going board members. Please give updates to procedures to Kathy Fogel for the website and bring updated Procedure Books to the June Board meeting to hand over to the incoming officers.

Vice President/Spinn: The April meeting set-up will have more tables. For the May set-up we will change to the Audio-Visual set-up using rows of seats facing the screen. In addition to being very influential during the early years of our Guild she was also a founder of Designing Ladies, a wearable arts group that worked closely with the Guild and put on the Breakfast in Burbank Fashion Show at our Quilt Shows when they were at the Burbank Hilton/Marriott.

Parliamentarian/Compean: The following slate of officers for the coming year was approved for recommendation to the Guild: President, Tim Spinn; Vice President, Crystal Dudley; Recording Secretary, Beth Hasenauer; Communications Secretary, Ellen Gray; Parliamentarian, Sharon Bishop; Programs and Workshops, Flo Cohen, Jean Giacomelli, Alice Smith and Nancy Turney; Membership, Karen Millman and Pat Golditch; Newsletter, Elke Miyahara; Fund Raising 2018, Kathi Wilson and Craig Coleman; Fund Raising 2019, Rasa Read; Loving Hands, Cindy Abrams, An Burgess and Susan Edwards. A motion was made to allow Elke Miyahara an additional year as Newsletter Chair. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Programs/Abrams: Upcoming programs are set.

Workshops/Edwards: A recap of sign-ups for future workshops is looking very good. Since we anticipate a large number of attendees for the Border workshop in November due to the Block of the Month vouchers, members will need to sign-up and pay for the workshop by the September meeting.

Membership/Millman: Preparation for renewals is beginning with updating the membership form. The New Member's Luncheon is set for May 19 at 11:30 at WAC and the 20 new members will be invited.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Postage has gone up again along with the cost of printing. Elke will check on the cost of printing the Roster. It was suggested that to keep costs down, members be given a choice of receiving a hard copy of the Roster or accessing it on the website. Members can indicate their preference on the membership renewal form.

Fund Raising 2018/Wilson: The Opportunity Quilt was well received at the Wisteria Festival raising a whopping \$482. In addition, Kathi was able to promote the Guild and our philanthropic endeavors. Approximately one third of the tickets for the Under the Big Top event have been sold. Workshops will be held May 2 and May 24 at WAC. The next meeting will be April 10 at WAC at noon.

Fund Raising 2019/Shier: The President and Vice President are to meet with Rasa for some pre-planning.

Loving Hands/Curran: With the Board's approval, two lovely quilt tops donated by Doralee Dohnel will be raffled at the May meeting. Three finished camper quilts have already been turned in along with many completed blocks. Since there are no more block kits to assemble, the next Loving Hands day is April 20 and will focus on assembling and quilting camper quilts. The camper quilts will be handed out at the June meeting. Thanks to Candy's generosity we received more fabulous fabric.

Audit Committee/Jamora: The Audit report for the previous fiscal year was presented and everything is in order.
