Meet Anne Veazie Sonner: "Family History Quilts"



Are you one of those people who tried to delve into your family history? Do you wish you knew more about your grandparents or wonder about what your great-grandchildren will ever know about you? If any of this sounds familiar, then be sure to attend our Wednesday, February 13th GQG meeting to hear Anne Sonner talk about Family History Quilts.

Anne, who lives in near-by Covina, will show 37 quilts that tell stories – from memorial quilts in honor of her parents to quilts about newly discovered ancestors who “demanded” to be in a quilt. There is a quilt about a teenaged Civil War soldier, a great aunt who became a doctor in 1906, a little girl who was run over by a covered wagon on the Oregon Trail (and survived), and many others. Anne’s quilts use traditional patterns and new techniques, including photo transfer, words, and embellishments.

Then plan to join us again at our workshop on Saturday, February 16th to get a head-start on your very own family history quilt. The cost is \$40 which includes one 8” X 10” full-color transfer of your own photo/s that you will email to Anne by February 6th. (You can send additional photos for \$5.00 per sheet.) 

GQG DEAR JANE GROUP



Our 2019 Block-Of-the-Month

For 2019, I thought it would be fun to make a series of traditional quilt blocks that are all linked with a thematic twist. Of course one of the most traditional quilt blocks is the house block. But have you ever thought about how many common phrases include the word “house”? Here are just a few: lighthouse, farmhouse, tree house and dream house. I have about 20 of these phrases and we’re going to pick one house theme randomly at our February guild meeting to be the theme for our first house block. Participants will then make a 12-1/2” x 12-1/2” block and bring their completed blocks to the March meeting, where we’ll have a gallery so everyone can see how that first house theme was interpreted by all participants. At the end of the March meeting, everyone will take home their own block along with the second, randomly chosen house theme to use for their second house block. After nine months, participants will have nine 12-1/2” x 12-1/2” house-themed blocks with which to make a quilt.

Unlike other BOM programs, our pattern will be the same every month. The challenge for participants is to use their fabric choices and any embellishments (if they so choose) to reflect that month’s house theme. The pattern will be available at our guild meetings starting in February and on the guild’s website. I can’t wait to see the results! Tina Curran

Programs/ Giacomelli-Smith (Turney): January program Trudy Cleveland on How's and Why's for Photographing Your Quilts.

Workshops/Cohen-Turney: No January workshop. Kudos to Nancy for getting workshops and bus trip to Road2CA loaded on Bookwhen. February workshop is on Photo Transfer. Participants are to email photos to Anne Sonner and she will return them printed on high quality fabric. One 8x11 sheet is free with \$5.00 charge for extra sheets. She needs a 10 day lead time for processing prior to the workshop meaning photos need to be sent to her no later than approx. Weds 2/6.

Membership/Golditch-Millman: Rosters mailed and picked up. Have labels of members joining after roster printing that can be inserted into your copy of the roster. Can host approx 150 people for an evening. We can sell food baskets and have prizes. In conjunction with Chinese New Year and the New Years mini quilt challenge we can set up an event with New Moon Chinese restaurant where we can get a certain percentage of the take for anyone who eats there on a certain date and displays the notice from the guild. We will plan to set a date for February.

Loving Hands/Abrams-Burgess: Total given out 2018: 508 quilts 242 blocks / tops given out to various places. LH workshop camper quilt prep this month. 1/29 quiltathon.

Audit/Jamora: Behind schedule. Will get the committee coordinated and the audit completed

Email Blast/Spinn: Colleen cover Tim while she is away. Get info to Tim 1/14 for email blast before he leaves.

Electronic Media/Spinn-Hasenauer: Hester Bell has taken over the website from Kathy Fogel. To help with social media postings, plan to organize a small group who are willing to take photos at Guild events and upload them to the Guild Dropbox account for use on Facebook, in newsletter, on website etc. More details to come.

Block of the Month/Curran (Abrams) 2019 BOM will begin in February.

Trips/Cohen: 22 people signed up for the Bus for Road. 47 seats total. Will advertise at Sew n Sew and Quilt n Things after our January Guild Meeting if we haven't filled all the seats by then.

Saturday Workshop Materials List

In this workshop, you will make a small project (or start a larger one) using photos transferred onto fabric. It's a great way to honor a loved one, make a fun gift for a child or grandchild, tell a story, etc.

Choices:

A Log Cabin style pillow

A small quilt with the photo in the center of a star block

A unique project using any techniques you want

Provided:

Your photo printed onto fabric*

Choose a photo for your project. Any photo is fine, but one with high contrast and not a lot of tiny detail will work best.

We will not have equipment to print the photos at the workshop, so you will need to email your photo to Anne in advance so she can print it onto fabric for you. (If you only have a printed photo, scan it and then email it. If you don't know how to do this, ask someone to help.) **E-mail Anne your photo at least 10 days before the workshop:**

anne_sonner@verizon.net Be sure to indicate that the photo is for use at the GQG workshop on Saturday, February 16, 2019.

Alphabet stamps and writing pens for anyone who wants to use them

Old buttons and other embellishments for anyone who wants to use them

Bring:

Fabric – choose fabric that goes with your photo. For example, patriotic fabric for a veteran, flowered fabric for a gardener, pawprints for a pet, the person's favorite colors.

Sewing machine and basic sewing supplies

Embellishments, if desired

Pillow form if you're making a pillow

*Note: One free photo transfer is included for each person in the class. Additional transfers can be ordered for \$5/page (covers the fabric product and ink, which are expensive). Betty Nicassio's cotton sateen photo transfer is used and pigment inks, which are brighter and more colorfast than the usual dye inks in home printers.
