## Loving Hands: GQG's Charity Division

This report is filled with lots of good news. Although I am reading about a lot of people sheltering in place and struggling with what to do, I can honestly say that is not a problem for us. Quilters seem to be amazingly resilient and incredibly generous. The donations that have been dropped off last month and the first part of May are amazing.

Members have contributed to a two-month inventory which includes: 14 standard sized baby quilts (including Baby Cakes), 16 flannel receiving blankets, 15 large lap quilts, 20 holiday quilts, 1 large Patriotic quilt, 3 family sized quilts, 5 Teddy Bear quilts, 26 Veterans Cardiac Care Heart pillows and 24 quilt tops. ## Executive Board Meeting Report

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes Date: 5/7/2020

I. The meeting was called to order at 6:34 pm by President T. Spinn via Zoom remote audio/visual conferencing and with roll call a quorum was determined to be present. PRESENT: Tim Spinn, President; Crystal Dudley, Vice-President; Mary Jamora, Treasurer; Beth Hasenauer, Recording Secretary; Sharon Bishop, Communications; Elke Miyahara, Parliamentarian; Nancy Turney & Flo Cohen, Programs & Workshops; Rebecca Fletcher, Membership; Ellen Gray, Newsletter; Rasa Read, Fundraising; Cindy Abrams, Loving Hands NOT PRESENT: Homa Asef & Judy Parker, Membership; Colleen Shier, Advisor

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

### III. BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS

**Vice President/Dudley:** SCCQG Meet the Teachers is now cancelled for 9/12/2020. Looking to reschedule for March/April 2021. SCCQG distributed the teacher list that had signed up to present at Meet the Teachers event in case we wish to contact them independently for programs/workshops. SCCQG Road to CA 2021 display will be the theme "Sharing our Quilts". There is no size restriction but prefer wall quilts to accommodate as many as possible. Entries must have been made between 2019/2020. Entry Deadline is 11/1/2020 for completed entry form, pictures and a self-addressed stamped envelope. Entry form is on SCCQG website. July SCCQG meeting has not been cancelled yet. May Guild meeting has been cancelled with the church. Emailed with administration regarding payment and if we are not using the facility, we will not be charged.

**Treasurer/Jamora:** Presented April Report. No significant operating income during April. Fundraising income consisted of the venue refund from the Glendale Civic for the show. Operational expenses were primarily for website maintenance. Review of proposed budget for next year 2020/2021 beginning in July. This is a straightforward barebones budget. Removed any line item that hadn't had activity for the last 2 years. Budgeted what it costs for the Guild to conduct business on a regular basis. Included an increase for the storage unit expenses. Operating income for the year is in flux not knowing how physical distancing will play out. Have estimated that we likely won't be able to resume Guild meetings until September 2020 at the earliest. Did not include Bingo or Dine-in in the budget as we don't know if we will be able to do these events. We need to consider what to do with the current Opportunity Quilt SuperBloom. Can we/do we carry it over to next year. Need to talk with the Secretary of State to find out whether a carryover of the opportunity quilt is a feasible option. Will have a fundraising shortfall. The Guild would still have money even if we went through the year without any fundraising. There is no way we can figure out how to solve this until we have more answers/guidance from County and State. Need to hold an election in May and June. Vote and approve the budget and installation of officers. **Motion** (F. Cohen) Approve the budget for fiscal year 2020/2021 as presented. (E. Miyahara-second) Board accept budget as presented to present to membership (Elke second). All approved. No abstentions. Will present the budget to the membership for approval.

**Communications Secretary/Bishop:** Not heard of anyone in the Guild that is sick with COVID. Or anything else. Flo's brother has passed away. Kingdom Sewing was broken into twice and had 5 sewing machines stolen.

**Parliamentarian/Miyahara:** Election candidates. Kathi Wilson is not available to accept the Loving Hands position at this time. Cindy Abrams has indicated that she would be willing to continue as Loving Hands chair in the interim. **Motion:** (B. Hasenauer) Move to allow Cindy Abrams to continue as LH chair for another year (M. Jamora second). Discussion. President can appoint someone. All in favor. Motion carries. Have the ballots ready to go with Survey Monkey. Nominations stand.

**Programs Flo/Workshops:** Turney/Cohen. Spoke to Lloyd Askew and he will come back when we can have him. April speaker will return in 2021. No outside speakers until August.

**Membership/Fletcher:** Discussed finalizing membership forms. Made significant changes to new membership and renewal forms to include ability to indicate interest in various areas. Judy Parker will set up database with this information. Committee heads are responsible for looking at the database for updated information. Submit any changes to Tim and he will revise and send out for review. These changes will be applied to both the new member and renewal forms. Final versions of both forms with the recommended changes will be published in the June Newsletter and put on the website.

**Newsletter/Gray:** Articles are due 5/19/2020. Liked overview of Board members. Mailed 9 newsletters. Betty Fischer appreciated receiving the newsletter by mail and sent a donation to help defray costs.

**Fundraising 2019/Read:** Nothing to report. Opportunity Quilt. Need to have a new opportunity quilt for next year and to develop alternate avenues by which to sell tickets for the current quilt. Are we allowed to sell tickets on the website? Need to find out what we legally can do in terms of the state regulations regarding raffle sales. Most likely can download a form to purchase the tickets but cannot pay online. Look at creating a form and put on website to sell tickets. Place in every email blast. Rasa and Beth will work on a form.

**Loving Hands/Abrams:** LH people have been very busy. Supply is now slower than demand for quilts that need binding. Meeting at mask drop-off time for exchanges. Want or need anything contact Cindy.

### Standing and Special Committee Reports:

Email blast: send twice a week. Donate over 1000 masks and caps. Continue as long as it's a need. Contact Tim for the email blast.

Facebook updated with email blast. Rebecca set up an Instagram account. Send to her as well.

### OLD BUSINESS:

**How to hold an election with officers and budget approval.** Do with an email blast where they respond to a specific email address Elke M. for ballots, Mary J. for budget. Next Wednesday 5/13 instead of Guild meeting will have a Zoom meeting inviting people to join and get any questions answered that they have about the ballot/budget and as an opportunity to connect with other Guild members and say Hi and share what they are working on. Election will be conducted through email blast. Mailing to the 9 members who don't have e-mail.

June meeting. Will have old and new Board members at the June meeting. Our Honorary life member for the year is Kathi Wilson. Award at our June meeting. Call and then put in the newsletter. Crystal will write up an article for the June newsletter.

## General Meeting


No General Meeting report due to cancelation of April meeting
