

PINCUSHION Tomato—a tomato with a strawberry attached—was most likely introduced during the Victorian Era. According to folklore, placing a tomato on the mantel of a new house guaranteed prosperity and repelled evil spirits. If tomatoes were out of season, families improvised by using a round ball of red fabric filled with sand or sawdust. The good-luck symbol also served a practical purpose—a place to store pins. Typically, the tomato is filled with wool roving to prevent rust, and the strawberry is filled with an abrasive to clean and sharpen the pins.

Executive Board Meeting Report

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes Date: 10/8/2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:33pm by President M. Jamora via Zoom remote audio/visual conferencing. With a roll call a quorum was determined to be present.

PRESENT: Mary Jamora-President; Beth Hasenauer-Vice-President; Treasurer-Kathy Fogel; Communications-Sharon Bishop; Workshops-Caren Cooke Ryan; Membership Rebecca Fletcher & Judy Parker; Loving Hands - Cindy Abrams; Newsletter-Ellen Gray; Parliamentarian – Elke Miyahara; Advisor – Tim Spinn; Virtual Ambassador – Tina Curran, **NOT PRESENT:** Programs-Robin Lee Hansen; Membership-Homa Asef
The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Vice President/Hasenauer: Superbloom Opportunity Quilt: we are set to participate in the Virtual Quilt Show 11/9-15. This is a great opportunity to advertise the Guild and sell our 2020 Show Buttons. For each button purchased, the buyer will receive 1 booklet (6 tickets), two button, 2 books, etc. The point to make, both at the VQS and on our website is that we are selling the buttons, the tickets are a bonus. The Zoom SCCQG meeting is on Saturday, October 10, the topic being “Transitioning Board Members & Biannual Leadership Panel Discussion”. There will be breakout rooms for each Officer position. M. Jamora, K. Fogel, B. Hasenauer, C. Abrams, R. Fletcher, C. Ryan and E. Miyahara plan on attending. The 2021 Opportunity Quilt has been selected. It is a donated quilt with a southwestern themed/rich jewel tones. Beth is working on getting the interfacing on the back taken out, then Susan Edwards will do the quilting. Help is needed for the handwork/binding. Sharon and Elke will help and Beth will seek out others as well. A contest to name the quilt was suggested to help get the Guild members involved, Beth will work on getting better pictures taken to help show it off to the members at a meeting. A raffle date needs to be decided as well – the discussion seemed to favor our current January to December timeframe. Road 2 California has cancelled their in-person format for 2021, will be working on presenting Road at Home. Special exhibit status is unknown at this time. We hope to have the 2021 Opp Quilt completed and ready for this. Beth is looking at a couple system to see about streamlining and helping adapt to keeping track of opportunity ticket sales in our more virtual world. Two she is considering are rafflecreator.com and rallyup.com to see if they are worth including. Annual SCCQG 2021 Meet the teachers is 4/10/21 via Zoom

Treasurer/Fogel The September and YTD report was given (see report emailed out prior to meeting for details) – Income: great response to membership outreach, good amount in from Opportunity Ticket sales, primarily from renewals. Expense: Normal expenses with one exception - \$672.85 for our 5 year renewal of the glendalequiltguild.org domain name (\$184.95), info@glendalequiltguild.org email (\$219.95) and privacy protection: (\$49.95). This is not related to our website hosting site (Weebly), or to the work being done on the website redesign. Additional costs were to switch from a fiscal year billing to Weebly to an annual so an additional \$8 per month for 6 months was also included in that amount. Our class booking system, Bookwhen, annual fee is due in October. We pay the lowest (other than free, which is not usable for us) available, \$15 per month (\$180 per year, but if paid in full saves \$30 at \$150). Even though this is a system we will eventually eliminate, we don't have a time-frame and it is being used regularly now, so will go ahead and make a payment. Discussion surrounding the use of PayPal from our Website directly is being reviewed. (The current use is to go to the Website, which directs you to Bookwhen, which sends you to PayPal.) Questions regarding the use of apps like Venmo (owned by PayPal) and Zelle were addressed. Venmo specifically states that cases NOT supported are: selling goods or services in person, receiving payment for goods or services through the app or facilitating peer-to peer transactions between two Venmo users. They were created for “friends and family” money transfers, so are not feasible at this time.

Communications Secretary/Bishop Elvie Quintos had knee surgery, then had an appendicitis attack and during surgery they discovered cancer. She is undergoing treatment.

Parliamentarian/Miyahara: No report

Programs & Workshops/Ryan: Caren presented the October (Misty Cole) and November (Diane Harris) Programs and Workshops, now available for sign-ups New presenters approved were: Michelle Banton, Cotton to Commerce Lecture only; Meg Cox, Behind the Scenes.... Lecture only; Timna Tarr, Flying Colors Lecture only with members pointed to her site for a variety of classes available at \$35 each, and Jane Haworth, Living a Creative Life lecture only. Another Presenter, Natalya Khorover (Lecture & Workshop) will be presented at the next Board meeting.

It was recommended that if we do not have a workshop with the Program person, we may want to have a member-led workshop at a small fee to provide other options for members. Issues some presenters may have with their technology that limits our ability to see/hear their work was discussed, and the option to not pay their entire fee (or a portion of) may be something we need to include in future contracts

Caren has worked hard to complete the calendar for the year and into next year, contracts have been signed for several months in the future and work will continue to go forward to fill our needs and stay within the approved budgets. Several members have been participating in the Global Quilt Connection Virtual presentations (5 so far). Each one has approximately 30 presenters to choose from, the top 5 from each are picked and added to the list of potential options for the Guild.

