Laura Fraga The Phenomenon of the Dear Jane Quilt



Laura Fraga, our speaker at the GQG meeting on Wednesday, September 12th, has cherished memories of growing up watching her grandmother hand quilt traditional quilts with her church group, but it wasn't until 1990, after taking her first quilting class, that Laura found her own passion for quilting. After mastering the basics, Laura realized that she had two great passions – hand appliqué and making “Dear Jane” quilts.

The original “Dear Jane” quilt was a sampler comprised of an astounding 5,602 individual pieces that was completed during the Civil War in 1863, by Jane A. Stickle. Quilt historian Brenda Papadakis discovered the quilt at the Bennington Museum in Vermont and introduced it to the world in 1996.

Laura admits to being a Janiac (rhymes with maniac) since the year 2000. She has completed several Dear Jane quilts of different sizes and helped to launch numerous other quilters on their own Dear Jane journeys. Her quilts have won blue ribbons in national shows, making Laura a much sought-after presenter. In addition, Laura has appeared as a guest on *The Quilt Show* with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims and taught her Dear Jane techniques at the Empty Spools Seminar at Asilomar. We are very pleased to welcome Laura as a speaker at GQG!

On Saturday, September 15th, guild members will have a chance to try their hand at creating their very Dear Jane blocks at a workshop led by Guild newsletter editor, Elke Miyahara. If you haven't already signed up online for this technique-rich workshop, please do so at the September 12th meeting.

The President's Block



I enjoyed Leah Zieber's presentation on antique children's quilts at the August meeting. She set the tone with a short video. In a soothing voice transported us back to a simpler time, before technology offered so many distractions. The trunk show was interesting, and I loved her passion for these quilts and the time period. She has even written a novel set in the time period of the antique quilts. As I interacted with Leah and listened to her presentation it became clear to me that she had found her purpose.

I have been contemplating purpose lately. My purpose as a quilter. Our greater purpose as a guild. This guild was created by founder Carol Andrews to carry on her love of quilting. Carol generously offered to us what she started with those first quilt shows so the Glendale Quilt Guild could continue the tradition; and pursue the purpose of contributing to the knowledge of and to promote the appreciation of fine quilts and quilt-making. (As stated in our by-laws.)

The guild achieves its purpose through all of our various activities; Programs, Workshops, Loving Hands, Show and Tell, Block of the Month, our various fundraising activities, and in other ways. A main focus of our purpose for over 30 years has been to carry on the tradition of having the best quilt show in our region. We have been renowned for our shows, and were even featured on Huell Howser's television show.

The quilt show in 2017 was a work of love by the show organizers, Sandy Bradfield, Tina Curran, and Beth Hasenauer and our Guild member/non-member volunteers. It was an artistic success and truly achieved the purpose of promoting the appreciation of fine quilts and quilt making. It was a feat of pure will. Many members who worked in all capacities before, during and after the show felt they had never worked so hard on previous shows. Our guild is not the size it once was, which means fewer hands to carry the load. I am in awe of what we accomplished.

At the November 30, 2017 meeting there was a thoughtful discussion about the future. The question was asked, "Do we as a Guild want to do a Show?" The answer by those present, although not unanimous, was "Yes, we want a Show". By the time this is published, the first Quilt Show meeting will have taken place. As we move into another fundraising cycle, I encourage all of you to support Rasa Read, the Quilt Show/Fundraising Chair. A guild is the sum total of the energy, creativity, warmth, and purpose of all its members. Together, we are a formidable force. I look forward to what happens next.

Finally, I want to share a poem that was printed in the Sister's Quilt Show magazine. Unfortunately the poem did not include the name of the author. *(Please see bottom of page 4 for the poem.)*

Isn't it amazing to "create with purpose"? This image has lingered with me all month long.



Cutting Directions:

All blocks this year use a ¼ inch seam allowance and will be the same size: 12 ½ x 12 ½ unfinished.

