


DIMENSIONS: 12" SQUARE FINISHED




INGREDIENTS


Fabric A	(1) 2.5" x 12.5" (2) 2.5" x 10.5" (1) 2.5" x 3.5"	(2) 2" x 2.5" (1) 1.5" x 8.5" (4) 1.5" square
Fabric B	(2) 1.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric C	(2) 2.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric D	(2) 1.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric E	(2) 1.5" x 2.5"	

INSTRUCTIONS

1 Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 1.5" background squares. Match with the top ends of the 1.5" x 7.5" pieces of Fabrics B and D. Sew along the marked diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line and press. Repeat to make 4 total units.




2 Sew the units created in Step 1 to each side of a Fabric C rectangle. Repeat to make 2 popsicles.




3 Sew the Popsicle sticks (Fabric E) and background pieces in a row together as shown.



4 Sew the popsicles together and attach the row of popsicle sticks.



5 Sew the bordering background pieces to the popsicles. Start with the 1.5" x 8.5" piece under the popsicle sticks, then add the two 2.5" x 10.5" pieces to the left and right sides. Finally, sew the 2.5" x 12.5" piece to the top.



This block measures 12.5" square unfinished.




DIMENSIONS: 12" SQUARE FINISHED




INGREDIENTS


Fabric A	(1) 2.5" x 12.5" (2) 2.5" x 10.5" (1) 2.5" x 3.5"	(2) 2" x 2.5" (1) 1.5" x 8.5" (4) 1.5" square
Fabric B	(2) 1.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric C	(2) 2.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric D	(2) 1.5" x 7.5"	
Fabric E	(2) 1.5" x 2.5"	

INSTRUCTIONS

1 Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 1.5" background squares. Match with the top ends of the 1.5" x 7.5" pieces of Fabrics B and D. Sew along the marked diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line and press. Repeat to make 4 total units.




2 Sew the units created in Step 1 to each side of a Fabric C rectangle. Repeat to make 2 popsicles.




3 Sew the Popsicle sticks (Fabric E) and background pieces in a row together as shown.



4 Sew the popsicles together and attach the row of popsicle sticks.



5 Sew the bordering background pieces to the popsicles. Start with the 1.5" x 8.5" piece under the popsicle sticks, then add the two 2.5" x 10.5" pieces to the left and right sides. Finally, sew the 2.5" x 12.5" piece to the top.

Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes Date: 3/5/2020

I. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President T. Spinn @ Glendale Woman's Athletic Club and a quorum was present. PRESENT: Tim Spinn, President; Crystal Dudley, Vice-President; Mary Jamora, Treasurer; Beth Hasenauer, Recording Secretary; Sharon Bishop, Communications; Nancy Turney, Programs & Workshops; Rebecca Fletcher, Membership; Ellen Gray, Newsletter; Rasa Read, Fundraising; Cindy Abrams, Loving Hands; Kathi Wilson, Guest NOT PRESENT: Elke Miyahara, Parliamentarian; Flo Cohen, Programs & Workshops; Homa Asef & Judy Parker, Membership; Colleen Shier, Advisor

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS

Vice President/Dudley: SCCQG Quarterly Meeting Saturday April 18 "Meet the Teachers" 48 teachers will be presenting. Deadline for ordering lunch is Wednesday 4/1. Let Crystal know if you plan to attend and if you want to order a lunch. It would be optimal to have those members who are nominees for Programs/Workshops Board positions attending this SCCQG quarterly. Theme for SCCQG special exhibit at Road to CA 2021 will be announced. Bring fabric donations no smaller than 21 x 21 to the meeting; it will be used to make surgical caps for children at pediatric hospitals.

Treasurer/Jamora: Presented February report. Income and expenses are on track for YTD. Audit report complete. Audit team of 4 guild members performed a random review of 4 months from the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Summary of recommendations: Written procedures were not being consistently followed – Adhere to documentation requirements ensuring all cash and checks given to treasurer are accompanied by an income/expense form; Adhere to the Treasurer's calendar in procedures to avoid late filings 2018 Raffle report was filed late (3/2019) and handwritten changes on reports must be initialed and dated by the report author. Please see the Treasurer for the complete Audit report.

Communications Secretary/Bishop: Marie Watterlond's son passed away after a long battle with cancer.

