Looking at a Quilt from Both Sides Presenter: Lujean Seagal



Lujean studied textile design at Long Beach State University. In the early 70's she completed her B.A. in Fine Arts. Early years were devoted to creative weaving and graphic design and then she migrated towards Quilting. She has a California Teaching Credential in Textiles and Art for Adult Education. She has been teaching, lecturing and doing workshops for the past 25 years. She has done lectures and workshops at over 100 different guilds.

She will be presenting the lecture "Looking at a Quilt from Both Sides". This information packed lecture provides an in-depth look at quilts. From front to back; Viewing quilts with an artist's eye you can learn practical tips for color, fabric selection and design. She will discuss where inspiration comes from with details of piecing, choice of backing and quilting design. There will be a question and answer period after the lecture.

Several years ago she presented the lecture "Beyond Boring Borders". It was very well received and on Saturday November 17 she will be presenting the accompanying workshop.

You won't want to miss either her lecture or her workshop because they both deal with making any quilt you make more interesting and she is a very engaging teacher!

BEYOND BORING BORDERS WORKSHOP - Saturday, November 17, 2018 at WAC

Each student will use a unique 36 page Border Notebook to review hundreds of border ideas and techniques. Samples of the borders will be made to provide for understanding the various techniques. Students are encouraged to bring unfinished quilt tops in need of a border to discuss and employ some of these various options.

As I announced at the meeting, the Goodwill Enrichment Center has raised our rent for the monthly meeting to \$657.00. This means that we will need to relocate again to a different facility. We have contracts through the December meeting, so need to identify a new location by the January meeting. We need everyone's help to find a suitable space. The Board members are actively looking, but with over 100 members strong in our guild, we need everyone to think about it and help. Our criteria are as follows: Meetings on the 2nd Wednesday of the month, Time frame: 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm, Cost: \$200.00 or less per month, Size: Accommodate 50 to 100 members. Parking for all. I know that together we can accomplish great things!

By the time this goes to print we will have finished our 2018 fundraiser, Under the Big Top. I have to give huge thanks to Kathi Wilson and Craig Coleman for leading us on this journey. I also must give thanks to all of the volunteers from the guild who made it happen. A special thank you to the members who opened their homes for us! More in the next newsletter.

This month we have Lujean Seagal with us and I know it will be a fantastic meeting and workshop. I was amazed at the variety of quilt tops produced by the Block of the Month participants! It will be fun to see what amazing borders they are inspired to create when taking Lujean Seagal's workshop, Beyond Boring Borders.

October's results are in: 51 completed quilts for LHs. Brilliant! They were finished by 33 different LHs volunteers participating in various stages of making quilts: at home and at our monthly workshop. Kate Ung blasted through the stratosphere with 26 completed quilts! She was inspired by the workshop with Mel Beach in March. My apology if I missed anyone. (Please let me know.)

There was an outstanding return of flannel receiving blankets over the past two months. More came in than kits that went out. Thank you to those who were pulling from their own stash and using LHs fabric to complete 52 flannel blankets. Thirty-six are on their way to Kenya for Project Karibu (a prenatal/postnatal medical care birthing center. The new mothers receive a small layette wrapped up in our receiving blankets. (Perfect, because plastic bags have been completely banned in Kenya.) The other 16 will soon be going to local hospitals.

Kits containing fabric to make a quilt top, or a whole quilt will be at the table again this month. We will also have a number of spray basted quilt sandwiches for machine quilting. It does not have to be fancy or detailed. Just nicely finished as best as you can is good. A great way to practice and you are finished in an hour or two. Not into binding? No problem, because we have a number of volunteers who LOVE binding.

The 3rd Annual Taco Friday evening sew was fun, too. Seventeen volunteers shared fabric and food. The tacos were great. The deserts even better. What a great chance to learn, sew and enjoy each others' company.

The November LHs workshop will take place on November 16 from 10AM to 3PM. Lots for everyone to do and everyone is welcome. Stop by the LHs table at our General Meeting to see how you can be involved.

Rustic Sun Workshop Review

The second-to-last Guild-sponsored workshop was held on Saturday, October 13th at the Women's Athletic Club. Our presenter was Jean Impey from San Juan Capistrano, who taught us to make a Rustic Sun block. Rustic Sun is Jean's own invention.