From fabric provided with pattern:

F Fabric: Cut one (1) 4 ¼ square, cut twice on the diagonal for 4 pieces (Drawing A)

From Background fabric:

A Fabric: Cut four (4) 3 ½ squares (corner squares)


C Fabric: Cut one (1) 7 ¼ square, cut twice on the diagonal for 4 pieces (Drawing A)

E Fabric: Cut One (1) 4 ¼ square, cut twice on the diagonal for 4 pieces (Drawing A)

From coordinating fabric:

B Fabric: Cut four (4) 3 ⅞ squares, cut each once on the diagonal for 8 pieces (Drawing B)

D Fabric: Cut two (2) 3 ⅞ squares, cut each one once on the diagonal for 4 pieces (Drawing B)



Sewing Directions: (refer to diagram on upper left)

- Sew two “B” pieces to a “C” piece. Repeat for four rectangles (outer Flying Geese)
- Sew an “A” piece to each side of two “B/C” Flying Geese rectangles for the outer top and bottom rows
- Sew an “F” piece to an “E” piece. Repeat to make four E/F pieces
- Following the diagram, sew a “D” piece to each E/F piece, then sew together for the center square
- Sew two “B/C” Flying Geese rectangles to opposite sides of the center square for the middle row
- Sew the three rows together

Congratulations, you’ve finished the Stars!

Now – how to set the blocks? It’s up to you! Bring your top to the October meeting for show and tell and to get your \$10 voucher for the November “Beyond Boring Borders” workshop.

MINUTES OF THE GLENDALE QUILT GUILD EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING August 2, 2018

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:35 pm by President Spinn at the Glendale Woman's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. PRESENT: Tim Spinn-President; Crystal Dudley-Vice President; Flo Cohen-Workshop Co-Chairperson; Pat Golditch and Karen Millman-Membership Co-Chairpersons; Kathi Wilson and Craig Coleman-Fundraising 2018; Rasa Reed-Fundraising 2019; Mary Jamora-Treasurer; Elke Miyahara-Newsletter; Susan Edwards and Cindy Abrams-Loving Hands Co-Chairpersons. NOT PRESENT: Nancy Turney- Workshop Co-Chairperson; Beth Hasenauer-Recording Secretary; Ellen Gray-Communications Secretary; Sharon Bishop-Parliamentarian; Jean Giacomelli and Alice Smith-Program Co-Chairpersons; An Burgess- Loving Hands Co-Chairperson

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS

President/Spinn: He will send out notices via Mail Chimp and try to keep them as few as possible.

Vice President/Dudley: She attended the SCCGQ quarterly meeting in Santa Barbara on Saturday, July 14. August 15 is the deadline to include anything in their newsletter. Our October event is on their calendar. The secretary position is open on the SCCGQ Council. They hold quarterly phone meetings. October's meeting is in Long Beach and the topic is *Philanthropy*. Attendees can bring items of interest to the meeting. January's meeting is in Irvine, April's topic is *Meet the Teachers* and July's is *Marketing for the Guild*. Some tips to improve a guild's outreach are to host a community sew, have bookmarks available and assign a guild buddy to new members.

Treasurer/Jamora: The July Treasurer's report was presented. Expenses exceeded Income. The biggest expense was the yearly \$3300 fee for the Guild's storage unit. A motion was made by Cindy Abrams to authorize the treasurer to get a deposit only ATM card for our checking account. It was seconded by Flo Cohen and approved by the Board. This will allow the treasurer an easier and faster way to deposit monies to the guild checking account via an ATM instead of having to go physically into the bank.

Communications Secretary/Spinn: Maria Rodriguez had surgery and is recovering. She welcomes cards and phone calls.

Parliamentarian/No report

Programs/ Cohen: September's speaker, Laura Fraga, will bring a door prize. The 2019 Program/Workshop Schedule was presented. After much discussion the January through June activities, which are already budgeted, were approved by the Board. July through December's schedule will be decided upon at a future meeting.

Workshops/Cohen: Only 3 people signed up for the August workshop. There should be good techniques to learn and more should sign up after the program next week.

Membership/Golditch-Millman: Eighty-three people renewed so far. We have 156 members in the database. Seventeen members are life or past presidents who do not need to pay dues, but must confirm that they wish to remain members. Three pay dues anyway. Only one Affiliate renewed. Membership will go personally to the others to encourage renewals. Discussed the need to exhibit guild quilts in different venues, such as the Glendale Library. Millman will contact different venues.