Parliamentarian/Miyahara: (Spinn) no report.

Programs/Workshops: Turney: This month's speaker is Kathi Wilson talking about her quilt journey and No Workshop because of the show.

Membership/Fletcher: 4 new members for a current total of 129 members. Membership will be available at the quilt show and will have membership applications and brochures. **Motion** (C. Abrams) New members joining the Guild at the Quilt Show 3/28 and 3/29/2020 will receive a coupon for \$10.00 off an upcoming GQG workshop. This coupon will expire June 2021. **Second:** M. Jamora. **Discussion:** Postcards distributed at the show will also waive the \$5.00 guest fee to attend if presented at a general meeting. All these measures are to encourage membership. Vote: Unanimous. Motion passed. Membership will disseminate program suggestions and new member interests to current board /committees which can be used in planning for the upcoming year and getting new members involved in Guild activities.

Newsletter/Gray: Articles are due 3/17/2020

Fundraising 2019/Read: Quilt show 2020. Goal: Be on time and on budget. Financial sponsorship of Awards and Judging has exceeded funding requirements. Individual donors have been very generous. Everything is coming together. Everyone jumped in to get it done. We have 182 quilts entered.

Loving Hands/Abrams: report in the newsletter. Terrific response by members to the Baby cakes quilt. Many quilts being cut and quilted. Will add a picture section for Loving Hands on the website so these quilts can be seen. Consider a rotating picture display at June meeting.

Standing and Special Committee Reports:

Email blast: send items to Tim.

Dine-IN/Jamora: Next Dine-In will be at IHOP on Glendale Ave/134 intersection tentative date Wednesday April 22. Pending confirmation by IHOP. Mary will confirm to ensure there is no conflict with our April general meeting date.

Nominating Committee: Kathy Fogel, Kathi Wilson with Crystal Dudley and Elke Miyahara.

OLD BUSINESS:

Stitches revenue updated to \$1233.00.

Removing the Doctor's House Museum exhibit from agenda until after the show

2021 Calendar updated the following LH dates: LH will move to Friday 1/15/2021 and remove guild workshop on Saturday 1/16/2021 d/t Road to CA. Also move LH to 12/10/2021 from 12/17/21.

40th Anniversary of the Quilt Show: Guild officially became an association in 1982 but the first show was held in 1980. As a tribute Guild members are creating Babycakes quilts to be donated to LH. Have a celebration cake to go with the Baby cakes display. Possibly July 2021.

2021 Opportunity Quilt: need to generate ideas for quilt. Start in April and May. Consider raffling a refurbished/repainted Featherweight that was donated to the Guild. In order to participate in Road to CA we would need to have an Opportunity quilt. Could combine the Featherweight with a smaller quilt. Remember for a raffle our expenses can't be more than 10% of what we earn.

NEW BUSINESS

Large Fabric Donation (K. Wilson-guest): We have received a LARGE fabric donation from an anonymous donor. It has already been separated and bagged by colors and themes. 150 bags. In honor of St. Patrick's Day will sell the green fabric at the March Guild meeting. **Motion** (N. Turney): Request the Board approval to allocate \$100.00 for WAC rental fee to use the clubhouse for a one day fabric sale. (Second: E. Gray) Discussion: Will organize to have a fabric sale of remaining donation, inviting local guilds with a date range beginning in April to end of May Have outside Guild party sale of fabric and unused storage items at WAC. Would like to get organized and date finalized with WAC Board so could advertise at the Quilt show. Vote: Unanimous approval.

June Block Exchange (K. Wilson-guest): Popsicle quilt from Moda. We have their permission to use the pattern for this block exchange. Kick off in April with exchange in June.

Tim has forms for tickets to participate in St Patrick's Day bingo at VFW in La Crescenta if anyone is interested. COVID19 and possible effect on show (T. Spinn): Acknowledge this could be an issue. If city of Glendale declares an emergency then we will have an emergency Board meeting of some sort to discuss how to proceed with the show. Absent this, we will proceed as planned.

General Meeting Report

Glendale Quilt Guild General Membership Meeting Minutes Date: 3/11/2020

I. The **meeting** was called to order by President Spinn at 6:30 p.m. at the First United Methodist Church of Glendale – Carlson Fellowship Center.

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Next Board Meeting is Thursday April 2, 2020. Next Guild meeting is Wednesday April 15, 2020. Note: this is the THIRD Wednesday of the month.