In the morning, participants learned how to draw their own version of the block which relied on paper piecing, flip-&-sew, and curved stitching techniques. One of the best things about the workshop was the fact that Jean showed how to do the project in the most structured and precise way and then how to do tackle the same block in a freer, less structured way with terrific results no matter which way you chose.

In the afternoon Jean showed how to embellish the block with both machine and hand stitching and even showed how to use a long machine stitch to set up a template for hand stitching.

Website Coordinator Needed

Kathy Fogel has been the Guild's website coordinator since our web redesign. She has done a fantastic job, but now it is time to hand over the responsibilities to a new person in 2019.

"Holiday Taffy" Block Exchange

Make 12 blocks measuring $10\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Save one for yourself and put 11 in a baggie with your name on it. Turn the baggie in at the beginning of the December 12th Holiday Guild Meeting. At the end of the meeting you will receive your baggie back with 11 different taffy blocks... ready to make a quick Holiday Quilt.

Taffy pieces: Your choice of holiday colors and patterns


For each block cut: one $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center) and one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Taffy corners).

Background pieces: Use white or white-on-white. Please DO NOT use off white, beige, tan or another color. For each block cut:

- 1 square at $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for the Taffy corners), 2 squares at 2" (to 'snowball' the Taffy Center)
- 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (pieces around the Taffy Center)
- 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " (border strips)

To make each Block, follow the steps below and match the diagram:

1. Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on all pieces.
2. Use both $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (taffy and background) to make Half Square Triangles (HST) trimmed to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (the corners of the Taffy piece). You need 2. (See below for how to make HST.)
3. Use the two background 2" squares to "snowball" the opposite corners of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center). (See below for how to "snowball".)
4. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to each side of the Taffy Center.
5. Sew the Half Square Triangles (follow the diagram) to the end of each $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.
6. Sew each strip from step 4 to the top and bottom of the Taffy Center, aligning the corners carefully to the Taffy Center. See diagram below.
7. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the opposite sides of the Taffy Center.
8. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the other sides of the Taffy Center.
9. Square up the block to measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".



To make HST:

Put right sides together, draw a line diagonally across the back, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " down each side of the line, cut the pieces apart on the line. Iron seams to the dark side, or iron them open if you wish.

To "snowball":

Put right sides together with small squares in opposite corners of the large square. Draw a diagonal line across the small square from edge to edge. Sew along the line and fold white fabric out and Taffy fabric towards Taffy Center. Trim excess fabric if you wish.

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:34 pm by President T. Spinn at the Glendale Woman's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. **PRESENT:** Tim Spinn-President; Crystal Dudley-Vice President; Mary Jamora-Treasurer; Ellen Gray-Communications Secretary ; Sharon Bishop-Parliamentarian; Flo Cohen and Nancy Turney- Workshops; Pat Golditch and Karen Millman-Membership; Elke Miyahara-Newsletter; Kathi Wilson -Fundraising 2018; Cindy Abrams, An Burgess and Susan Edwards-Loving Hands; Colleen Shier-Advisor. **NOT PRESENT:** Jean Giacomelli and Alice Smith-Programs; Rasa Reed-Fundraising 2019.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. **BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS**

President/Spinn: Goodwill is raising room rental rates to \$300.00/meeting with associated fees for security and custodial duties the new rate will be \$657.00/meeting. We have signed contracts for the months of October – December 2018 at our current rate of \$234.35. We need to find a new meeting place starting January 2019.

Vice President/Dudley: Next SCCQG meeting is in Lakewood on Saturday October 13. Topic: Philanthropy.

Treasurer/Jamora: Presented Income/Expense for September 2018 and YTD totals.

Communications Secretary/Gray: Harriet Sartinski has passed away. Jackie Carlos and Ellen Gray saw Joni Kellam at a Missouri Star Company event. Beth Hasenauer, Nancy Turney, Karen Millman's Husband and Tim's husband Randy are all in various states of recovery and progressing through physical therapy.

Workshops/Cohen: With pending location change contracts for 2019 speakers need to be re-written and signed. A suggestion was made to include contract language concerning location changes so the Guild is covered and can proceed with getting these contracts executed. There is no current program or workshop scheduled for 11/2019 and it was suggested to leave this month unscheduled for now. 2019 Program Brochure will be printed in time for display at the Stitches event @ Pasadena Convention Center in November.

Membership/Millman: Tim assisted with database revision for printing of next roster. Non-renewals and past-presidents who didn't respond to requests to update their information are being taken off the active members database. Membership total is approximately 117. Tim is working on the final revisions to the Roster so get him any additions/corrections ASAP.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Submission deadline Oct 16. November newsletter may be late as Elke will be away.

