I can't believe it is September already! I grew up in Oregon, so September brings memories of back to school days, the first inklings that Autumn is on the way with cooler, crisp nights, and looking forward to a trip to Hood River to get apples fresh from the trees. Here in California there are similar, more subtle signs that Fall is headed our way. I had to throw an extra quilt on the bed, "just in case" it is needed. Would it have achieved the level of fame and devotion, without knowing who made it?

Do you label your quilts? As we have seen from many speakers, a label can be fancy, simple, long or short, as long as it identifies the maker. Identification is important as quilts change hands over time. I haven't always added a label, but improved in the last five years. One of these days, when I am long gone, will someone look at that quilt and the label and wonder about me and who I was? I hope so!!

I look forward to all of the October happenings with our Guild. First up on October 5th we have Taco Day with Loving Hands from 4:00pm to 9:00pm. This evening event gives all of our members the chance to get together to sew in the evening for Loving Hands. It will be a fun time spent with old and new friends.

We have Jane Impey as a speaker at the General meeting, plus the class to make her "Rustic Sun" quilt, which looks beautiful. Turn in your Challenge Quilts at the October meeting!

October 20th is the date for our fundraiser: A Home Studio and Garden Tour, Plus Luncheon. We have been planning this event for the past year. "Holiday Taffy" Block Exchange

Make 12 blocks measuring $10\frac{1}{2}$ x $10\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Save one for yourself and put 11 in a baggie with your name on it. Turn the baggie in at the beginning of the December 12th Holiday Guild Meeting. At the end of the meeting you will receive your baggie back with 11 different taffy blocks... ready to make a quick Holiday Quilt.

Taffy pieces: Your choice of holiday colors and patterns


For each block cut: one $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center) and one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Taffy corners).

Background pieces: Use white or white-on-white. Please DO NOT use off white, beige, tan or another color. For each block cut:

- 1 square at $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for the Taffy corners), 2 squares at 2" (to 'snowball' the Taffy Center)
- 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 rectangles at $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (pieces around the Taffy Center)
- 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 strips at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " (border strips)

To make each Block, follow the steps below and match the diagram:

1. Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on all pieces.
2. Use both $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (taffy and background) to make Half Square Triangles (HST) trimmed to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (the corners of the Taffy piece). You need 2. (See below for how to make HST.)
3. Use the two background 2" squares to "snowball" the opposite corners of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (the Taffy Center). (See below for how to "snowball".)
4. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to each side of the Taffy Center.
5. Sew the Half Square Triangles (follow the diagram) to the end of each $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.
6. Sew each strip from step 4 to the top and bottom of the Taffy Center, aligning the corners carefully to the Taffy Center. See diagram below.
7. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the opposite sides of the Taffy Center.
8. Sew the two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to the other sides of the Taffy Center.
9. Square up the block to measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".



To make HST:

Put right sides together, draw a line diagonally across the back, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " down each side of the line, cut the pieces apart on the line. Iron seams to the dark side, or iron them open if you wish.

To "snowball":

Put right sides together with small squares in opposite corners of the large square. Draw a diagonal line across the small square from edge to edge. Sew along the line and fold white fabric out and Taffy fabric towards Taffy Center. Trim excess fabric if you wish.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING REPORT

MINUTES OF THE GLENDALE QUILT GUILD EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 6, 2018

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. Present: Tim Spinn, President; Crystal Dudley, Vice President; Ellen Gray, Communications Secretary; Mary Jamora, Treasurer; Sharon Bishop, Parliamentarian; Flo Cohen, Programs/Workshops; Karen Millman and Pat Golditch, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Newsletter; Kathi Wilson and Craig Coleman, Fund Raising 2018; Rasa Read, Fund Raising 2019; Cindy Abrams and An Burgess Loving Hands; Colleen Shier, Advisor and Kathy Fogel, Electronic Media/ Website Liaison.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Website Liaison/Fogel: Kathy presented an update on Website activities along with a position description for Website Liaison. In January Kathy would like to turn the job over to someone new and will be willing to work with that person to get them familiar with the job. Tim will ask for a volunteer at the Guild meeting and in the Newsletter.