Quilt Show 2020 and Covid19 – Discussion of Options (T. Spinn): As a group we need to decide what to do regarding the Quilt Show. The situation regarding Covid19 is rapidly changing daily. Many of our members and our targeted audience are in the high risk populations most severely affected by this virus. We are so close and have put in so much work, this is a very difficult topic to discuss without getting emotional. Currently the City of Glendale is not telling us to postpone and the LA County Dept. of Health has a lot of information. The Glendale Civic will refund our money if we cancel the show before 3/18/2020. **MOTION:** (A. Smith) (Second-H. Bell): Glendale Quilt Guild postpones the Quilt Show scheduled to take place on March 28 & 29, 2020 to a later date yet to be determined. **Discussion:** Move the show to 2021 instead of trying to do it later in 2020 – too many unknowns; if we go ahead, will there be enough people in the guild to pick up the load after those who have health reasons to stay away cannot help out, from a vendors perspective, would prefer to defer the show to improve proceeds, if we cancel the show will we be refunded for the tickets we bought in advance. We should go ahead as planned as we have everything ready and the Boutique is in the can. There does not seem to be virus data that warrants a cancellation or postponement. Cancellations are showing a spread of fear which is more destructive than the virus itself. Our vendors as small business owners will lose out. I think resilience is more important to our health communities and economy than social distancing. We cannot construe cancellations and postponements of events solely to mass hysteria and fear. There is a solid scientific rationale behind these steps. We currently don't have a treatment to cure the virus. We cannot stop the spread of the virus but we can slow it down by practicing prudent hygiene measures and social distancing. Social distancing slows the spread by decreasing the total number of individuals put at risk at one time, known as flattening the curve. This does not overwhelm the health care system at once. Our hospital capacity is not infinite. We need to do our share for ourselves, our family, friends and others who would attend our show to not risk spreading the virus to others. **VOTE:** Approximately 66 members attending – less than 1/3 in favor of continuing and having the show; more than 2/3's in favor of canceling the show. The Motion carries. The show will be postponed to a later date to be determined. We now need to find ways to have fun!

Small Quilt Challenge: All the 'Please don't touch the Quilts' small quilts are displayed. Vote for your favorite. The winner will be announced at the April meeting.

Fabric Sale tonight of green fabric in celebration of St Patrick's Day. \$1.00/pound. We received a very large fabric donation which has been organized by color and theme by GQG members Dolly Anderson and Chris Hogan. We plan to have a big fabric sale inviting local guilds to participate. The date for this as of yet unknown d/t the uncertain circumstances surrounding COVID 19. We may just continue with selling one color a month.

American Legion has scheduled a St. Patrick's Day Bingo on Saturday March 14. Flyers are available.

IV. BOARD REPORTS

Vice President/Dudley: SCCQG meeting scheduled for Saturday 4/18/2020 "Meet the Teachers" event in Carson. Supposed to hear from 48 teachers. Let Crystal know if you are interested in going. 4/1 is deadline to order lunch. You received a ballot for honorary life long membership. Please place your ballot in the ballot box on the back table.

Treasurer/Jamora: Presented the February Report. Overall income and expenses for the guild are on target.

Communications Secretary/Bishop: Vie Bos's daughter is not well. Marie Watterlond's son has passed after a long battle with cancer, Jackie Carlos has come down with chicken pox as her husband simultaneously dealt with a case of shingles. Annie Raycraft will celebrate her 94th birthday tomorrow 3/12. Leanne Compean is moving to Palm Desert in 2 months where she and her husband have bought a house.

Parliamentarian/Miyahara (Fogel): Nominating committee is meeting to put together a slate that will be presented to the membership at the April Guild meeting.

Programs & Workshops/Cohen-Turney: This month is our own Kathi Wilson talking about her inspirations and quilt making journey. No workshop in March. In April Ann Turley will be speaking and her workshop will be on making faces; you will learn about perspective. In May Lloyd Askew will talk about the history of the sewing machine. The workshop will be in the am and pm and will show you how to service your featherweight. You will get \$10.00 off the cost if you take both workshops.

Membership/Asef-Fletcher-Parker: 1 new member and 2 returning previous members are here tonight.

Newsletter/Gray: Articles due on Tuesday March 17, 2020