Fundraising 2018/Wilson: All available tickets to the event have been sold! Current projected profit resulting from the sale of event tickets and Opportunity Quilt tickets is approximately \$10,000. (6k from Quilt, 4k from event tickets) On the day of event there will be 5 additional income streams that will add to our overall total. Final prep meeting is Wednesday 10/17 @ 9 am. Preview and pre-sale of tickets for October Event Raffle baskets will be available to guild members at October meeting. \$20.00 will buy 40 tickets. Members will be able to use credit cards to buy tickets at this meeting. Post Event wrap-up will be held Wednesday 10/24 @ noon at WAC. A guild Kathi visited with a total of 300 members raised 16K on an opportunity quilt. Members are required to buy 30.00 tickets and take the Quilt someplace to display.

Fundraising 2019/Read: not present. Rasa has donated a completed quilt top to be used as the 2019 Opportunity quilt. There is a Fundraising sew-in on Saturday October 27 at WAC to construct the quilt back that will allow for guild member participation in quilt construction. Brandi Nalley will do the quilting and Tina Curran is photographing the quilt top to have postcards made and available for the November Stitches event. An application has been submitted to Road2Ca to display the Opportunity quilt at 2019 show.

Loving Hands/Abrams: 45 finished quilts and 26 receiving blankets turned in. Current inventory is 98 quilts and 10 receiving blankets. Thirty six receiving blankets went to Microclinic 2020/Project Karibu. Taco Friday 10/5 @ WAC from 4pm – 9pm 21 participants expected. LH will sell Xmas fabric at October meeting as a tie in to the Christmas block exchange starting this month. Noted that people making receiving blankets for LH are different from the people making quilts, so this is not taking away from the LH quilters. Next LH workshop is October 26 10am – 8:30pm.

Audit Committee/Spinn: Has obtained a third member for the committee.

Email Blast/Spinn: Email blast up to 3/month. Timelines: Newsletter, before General mtg. Before LH or other event. Get Tim any information before either of these deadlines.

Electronic Media/Hasenauer: would like to formalize a group of members who take pictures of guild events that can be included on Facebook, in the newsletter and via email blast. A suggestion was made about posting an email blast of meeting pictures to guild members showing them what they missed in attempts to boost participation and interest in guild activities.

Trips/Cohen: Pending date for Opportunity Quilt display at Road2Ca so bus can be arranged.

Printing/Spinn: Obtaining 2 quotes for printing the roster. Not for this year but was suggested we consider in the future having a small photo of each member beside their name in the Roster.

501(c)(3) update/Shier. It will be 180 days to hear on the 501 c 3 application, so this will be in November.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Location Search 2019/Board discussion

Restart with location list that was compiled for last location search. Focus first on places that had been pending at the end of that search. Issues that need to be revisited with this search:

1. Changing our meeting day from Wednesday. There are more options available to us on Thursday. The guild would need to change the by-laws and previous consensus was to keep the meeting day as Wednesday.
2. Adequate parking is a concern and Guild members to carpool if necessary.
3. It was noted that speakers cost is \$300 at a minimum and if we are also paying \$300/meeting for a venue; this becomes an expensive undertaking for an evening that the Guild cannot afford for long.
4. Should we be thinking outside the box and consider having a day meeting in addition to an evening meeting.
5. Need to take a long term view as we do not want to be changing locations again in 2020-perhaps this means making some compromises in terms of space/parking/timing of our meetings and going with a place where we have some standing (ie: WAC clubhouse or Temple Sinai of Glendale). Flo will reserve the Temple for us for January 2019 so we have a back-up. Challenges with using the Temple space on Wednesday evenings as we cannot gain entry to the space and parking lot until after 6pm. May need to consider changing meeting start time. Parking lot has 45 spaces Limited street parking. WAC clubhouse would need carpooling to accommodate parking. Street parking is a challenge. Space utilization for our usual set up must be carefully considered for the room size.

Other venues to research: First Baptist Church of La Crescenta, Glen Arden club (old Moose Lodge) at Pacific and Central: Big parking lot across the street/Central location. Need to check price range.

Tim to bring up issue at the general meeting and will form a Committee to do the location search.

With Board approval, Cindy Abrams will try to contact the Goodwill Regional Director to plead our case explaining what we are doing in the building and the good we do in the community.
