## The President's Block



Why do we always have to talk about fund raising? Why can't we just have fun? I have heard this expressed within our guild, and from quilters in other guilds. I am often struck by how similar the issues within different guilds can be, whether it is fund raising, having fun, or just enjoying talking about our favorite subject, quilts!

As a non-profit organization the only source of income we have is through fund raising. As noted in our Bylaws all members have a responsibility to participate in, and support, the activities of the guild.

I am so proud of the many areas where the members contribute to the guild; by paying dues on time, purchasing tickets for the raffle baskets, purchasing tickets to the events, supporting the Dine In program, and by volunteering their time to chair projects, quilt challenges, blocks of the month, supporting Loving Hands in countless ways, and all of the other things that somehow get done which provide enrichment for our members and the community. **I thank all of you for the ways you support the guild.**

One area where we seem to be falling short is in members volunteering for leadership positions for the Quilt Show in 2020. I conducted an informal poll at the May meeting. Everyone has attended a quilt show, but about half of the members in attendance have never worked to organize a quilt show. I think it can be intimidating to volunteer to "chair", or take the leadership, in an unfamiliar area of responsibility. Unfortunately, because we don't have yearly quilt shows we don't automatically expose the new members to the various components of putting on a show. And truthfully, I know some members who have worked in leadership positions in the past may feel burnt out and are willing to help, if someone else will take the lead. Yet, we can't organize a quilt show without people in leadership positions. It is kind of a Catch-22.

Since some of you may not be familiar with the particular duties of a few of the Quilt Show positions we most urgently need to fill, I thought I would take this space to describe them here. Any of these chair positions can be filled by one person or a team, and the work is easier if shared among many hands.

- **Vendor Chair:** Search for and solicit vendors for the Show. Maintain a list of potential vendors and their interest. Send out a letter soliciting vendors to participate in our Show. Communicate with Vendors by letter and email regarding specific details. Work with the Decorator Chair on the floor plan for the vendors. Communicate all legal documents, contracts, etc. to the participating vendors. Keep a notebook of all vendor contracts, etc. All vendors are requested to provide items for the Shopper Rewards giveaways during the Show. Must be present for set up and take down of vendors area.
- **Decorator Chair:** Work with Vendor and Layout Chair to create a preliminary floor plan. Get quotes from several decorator (pipe and drape) companies for the floor plan, compare, and pick the best option. Have a pre-show orientation meeting with selected decorator representative, Vendor chair; Layout chair; this decorator representative MUST be present on the day of set up. We have the specific guidelines for what has worked for us in the past, but weighted posts are super important.
- **Publicity Chair:** Develop publicity plan with Show Chair, which may include ads in newspapers and magazines, take postcards to quilt shops, quilt shows, guild meetings, and other public places of interest to quilters. Work with Facebook and Web committees. We need a very creative and proactive individual for this position to generate interest for our Show.

I know these positions may sound intimidating, but when broken down into steps they can be a lot of fun.

My plea to all of you is to please volunteer if you want the Glendale Quilt Guild to have a successful Quilt Show in 2020. Please come to the Fund Raising meeting, or speak to Rasa Read regarding these or other positions.

I am looking forward to seeing you all at the June meeting.



## Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes May 2, 2019

I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:31 pm by President T. Spinn @ Glendale Woman's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. PRESENT: Tim Spinn, President; C. Dudley, Vice-President; M. Jamora, Treasurer; B. Hasenauer, Recording Secretary; P. Golditch & K. Millman, Membership Co-Chairpersons, E. Miyahara, Newsletter; R. Read, Fundraising 2018/2019; C. Abrams, Loving Hands Co-Chairperson. NOT PRESENT: E. Gray, Communications Secretary; S. Bishop, Parliamentarian, J. Giacomelli & A. Smith, Program Co-Chairpersons; Flo Cohen & N. Turney, Workshop Co-Chairpersons; A. Burgess & S. Edwards, Loving Hands Co-Chairpersons

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. Board and Committee Reports

**Vice President/Dudley:** SCCQG next meeting is Saturday 7/13. Topic: Guild Finances – Role of Treasurer and Best Practices. Meeting will be in Santa Monica. Saturday 10/12: Mastering Social Media and Market Strategies in Temecula. Meet the Teachers will be back in Carson 4/18/ 2020.

**Treasurer/Jamora:** presented April report. Proposed budget for 2019-2020 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 was presented and reviewed by Board. Several modifications to the proposed budget were proposed. **MOTION:** (E. Miyahara/Second R. Read) The Board accept 2019-2020 budget with proposed changes. Discussion: None. Vote: Unanimous in favor. 7 votes.