Newsletter/Miyahara: Newsletter deadline Tuesday 8/14. August newsletters were mailed in envelopes. Articles should be submitted by Board members ready to be inserted into the newsletter. The editor's responsibility is to proof and organize, not to write articles.

Fundraising 17-2018/Wilson: Ms. Big Top opportunity quilt has earned \$5587.00 to date. Cruise night earned \$252.00. The Big Bear Show is this weekend. 138 tickets sold for the luncheon and tour. The goal is 180. Next team meeting is Wednesday 8/15 at noon at WAC. More time was bought for set-up and take-down for the event at the Montrose Ladies Club.

Fundraising 18-2019/Read: Not sure of what type of event to put on. She wants a show (that is her forte) and if so may move it to Spring 2020. A meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, 8/29 at 6:30 pm at WAC. All are welcome.

Loving Hands/Abrams/Edwards: St. Joseph's and LA County Hospitals sent thank you notes for the quilts they received. A total of 23 people were taking and bringing things to LH at the last general meeting or attending the LH workshop. The August and October LH sewing events have extended hours from 10 am to 8:30 pm to allow more people to participate. September and November are the regular daytime hours.

Sunshine and Shadows/Cohen: Nancy Turney will have a double knee replacement on August 6th.

Audit committee: Need to get one together to cover the fiscal year: 7/72017 to 6/30/2018. Names were submitted to Spinn.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

501c3 no further news... but the check was cashed.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Standing Rules and Bylaws: Need to remove all references to Library, raise the dues and go over what "Not in good standing" really means. Currently 36 people did not pay \$10 for the tickets for the Opportunity Quilt which is a membership requirement. The 36 include past presidents and life members. Go to the website under *Membership* to check the Bylaws and Standing Rules.

Christmas Block Exchange/Wilson: Snowball and candy blocks were presented. The candy block with a border was accepted.

Make a Deal Money Raiser/Cohen: A minimum of 8 people need to attend a Let's Make a Deal TV show taping in costume (would use quilt tops as toga-like costumes). For each attendee the show will give the guild \$40. The agreed upon date is August 16, from 1 to 5:30 pm in Van Nuys. Contact Flo Cohen for more information.

Newsletter/Miyahara (Spinn): Articles due Tuesday August 14th.

Fundraising 2018/Wilson-Coleman: Miss Big Top has earned \$5,696 so far with \$252 earned on Cruise Night. People who participated were recognized at the meeting. The Big Bear Lake Show is in early September. Saturday, 9/29 is the Blue Jay Quilt Walk and we need to do 4 hours of white gloving. We may not participate in the Temecula show on 10/6 because they have not responded back to our inquiries. More Viewer's Choice/guild member quilts are still needed to display at the tour homes. See Kathy Fogel. Chicken quilts will have their own ribbon. Ribbons are special this year because they are handmade. Next team meeting is Wednesday 8/15 at noon at WAC.

Fundraising 2019/Read: A kick-off meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 29 at 6:30 pm at WAC.

Programs/ Giacomelli-Smith: September's speaker is Laura Fraga on the Dear Jane quilt. Jean Embry will present "Finding Your Passion" in October.

Workshops/Cohen-Turney: Leah Zieber's workshop entitled "Tiny Treasures Done Right" is this Saturday. In September, Elke Miyahara will show how to make Dear Jane blocks. In October's workshop you can bring your own fabrics for free form design or pay \$45 for a kit with Hoffman fabrics.

Loving Hands/Abrams/Burgess/Edwards: Twenty-one people participated in LH activities. Four tops, 18 receiving blankets, 14 finished quilts and 12 quilts that need binding were turned in. August 17th hours are from 10 AM to 8:30 PM (after dark hours) to accommodate more people who have commitments during the day. You can help LH by sewing labels, cutting fabric and binding quilt tops. All help is welcomed. The third annual Taco Night will be in October with food available from 4 to 9 pm.