Everyone needs to provide Caren feedback on her December Activities that was forwarded to the Board.

Membership: Fletcher/Parker: Rebecca & Judy, with phone calls, emails and snail mail work have brought us to renewals at 90% !!! The roster is now being created and will be mailed out in a few weeks. Judy will get some support from Tim if there are questions on the process. Gift bags with donated items, primarily from Loving Hands stash have been mailed out to all the new members. Officer bars for membership pins: If anyone would like to have one, please contact Judy and she will take care of this.

Newsletter/Gray: Anything for the next newsletter is due by Tuesday, October 20. Discussion regarding the “For Sale” section of the newsletter concluded that it will only have quilt supplies and will only be for Guild members at this time. There two sewing machines still in the boxes that were ordered years ago and could be sold.

Loving Hands: C. Abrams: Loving Hands donations and participation continues to go well. Cindy proposed the dates thru the end of the year and for the first months of 2021. Most looked very doable, she will work with others to verify any competing dates and finalize them. The annual Holiday Luncheon is up in the air. Beth offered to work with Cindy for options on this, they will discuss offline to see if there is something that makes sense. A friend of Guild member Nancy Turney does long-arming and donates to local Red Cross. Cindy looked through our Loving Hands stash of larger tops and donated 20 for her to complete and donate.

OLD BUSINESS: The very detailed, excellent Procedures and Times for the Block of the Month/Block Exchanges & Quilt Challenge was approved. Kathy Fogel made the motion to approve, Rebecca Fletcher seconded it and the Board unanimously approved. This will be posted online with our other Procedure manuals. Tim, partnering with Caren, will start a new BOM. It will be a BOM/Block Party combo. Make one or several, keep one, turn the others in. Tim will introduce it at the November meetings, first block pattern in December and share in January. This will be a six-month process, the final follow-up will be in July 2021.

NEW BUSINESS: Mary shared an item from the Modern Quilt Guild that was asking for responses to a Grassroots Response to Covid-19 PPE story they are putting together. The Board agreed that this was a good opportunity to get the word to them about what our Guild has been doing since March 2020 to help with the cause. Several members will work with Mary to coordinate a phone call interview with them to share our story. The Calendar with Guild activities for the next couple of months was presented.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by President M. Jamora via Zoom remote audio/visual conferencing with 52 participants in attendance. Reminders given to participants to limit background noise by muting themselves unless they were to speak/comment to the group and to use the chat function to sign in for attendance and if there were any questions. The next Board meeting will be November 5th, the next General meeting on November 11. The following guests were present: Vicki Chase, Tracy Larinto, Kathy Fujiki and Tom Meyer. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

PROGRAM: Robin Lee Hansen introduced our visiting program presenter, Misty Cole. The presentation was Poison Bottle Quilt. Misty gave a very entertaining and informative presentation on the history and use of Poison Bottles along with samples of the quilts she has made based on those bottles. A question and answer time was held after the main presentation. Members were informed that there were still spaces left for the Saturday class.

BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Vice President/Hasenauer: Superbloom Opportunity Quilt: we are set to participate in the Virtual Quilt Show 11/9-15. This is a great opportunity to advertise the Guild. We hope to have the 2021 Opp Quilt completed and ready for this. The 2022 Road to California will be held January 19 – 22, 2022. A mask making opportunity has come up. A local charity was given fabric, but do not have the talent in-house to make the masks and have asked if we would contribute. Volunteers should contact Beth, make a commitment to make 5 masks, using any mask pattern. The fabric and other necessary items to complete the masks have been packaged and will be ready for pickup on Friday, 10/16 at WAC, the deadline/drop-off date being Friday, 10/23 at WAC. The 2021 Opportunity Quilt has been selected, and pictures of the quilt were shared. It is a donated quilt with a southwestern themed/rich jewel tones. Susan Edwards is doing the quilting. Help is needed for naming the quilt, binding and someone/group to manage the quilt during the year. The Raffle will be held at the December, 2021 meeting.

Treasurer/Fogel: The September and YTD report was given – Income: great response to membership outreach, good amount in from Opportunity Ticket sales, primarily from renewals. Expense: Program/Workshop and payments for our Glendalequiltguild.org domain name and email were the primary amounts in September.

Introducing "STARBUST" – Block of the Month 2021!

A different Star block pattern from McCall's Quilting will be printed in the newsletter each month, for six months, beginning in December 2020. Each pattern makes a 12" finished block. This Block of the Month (BOM) program has two components. Members can choose how they want to participate.

1. Make one block to keep for themselves. At the end of six months we will provide alternate setting options, including how to place your six blocks in a modern setting with negative space. Use any color palette you like, choose a holiday theme, or make them scrappy!
2. Make one, or more, blocks (up to five), to turn in for the Block Party. A lucky winner or winners will be selected from the participants who turn in blocks. Each month the Block Party will have a different color theme, which will be provided with the quilt block instructions in the newsletter.

Fabric Requirements for six blocks, or make it scrappy:

1/2 yard of 3 coordinating colors (approximate)

3/4 yard of light background of your choice

An additional 3/4 yard of light background fabric will be needed to "make it Modern".

- The final month we will have some setting ideas for you.