**Communications Secretary/Gray:** Not present. No report

**Parliamentarian/Bishop:** Not present. Written report under Unfinished Business

**Programs/Giacomelli-Smith.** Not present. Written report under workshops.

**Workshops/Cohen-Turney:** Not present. Read written report. Peggy Martin is speaker on 5/8 and will be doing the workshop on 5/11. Nine people have signed up for the workshop. June program is pot luck with installation of officers. June workshop is Tina Curran teaching the herringbone pattern she created. Nine people from the Guild attended the SCCQG Meet the Teachers event in April. In the process of contacting the potential speaking prospects regarding pricing and availability for next year. Will circulate a survey to members at the May meeting to see what they would like to see in programs/workshops for the upcoming year.

**Membership/Golditch-Millman:** Remove Welcome/Hospitality from special committees listed on the agenda. This committee has been vacant and Membership has taken over welcome activities. With the new budget year coming up in July, need to collect dues from those Affiliates that have not yet paid for the current year. Will be working to transition to new membership chairs. The new member tea on Saturday May 18. Many Board members are unable to attend. Potluck sign up was distributed.

**Newsletter/Miyahara:** May is Elke's last newsletter before transitioning to Ellen Gray who will start in June. Send anything for the June newsletter to Ellen. Monday 6/10 is the Board meeting. July Board meeting is Thursday 6/27.

**Fundraising 2019/Read:** Bingo sponsorships going well; bringing in more funds than expected. Bingo tickets are finalized and ready for printing. Try to attend S. Bishop's grandson's bingo event to benefit the Boy Scouts-Verdugo Hills Council at Am. Legion to preview the venue and see what a Bingo Night is like. Opportunity Quilt: Didn't get into SF valley and Inland Empire shows. Several guilds meeting in the daytime. Will distribute a sign-up sheet to the Board to sign up for a daytime event. Lancaster show is 2 days 5/18 is covered and need volunteers for Sunday 5/19. We got into the Montrose Art Festival on 6/1 & 6/2. Will post a sign-up sheet for am and pm shifts including set up and take down. Quilt will be at the Santa Clarita Valley Quilt Show on 6/8 and 6/9. Working on information sheet called "Quilt show 101" to describe different jobs and positions that can be put in the newsletter and or serve as the basis for a power point presentation. Hold the date cards for the quilt show being worked on.

**Loving Hands/Abrams/Burgess/Edwards:** (Abrams) A lot of donations of fabric and other items for LH. Need quilters to complete the camp quilts that need to be ready for June Guild meeting. Will hold a raffle in June to benefit LH and a Fabric Sale in August also to benefit LH.

### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

President Spinn read Parliamentarian S. Bishop's letter to the Board outlining changes to the Bylaws including the Standing Rules. These include house-keeping administrative changes to remove all references to the library, to better define terms (switching quilt show for more generic term of fundraising and removing a paragraph relating to Fund Raising Chairperson term of service) and to update the dues structure necessitated by the dues increase that was voted on and previously approved by the Guild membership. An additional change to rescind the part of Article 3.01(e) that exempted past presidents from payment of dues only for the years served as President was also put forward for consideration by the Board. **Motion** (C. Abrams/second M. Jamora): Accept all changes to the bylaws except those relating to past president dues exemption [Article 3.01(e)] and term of office for fundraising chairperson (Article 5.2) until discussion takes place. Vote: 7 agree.-unanimous. Discussion: Leave in the paragraph relating to fundraising chair term of service. Our current fundraising activities vary and we need procedural flexibility.

**Motion** (M. Jamora/second E. Miyahara): Move to reject proposed change to definition of the term of service for fundraising chair (Article 5.2 term of office). Vote: unanimous 7 votes agree to the motion. **Motion** (K. Millman/no second) Move to accept proposed change to Article 3.01(e) and return to previous policy exempting past presidents from payment of dues in perpetuity. No second – Motion died. **Motion** (R. Read/second C. Dudley): Reject proposed change to Article 3.01(e). Vote: 6 agree, 1 against. Motion carries. Process: Approved changes will be presented verbally to the membership at the May General Meeting and will be posted to the website for a review period until the June General Meeting and a required notice will be posted in the June Newsletter. The membership will vote on the changes at the June Guild Meeting.

### V. New Business

2019-2020 Budget proposal reviewed under treasurer's report.

Board approves to move forward with exercising the extension of the WAC contract terms for year 2.

### VI. The meeting adjourned at 9:01 pm.

There were no nominations from the floor. A **motion** was moved, seconded and passed unanimously to accept the recommended slate of officers. The newly elected officers will be installed in June and take office in July.
