## September Program



Our Glendale Quilt Guild speaker on Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup> will be Cathy Perlmutter. Cathy lives in near-by Pasadena and has worked as a designer, writer, and editor. She has tried almost every quilting technique there is and says her home is an “encyclopedic storehouse of craft and quilt supplies.” She has published two books, one on paper piecing and one on making little Jewish hats called Yarmulkes. Her newest book about English paper piecing 100 original star designs will be published in 2020.

Cathy’s program will take us through her quilting journey and highlight her current passion, creating cityscapes. These cityscapes have been so successful, that she now has commissions to create personalized pieces for important art collectors.

Cathy has maintained her own website since the 1990’s and offers a weekly blog about her quilting adventures that aims to be helpful and humorous and includes detailed tutorials. And these are only *some* of her accomplishments. Join us on September 11<sup>th</sup> to hear more about this remarkable woman and see for yourself what beautiful work she does.



## September 14 Workshop



From cityscapes we move to landscapes on Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup>. Our own Alice Smith will help you recreate “a place that touches your soul or perhaps expresses your love for wild places” when she shows you how to fashion a small (24” X 36”) Landscape in a Day. She’ll go over elements and principles of design as she shows you how to divide your project into four simple areas: sky, distant background, middle ground, and the foreground that you wish to spotlight. Think about the kind of landscape you’d like to make and bring fat quarters, fabric from your stash, possibly parts of panels that will help you fulfill your vision. Alice will bring some of her fabric as well so you’re practically guaranteed to find exactly what you need. The only other thing you’ll need to bring (besides your sewing machine and supplies, of course,) will be a batting scrap 25” X 37” or larger. Besides getting to learn from this Master

Quilter, there are two other reasons to attend the workshop. First, you’ll actually go home with a finished project, and second, because Alice is generously donating her time, the cost for this full day of quilt instruction will only be \$10 – just enough to cover the rental cost of the room.

### Support "Quilts for Empowerment" by Donating Embroidery Floss

While attending the Sisters Quilt Show I saw a display selling items made by women in Kenya. I was intrigued by the small quilts, tote bags, table mats, and folk art quilts for sale. I learned about the non-profit "Quilts for Empowerment" which I want to share with you.

Information from their flyer: "Changing women's lives in Kenya. Our quilters are impoverished but resilient women living in rural Western Kenya. Most have suffered the pain, stigma, and social isolation of having an obstetric fistula. Many have been abandoned by their families and without skills or an education, struggle to support themselves and their children. Women embrace the opportunity to learn to make quilted products and earn much needed income. Income may be used to pay for school fees or for general upkeep and medical expenses. In addition to earning money, the women gain confidence and self-esteem. The social opportunity to quilt together is especially valued."

Quilts for Empowerment, has a mission to improve the lives of women and girls in Kenya. They do this in several ways.

- Pay women a Fair Trade Wage each month for their work. In addition all quilters belong to an income-generating support group that is funded by QFE.
- In partnership with Fistula Foundation, they conduct outreach to find women needing fistula surgery, arrange for them to be treated, pay transportation for surgery, and support them afterwards.
- This year they will begin supporting girls who have been sexually assaulted.

Quilts for Empowerment is seeking donations of embroidery floss in all colors and amounts. The guild will have box to collect embroidery floss at our General meetings. Donation of embroidery floss will be mailed to the organization in Oregon. Interestingly, donations must be stored in paper bags since Kenya has banned plastic bags. For more information:

## Bingo Lingo for Beginners

This is short introduction to bingo for any of our members may not have previously attended a bingo game. Arrive early so you have plenty of time to familiarize yourself with the facility and items to be purchased, such as food and raffles. Review program for list of games, intermissions, etc. Admission includes a pack of multi-colored Bingo cards that includes every regular game. You may purchase additional bingo packs to play. There will also be special games which can be purchased, these may be called "Flash" games or "Big Ticket" games. Admission to our fundraiser Bingo also includes the dauber, or bingo marker, to be used during the games.

At the beginning of each game, the caller will announce the type, or pattern, of BINGO needed to win. The numbers called will be shown on a screen at the front of the room. There are multiple types of bingo patterns which may be called during an evening. The winning pattern will be very clear before the Caller starts to call the numbers. Here is a list of a few popular bingo patterns:

- The most common is the regular bingo, a straight vertical, horizontal, or diagonal line of 5 numbers (which may include the free space).
- Four Corners - A pattern that requires you cover each of the 4 numbers located in the far corners of the card
- Postage Stamp - A pattern that has 4 numbers (2x2) in a small square placed in any corner in the shape of a stamp on an envelope
- Picture Frame - A pattern that creates a square around the "free space"
- Blackout - A bingo pattern that requires that every number on your card must be called for you to win.

### Playing and Winning Bingo

The Caller will announce the game name and number. Numbers are called at approximate 15 second intervals. Mark the numbers on your bingo card as they are called. Watch for the winning pattern on your card as the game progresses. When you have the winning pattern, call out very loud "BINGO". This stops the caller from calling the next number. **The last number called must be in your Bingo for you to win.** Someone will come to you to verify the numbers in your bingo by calling them out loud to the caller. The caller will verify each number, and state if it is a good bingo and ask if there are any other winners. Multiple winners will split the prize. If the bingo is declared invalid, the play continues until there is a winner.

The most important rule of all: HAVE FUN!



In closing we would like to give special thanks to **Pat Golditch** and **Karen Millman** who shared their Membership Committee expertise with us. We appreciate all their help.



## 2020 Opportunity Quilt

At the August meeting, we collected fabric donations for next year's opportunity quilt. It will be a queen-sized (96" x 96") version of the quilt I brought to the April meeting. Instead of three sizes of poppies (as seen on the right) there will be five sizes of poppies (as seen in the illustration below.)



There will be at least two block-making sessions for this project at the Glendale Women's Athletic Club. After one sew-in session in August, our second sew-in is scheduled for Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, from 10 AM – 4 PM. The plan is to have GQG members make the quilt with -- to whatever extent we can -- fabric donated by guild members. Please bring patterned cotton fabric of any shade of orange and/or dark green to the September guild meeting and the September sew-in.



The poppy blocks are made using the paper-piecing method. But if you don't paper piece, no worries! I will be at every block making sessions all day and will be happy to teach beginning paper piecing to anyone who would like to learn and/or improve their skills. For those who cannot attend either session, I will have block kits at the September guild meeting for members to take, work on at home and return at the October meeting. The goal is to have the quilt completed before the end of the year so that it can debut at Road to California at the end of January.

## Our 2019 House Block-of-the Month

At the August guild meeting, fifteen wonderful blocks were on display in our BOM gallery, all featuring the “Country House” theme. As hoped, there were different interpretations of the theme. At the meeting we randomly selected the next Block of the Month house theme – “Fun House.” This is the program’s seventh house theme, after “Open House,” “Summer House,” “Dog House,” “Dream House,” “Power House,” and “Country House.”

Using the pattern and instructions available either as a hand-out at the meeting or on the GQG website, participants are asked to make a 12-1/2” x 12-1/2” house block using the “Country House” theme – however they wish to interpret it. The provided pattern as the basis for your block but can and be tweaked if/as desired, or ignored. Additionally, the fabric choices and any embellishments (if added) should reflect the “Fun House” theme.

Participants should bring their “Fun House” blocks to the September meeting. Upon arrival at the meeting, please turn in your block to “The BOM Gallery,” where all the blocks will be on display. This way, everyone can see how this house theme was interpreted by all the participants. During the September meeting, the eighth house theme will be randomly selected and announced. At the end of the meeting, everyone will take home their own “Fun House” block.