Vice President/Dudley: SCCQG has been asked by Road2CA to submit quilts for a special exhibit from SCCQG members.

Crystal has the information and necessary form. The SCCQG newsletter is currently online and our opportunity quilt is on the front page. The October SCCQG meeting will be in Lakewood and the topic is Philanthropy. Contact Crystal if you are interested in carpooling.

Treasurer/Jamora: The August Treasurer's Report was presented.

Sunshine and Shadows/Gray: Nancy Turney had double knee surgery and is recovering nicely. Dona Garding will have surgery on her hand. Karen Millman's husband is having surgery. Tim's husband is having knee surgery. Marie Waterlond has had a spell of serious illness and we are wishing her speedy recovery. Congratulations to Sharon Bishop's grandson, Matthew, who became an Eagle Scout.

Programs/Workshops/Cohen: An updated Program/Workshop calendar was submitted. A **motion** was made to approve the new calendar as presented. **The motion was seconded and passed.** A discussion ensued regarding the pros and cons of sharing speakers with other guilds.

Membership/Millman: Membership renewals are continuing. Affiliate renewals are slow. Past Presidents and Honorary Life Members have been contacted and asked to update their information. The response has been nil. It was suggested that unless we hear from these members they be kept on the list of Past Presidents and Honorary Life Members but that we cease to send them Newsletters or other communications and would no longer list them as active members. Quilt 'n Things is moving and will send us information on their new location and hours. Karen followed up on a suggestion and contacted the Glendale Library to see if we could promote quilting and the Guild and they suggested that we submit a proposal to the library for involvement. Things we might want to consider for the proposal are: getting on the schedule of displays in the various branches; teaching quilting; and a banner for the library are among some of the ideas. The Guild would need a team to develop a proposal to submit to the library.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Elke tried using an envelope to mail the newsletters. It turned out to be more work so she will go back to the old method using sticker seals.

Fund Raising 2018/Wilson: So far the Opportunity Quilt has brought in \$5,860 which is fantastic. Ticket sales for the October event have reached 160 so far which is also fantastic. Quilt n' Things made a huge donation of items for the event. The final meeting before the big event is October 17 at WAC.

Fund Raising 2019/Read: A proposal was made that we move the 2019 main fund raising event (aka quilt show) to Spring 2020. A Spring 2020 event would not be competing with QuiltCon which was the main reason for moving to fall. It would dovetail nicely with the San Fernando bi-annual quilt show; it would align with the Guild fiscal year; and it would continue the tradition of a spring Glendale Quilt Show. A **motion** was made and seconded to accept the proposal to move the main fund raising event to Spring of 2020. **The motion was seconded and passed.** It was also proposed that a smaller fund raising event be in the Fall of 2019 and that an Opportunity Quilt be made to debut at Road2CA in 2019 and to have another Opportunity Quilt to be displayed (but not drawn) at our Spring 2020 event. The next meetings are scheduled for September 20 and November 1, at WAC at 6:30 p.m.

Loving Hands/Abrams: The last Loving Hands day with extended hours was well received. The plan is to continue to alternate the usual hours with extended hours. Members continue to participate in all aspects of Loving Hands. There will be a Taco Day Sew-In on Friday, October 5 from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at WAC.

Audit Committee/Spinn: Tim is still trying to reach the suggested third member of the Audit Committee.

Trips/Cohen: Flo has agreed to be the chair for Trips but we need to decide what day we want to go to Road.

Storage/Coleman: There are six sewing machines in storage that we need to get rid of in order to cut down on storage space. Two of them will be sold at the Under the Big Top event. It was suggested that the remaining sewing machines be offered for sale to Guild members at the November meeting.

Christmas Block Exchange/Wilson: The block will be in the October Newsletter and announced at the October Guild meeting.

IV. The meeting **adjourned** at 9:05 p.m.
