What makes a quilt truly exceptional? Do we even agree on what beauty is? Why is it that some quilts just seem to “pop” while others made with the same pattern or using the same colors turn out just fine? Join us for our program meeting on Wednesday, February 12th, to hear our speaker Karen Brow-Meier

(www.javahousequilts.com) talk about “The Science of Exceptional Quilts.” This lecture is about creativity, inspiration and motivation. Karen will discuss



where good ideas come from, how our emotions affect creativity, and even the affect that room color, time of day or fabric limitation might have on our ability to create. This fascinating subject has the benefit of much scientific research. Viewed through the lens and experiences of a quilter, Karen will shed new light on how we create, solve quilting problems and ultimately do our best work.

Join us again on Saturday, February 15th, when Karen will teach us how to create a very special and practical cloth critter, her signature Remote Toad. At the end of the workshop you’ll go home with a finished, free-standing toad that is adorable on its own but is even more remarkable because it will hold your AV remote, your glasses, your cutting tools, or even those keys you are always misplacing. This toad would be a perfect gift for Mother’s or Father’s Day and would make a wonderful item to be sold in the boutique during our upcoming Glendale Quilt Show. Best of all, most of the required materials are already in your stash!



The President's Block



Legacy (noun): something transmitted by or received from an ancestor or predecessor or from the past.

With the 40th anniversary of the Glendale Quilt Show upon us it has come to mind what a fantastic legacy we continue to receive from Carol Andrews. She originally created the quilt show because she saw how much joy her students received by showing off their quilts to each other. Then she took action to have the first quilt show, and the rest is Glendale Quilt Guild History. Carol's idea and the later creation of the quilt guild has gifted many with a love of quilts and quilting.

Quilts and quilting are a gift in my life. I learned how to make quilts from my mother. She became obsessed with creating Log Cabin quilts in the Eleanor Burns method in the 1980's and somehow hooked me in, too. I bought my first sewing machine in 1992. I lived in Burbank then. I had no quilting friends. I just had books to learn how to make quilts, first Eleanor Burns and then many others. I remember seeing a huge banner at the Burbank Hilton "Glendale Quilt Show". I thought that maybe I should go to see what it was all about. Guess what? I didn't go.

Remember the 90's? We didn't have personal computers in every home. We didn't have internet yet. We didn't have Google!!! We didn't have YouTube or Pinterest. So, in the 90's I quilted alone here in California, and sometimes with my mother and sister in Oregon. I took a class at Quilt'n Things. It was just me, by myself, sewing, making mistakes, sewing and learning from my mistakes. My mother's legacy to me is a love of making quilts. Eleanor Burns' legacy to me, and millions of fans, are her books. Step by step guides with pictures on how to make quilt blocks with "nesting seams", how to put blocks together with seams that lay flat, how to make a quilt. Not necessarily in a day, but....eventually.

I have made quilts continually since 1992, but only joined the Glendale Quilt Guild in 2012. Twenty years passed between seeing the sign "Glendale Quilt Show" and me walking into the Glendale library to a guild meeting. I never even attended a show in those 20 years. I did join the Glendale Quilt Guild at the very first meeting, even before I knew what was going on! I walked up to the Membership table and Annette Guerrero greeted me. Then she asked did I want to join! So I did. I didn't know what else to say. I am glad I did. I found a tribe! I found a family. A group of people who love making quilts, and gifting quilts, just like I do. Wow. Carol's legacy in action.

Quilts are legacy items. I have a quilt made by a great-great grandmother between 1910 and 1913 when it was gifted to her daughter on her wedding day. The grandmother's flower garden quilt is in beautiful condition. I store it in a cotton pillow case to keep it fresh and out of the light. Imagine a quilt made 109 years ago. Still beautiful, usable, and filled with all of the love it has received in those years? Surely, Lula Bains Richardson put a lot of love into hand piecing all of those hexagons made from old dresses and clothing. Her daughter, Lena Richardson Kelley, surely loved the quilt. My step-mom Sheila Spinn spent many hours under that quilt as she recovered from a childhood illness, and she surely loves that quilt. I love it too. It is a legacy. From Lula all the way to me, and eventually to another family member in the line.

When I gift a quilt I always put a label on it. Do you know why? It is because of the quilt Lula made. I know the story of her quilt because my dear stepmom knows the story. Isn't it exciting to think that a quilt of mine, or of yours, will be here in 100 years? If there isn't a label, how will they know who made it, or where it was made, or for whom? Quilts tell a story of love. Make sure your name is on your story.

The Quilt Show is almost here. We need your help! Please come to the Quilt Show meeting to get involved. If you can't make a meeting, call Rasa Read and ask "How can I help?" There is a lot of work to do, and I know together we can do it. It will be a homecoming, a party, a celebration of our love of quilting.

I look forward to seeing you all in February!




Super Bloom

With “Super Bloom” completed and presented at our December meeting, January was all about preparing for the quilt’s debut at the Road to California quilt show at the end of the month. Every year we have a postcard made featuring a photo of our opportunity quilt to help sell the raffle tickets. That means that a beauty shot of the quilt had to be taken. On the right is the wonderful photo Rasa Read took of our quilt.



You may wonder how someone takes such a good and square photo of a quilt that is so large (nearly 8’ x 8’). As seen on the left, Rasa realized years ago that her home is serendipitously designed so that she can take a great photo of a quilt spread out on her driveway from a second story window. That’s how creative quilters are! (Her friend Daina took this photo.)



As done in the past, we’ll have a smaller version of the Super Bloom quilt as the prize for the guild member who sells the most raffle tickets for this year’s opportunity quilt. In the three sessions of poppy block-making last fall, we made 77 blocks for the main quilt and another 18 for the smaller version.



On the right, you can see the smaller version in process. Of the five sizes of poppies used in the big quilt, this one uses the three smallest sizes and will finish at 25” x 40”.


The Thread of the Story

Request for Submissions

The Glendale Quilt Guild will present a quilt show at the Glendale Civic Auditorium on March 28/29 2020. The show will include a special exhibit, The Thread of the Story, quilts with narratives. The stories of these quilts will have particular historical/cultural/social significance for the families who treasure them. We want to exhibit quilts that illustrate a historical event or journey or pilgrimage or celebration or natural wonder, as examples.

If your family has a story quilt and you are willing to exhibit the quilt and its story, please contact Hester Bell by email or phone (hbelle@rsabg.org or 626-794-1790). Please be prepared to send dimensions and a photo or photos of your quilt along with a brief summary of the quilt's story.

Quilts will be exhibited in a secure, air-conditioned facility. There is no entrance fee to exhibit story quilts. Glendale Quilt Guild will not pay to exhibit a quilt. All decisions about inclusion of a quilt in this exhibit will be made by Hester Bell (exhibit organizer) and Rasa Read (quilt show chairwoman).



Small Quilt Challenge: Please Don't Touch the Quilts

Rules are simple. Make a small quilt which delivers the message, "Please don't touch the quilts". Be as creative as you want!

- Width can be between 8 and 12 inches
- Height can be between 8 and 12 inches
- Piece must be quilted and finished and ready for display, no hanging sleeve is necessary
- Sign your name and year on the back

We have pieced blocks available if you would like to begin with an already pieced quilt block! Quilts will be displayed at the March General meeting and members can vote on their favorite.

Participants agree that all quilts will be donated to the Glendale Quilt Guild for use at Quilt Shows or other events, and will be displayed throughout the March 2020 Quilt Show. Favorites will be announced at the April General meeting.


