

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:36 pm by President T. Spinn @ Glendale Woman's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. PRESENT: Tim Spinn, President; Crystal Dudley, Vice-President; Mary Jamora, Treasurer; Beth Hasenauer, Recording Secretary; Nancy Turney, Programs/Workshops; Judy Parker, Membership; Elke Miyahara, Parliamentarian; Cindy Abrams, Loving Hands. NOT PRESENT: Sharon Bishop, Communications; Flo Cohen, Programs/Workshops; Homa Asef & Rebecca Fletcher, Membership; Rasa Read, Fundraising; Ellen Gray, Newsletter; Colleen Shier, Advisor

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS

**Vice President/Dudley:** January SCCQG meeting will be part II of mastering social media focusing on the "how to's". Hosted by Inland Empire Guild on January 11, 2020 at Corona/Norco Teachers' Assn, 1189 Mountain Ave-Suite 100, Norco, CA. Deadline for the SCCQG quilt challenge honoring 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Road to CA in 2020 has been extended to 11/23/2019 (submit a photo of the top by this date). Quilt size has also been expanded L: 24-40" x W: 24-36". Your challenge quilt must be inspired by anything you have seen or participated in at Road to CA in the past. Per standing rule 12.05(j) Honorary Life Membership occurs every 3 years and this recognition is due for consideration this year. A notification to the membership is published in the Nov, Newsletter. President Spinn requested that Vice-President Dudley form a committee to review the nominations submitted by the membership in January 2020. This committee will select the nominees to be presented to the membership and the members will vote on the nominee by secret ballot in March and the selected individual will be announced in April 2020.

**Treasurer/Jamora:** presented October Guild income/expense report. Have an audit team together and will try to get the audit done in November. Need to add a budget line item for Stitches booth fee for next year.

**Communications Secretary/Bishop:** (Abrams/Dudley) C. Tanaka took another fall and is recovering. Lettie Williams also took a fall and was hospitalized but is doing better.

**Parliamentarian/Miyahara:** Positions still needing candidates for election in 2020 are: Recording Secretary, President, Programs/Workshops, Fundraising 2020-21. Tim wants it to be known that as past president he will be an able advisor to whomever decides to consider running for Guild President. On another note; the Challenge quilts from the "Say it with Words" challenge will be displayed at November meeting for viewer's choice voting by members and the winner will be announced at the December meeting.

**Programs/Workshops:** Cohen/Turney: (Turney) Signed contracts are coming in for 2020 programs/workshops. Brochures are complete and will be distributed at the November Guild meeting. Road to CA bus has been ordered. Need to confirm charge for participants wanting to take the bus instead of driving. Guild program and workshop this month focus on the theme of giving. Weds night: LH quilt recipients: Laura Landaker from Seven Stars Foundation for whom we make the camper quilts, Two representatives from different parts of USC medical center cntr. ( Dept. of Spiritual care and Dir of volunteer service) and Lynne Davidson from Project Karibu in Kenya where we provide the flannel receiving blankets. For the workshop; participants are encouraged to work on something they are making for others.

**Membership/ Parker:** There are approximately 122 members with 17-18 people who haven't renewed. Rosters are here and will be given out at Nov/Dec meeting.

**Newsletter/Gray:** (Spinn) Articles due Tuesday 11/19.

**Fundraising 2019/Read:** (Spinn) Upcoming Stitches event. Small to med sized quilts are priced to sell. Larger lap sized quilts priced at \$75.00. Had a good turnout at Mon/Weds Sew at WAC with utility bag making that will be sold at Stitches. Currently have 26 plus additional 10. Pre-sale of 6 bags. Investigating the Quilters Express Organization to work with us on pipe and drape at our show in March.

**Loving Hands/Abrams:** Doing well and in good shape. People are quilting. Sold about 22 bags approx. \$300 profit to benefit LH.

**Standing Committees:** Email blast: send items to Tim. Will finish BOM this month. Dine-in in Feb 2020. Ocean view in Montrose is a potential option. Book when is ok. Nominating committee needs two members at large to complete the committee.

Jamora, seconded E. Miyahara) to make \$100 donation Crescenta Valley HS JROTC. Voting unanimous agreed.

VFW Post 1614/Am Legion Post 288 Veterans. Donated their services entirely for our Bingo Event. Donate to their GoFundMe account for parking lot renovations. **Motion** (C. Abrams, E. Miyahara second): Support VFW go fund me page with \$100 donation for parking lot renovations. Voting unanimous agreed.

Brand Doctors House is under the auspices of the Glendale Historical Society and are interested in having the GQG have a quilt exhibit there. They are currently in the process of planning their calendar for next year. Wouldn't make money but it would give us exposure. Tim Spinn and Mary Jamora will inquire.

We hope to have the quilt back from Brandi in time to bind it and add a hanging sleeve & label before showing it off at our December guild meeting. It will then debut at Road to California at the end of January.



While we were making poppies for this quilt, we also made 18 extra poppies for a smaller version of the quilt (that measures 25" x 40"). The guild member who sells the most raffle tickets for our 2020 quilt will win this smaller quilt.
