I am sorry I missed the February meeting, but I am grateful to Crystal Dudley and the Board for stepping up to the plate in my absence. I hope you all received the notice about there being no heat and were all prepared.

Recently a member who had previously served on the Board received a suspicious email. It did not come from my email address. The email said "I need your help. I am out of town and I need you to handle this for the Glendale Quilt Guild. We need some gift cards for donation to Veterans at Hospice Care and welfare with patients and units across the state." It closed with my name, Glendale Quilt Guild, President.

Thankfully the member contacted me to see if it was a real request and a costly mistake was avoided. This kind of scam has been documented but people fall for them because they sound so real. I was out of town. My mom was even in hospice. We do donate quilts to veterans. The only clue that it wasn't from me was that it did not come from my email address and the member suspected something was wrong. Plus, we don't do business using gift cards.

Never purchase gift cards for any reason when they are requested in an email or by phone.

Per the FTC website: Gift cards are for gifts, not for payments. Gift cards are the number one payment method that imposters demand. They might pose as IRS officials and say you're in trouble for not paying taxes; or a family member with an emergency; or a public utility company threatening to shut off your water; or even a service member selling something before deployment. Or they might call with great news – you've won a contest or a prize! But to get it, you need to pay fees with a gift card. Scammers will say anything to get your money. And they know how to play into your fears, hopes, or sympathies. They like gift cards because, once they've got the code on the back, the money is gone and almost impossible to trace.

Please share this information with all of your friends!! Fight against the scammers!

The Quilt Show is upon us. When I was a new member I considered the Glendale Quilt Show to be an event to attend, and spent some time volunteering, as is required in the By-Laws. As I grew more familiar with the Quilt Show I saw how hard some members were working to make it a success. I pitched in some more. Now, I don't consider the Glendale Quilt Show to be an event for me to attend and to maybe do some hours volunteering. I consider it a job. I am available during the hours of the show to assist where ever help is needed. The members of the Quilt Show committee and the Executive Board approach the show in the same way. Many of our members remember the days when the Quilt Show was the financial engine of the guild and they treat the weekend as a time to give as much time as possible to the Quilt Show. These members are all dedicated 100% to the success of the show.

I encourage all members to make yourselves available to help in the ways that you can. Not everyone has the same mobility or stamina, but everyone can be a Hostess or a Host to the people coming to our house, I mean quilt show. If you see a need please consider how you can help to fill it. We don't have the numbers of members that we had in the past, so we may all have to do a little more to make this show a success. I look forward to this Quilt Show on our 40th Anniversary and I hope you are too. I thank everyone who is involved and dedicated to making this show a success.

Now that we have our beautiful new Opportunity Quilt, Super Bloom, we need someone to be in charge of her appointment bookings. Please let me know if you are willing to take on this task. You will have a lot of help to take her on outings with enough planning and Rasa will be a great resource with all of the places we visited last year.






Baby Cakes Cutting Diagram

(+Yellow scrap for flame)




Flame Template




Baby Cakes Background Fabric Needs

II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

President/Dudley: Another \$45 has been added to the money made at the Stitches event. Tim will update the report. We received a thank you note from Carol Andrews for the lovely cards she has been receiving regarding the 40th Anniversary of the first Quilt Show of Glendale. A thank you note and gift card was received from the seniors group that rode the bus to ROAD2CA with us. The gift card can be used for supplies.

Vice President/Dudley: The next SCCQG meeting is Meet the Teachers on April 18. There will be no opportunity quilts at this meeting. Let Crystal know if you wish to attend.

Treasurer/Jamora: The Audit has been completed and she will prepare a report for presentation next month.

Communications Secretary/Bishop: Sadly, long-time member and Loving Hands participant, Lauren Haring passed away. Tim Spinn is in Oregon with his mother who is currently in hospice. Beth Hasenauer is back East assisting her parents. Ellen Gray's daughter, Jessica, cut her finger using a rotary cutter while in a class at ROAD2CA with Ellen and Auntie Jackie Carlos. After receiving 3 stitches, Jessica returned to finish the class.

Programs and Workshops/Cohen: The January workshop, Barn Quilts, was hugely successful with the largest number of participants ever. There is some talk of having another workshop due to heightened interest. February brings Java House Quilts, March is Kathi Coleman Wilson and April is Ann Turley.

Newsletter/Gray: Articles are due by February 18.

Fund Raising 2020/Read: The Opportunity Quilt was well received at ROAD2CA. We sold \$370 in opportunity tickets and made \$132 in patterns. Rasa continues to schedule dates for the quilt but needs someone to step up to be in charge of the quilt for the rest of the year. A decorator has been signed for the Quilt Show and Karen Millman is working on sponsors. We have received 140 quilt entries so far which is great but we would like perhaps 20 more. The next Quilt Show committee meetings are February 27 and March 19. Volunteer sign-ups will take place at the February and March Guild meetings.

Loving Hands/Abrams: Cindy thanked Ellen for doing the graphs for the 2019 Loving Hands report in the Newsletter. The Guild continues to be very active and generous in their donations of quilts and related items. A quilting workshop was proposed to help with the back-log of tops needing quilting due to the loss of our prolific long-arm quilters, Craig, Kate, and Lou and Yvette Gallo. Cindy showed a very cute, easy quilt with a cake on it and will offer the pattern to members at a later date.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

Bingo Fund Raiser/Dudley: Tim contacted the VFW/American Legion about having another Bingo Night as a Fund Raiser. They were excited to have us again. A **motion** was made to schedule it for 10/10/2020. The motion was seconded and **passed unanimously**. Planning will get underway after the Quilt Show.

2021 Calendar/Dudley: The proposed Calendar for 2021 was presented. A motion was made to approve the calendar as presented. The motion was seconded and **passed unanimously**. Loving Hands dates will be submitted for approval later.

V. The meeting **adjourned** at 8:12 p.m.

Small Quilt Challenge: Please Don't Touch the Quilts

Don't forget to bring your quilts for the "Please Don't Touch the Quilts" small quilt challenge to the March General Meeting. I am looking forward to seeing all of the creative ways this theme can be approached

A few ideas to get your creativity flowing, in case you haven't started yet:

- Please Look, but Don't Touch
- Looking with your eyes only, keeps our quilts clean
- "Keep your mitts off" with mittens appliqué
- Sun Bonnet Sue Chain Gang (see below example from the Roseville Quilt Show)



Rules are simple. Make a small quilt which delivers the message, "Please don't touch the quilts". Be as creative as you want!

- Width can be between 8 and 12 inches
- Height can be between 8 and 12 inches
- Piece must be quilted and finished and ready for display, no hanging sleeve is necessary
