
Block Party



Glendale Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes 04/08/2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:34pm by President Mary Jamora via Zoom remote audio/video conferencing. With roll call a quorum was determined to be present. **Present:** Mary Jamora – President; Beth Hasenauer – Vice-President; Kathy Fogel – Treasurer; Sharon Bishop – Communications; Robin Lee Hansen – Programs; Caren Cooke Ryan – Workshops; Rebecca Fletcher and Judy Parker – Membership; Cindy Abrams – Loving Hands; Ellen Gray – Newsletter; Elke Miyahara – Parliamentarian; Tim Spinn – Advisor; Tina Curran – Virtual Ambassador. **Not Present:** Homa Asef – Membership; Previous meeting minutes were approved as corrected.

Board and Committee Reports

Vice President/Hasenauer: SCCQG: Meet the Teachers is 4/10/21 via Zoom, Teacher list and schedule have been sent out, Caren has coordinated attendees and rating sheets. Our 2021 Opportunity Quilt will be one of 4 presented at the meeting. Questions regarding the breakout rooms will be answered during the meeting. 2021 Opportunity Quilt: M. Jamora, T. Spinn and B. Hasenauer are contacting SCCQG Member guilds to schedule presentations. 2 were completed in March, 8 presentations are scheduled for April and 3 in May. 4 others are pending Board review. The goal is to get \$2000 in sales from these presentations. New advertising approaches are being discussed and tried out, such as getting the Quilt displayed and promoted from different venues (“Where’s Kokopelli Dancing?”), selling tickets in areas that would support social distancing, etc. Contact has been made with the church to hopefully start conversations regarding both Guild and Church expectations on returning to in-person meetings.

Sharon Bishop made the motion to accept the Slate as presented by the Parliamentarian, Beth Hasenauer seconded; no discussion; Approved unanimously by Board. Bylaws recommendations already approved by the Board were presented, these will be printed in both the Newsletter and in the Email Blast, they will be voted on by the General Meeting attendees in May and put in place in June. See page 9 for details.

Programs and Workshops/Ryan: April speaker and workshop is Ann Turley, “Confessions of the Quilt Police” and “Making Faces Two”. May lecture is Meg Cox, “Behind the Scenes at the Greatest Quilt Museum in the World”, with the speakers’ fee being paid directly to the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln, NE. The May workshop is Brandy Maslowski with “Wine Bottle Bags with Fibre Art Techniques”. Future programs and workshops presented for discussion were Robin Long-Mariners Compass, which was a lecture and workshop, the workshop requiring a book and ruler purchase; Dora Cary workshop “Only One” which is a simplified stack and whack technique. Questions or concerns about cost or other issues should be forwarded to Caren and will be discussed at a later time. February 2022 will be the 40th anniversary of the Guild, and the Board was very positive about a program celebrating this, along with a “Favorite and Worst Sewing Notions” presentation by members, similar to one done several years ago that was very popular. An in-person Selvage Workshop by Kathi Wilson will be scheduled for some time in 2022

Old Business: Block Party –winners will be announced at the April meeting, BOM blocks will be in show and tell. May Block #5 is the Star Flower Block, pattern and instructions have been made available to members.

2022 Opp Quilt – Spinn: The quilt top is complete, the back using Modern Puzzle block kits is in progress.

New Business: 1) Jamora-Website Update: Presented an update of the new website plan and development, with an explanation of the process that has been taking place with the Tech Team. The current plan, with the approval of the Board, is to move forward to build the new website while continuing with the current site. The cost of the hosting is \$96, which was approved by the board. The cost for actually building the site will be estimated and presented at a future Board meeting. Our current webmaster will continue to work on the existing site until the new site has been built, tested and approved. Mary will be sending out a copy of the presentation materials so that the Board can review and make comments/suggestions, which should be forwarded to her. Those will be discussed with the Tech Team. 2) Discussions regarding what our next steps should be as we start to transition back to a new “normal” for our General Meetings. What is the timing? What type of combination of Zoom/In-Person would work for both local and out-of-area members as well as those who may not want to participate in person yet? Work needs to be done to coordinate with the meeting place to see what their requirements will be as well as what we as a Guild are going to require. Technology needs to be identified and resolved prior to returning to in-person meetings. Members should be surveyed to see what their choice might be. Mary will be sending out a copy of these and other questions for review and suggestions, to be discussed at a future meeting. Some Board members will be attending both in-person and hybrid in-person/Zoom meetings in the next month and will report back to discuss how they worked out.

GQG BYLAWS CHANGE RECOMMENDATIONS

Below is a list of recommendations already approved by the Board and are now ready for a vote by the Guild Membership at the next General Meeting in May. Please take the time to read through them. All new wording in different sections is noted in red. All wording to be removed is crossed out. If you have any questions, please contact the committee members: Mary Jamora, Beth Hasenauer, Rebecca Fletcher, Nancy Turney or Elke Miyahara.

RECOMMENDATION #1: Incorporate the Electronic Meetings document received from the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG). This should not be a separate section, but incorporated in existing sections of GQG Bylaws and Standing Rules.

RECOMMENDATION #2: Remove the specific day of the second week to hold the General Meeting.

SECTION 3.04(a) Meetings of the General Membership - General Meeting Date and Location

General meetings shall be held ~~the second Wednesday week of every month~~ **monthly. This may be an electronic meeting using an internet meeting service that provides at a minimum, for all participants to be able to see and/or hear each other simultaneously. A member participating by this means is deemed to be present in person at the e-meeting.**

SECTION 5.05(a) Regular Board Meetings and Quorum

“Regular Meeting(s)” of the Executive Board shall be held once a month. **This may be an electronic meeting using an internet meeting service that provides at a minimum, for all participants to be able to see and/or hear each other simultaneously. A member participating by this means is deemed to be present in person at the e-meeting.** A Quorum to conduct business of the Executive Board is six (6) Officers. In the case of a tie vote on any issue, the President shall cast the deciding vote.

SECTION 5.05(c) Special Meetings of the Board “Special Meetings” of the Board may be called:

- By the President,
- Upon the specific written request of three (3) Officers of the Board, or
- Upon the specific written request of ten (10) Active Members in Good Standing

Written request shall be made to the Recording Secretary who shall send Notice of the Special Meeting to the Officers. The Notice must state:

- The time and place of the meeting. **This may be an electronic meeting using an internet meeting service that provides at a minimum, for all participants to be able to see and/or hear each other simultaneously. A member participating by this means is deemed to be present in person at the e-meeting.**
- The specific agenda to be addressed at the meeting.
Business of any Special Meeting is restricted to the specific Noticed agenda.

5.06(d) Election: The election shall:

- Be conducted at the May General Membership Meeting **either in person or as an electronic meeting.** Initially consist of **a written or electronic** ~~the~~ published List of candidates being placed in nomination by the Nominating Committee
- Include any active member ~~candidate~~ nominated and seconded from the floor who is in Good Standing and who provides oral or Written Consent to the Parliamentarian/designee at the time of the nomination. For this purpose, the Parliamentarian/designee shall ask for nominations from the floor.
- Be conducted at the close of the nominations.

QQG BYLAWS CHANGE RECOMMENDATIONS con't

- Be by voice **or electronic polled** vote for any Office for which there is only one candidate or shall be by written **or electronically submitted** ballot where there is more than one candidate for an Office.

Written **or electronic** ballots shall be provided by the Parliamentarian or the Parliamentarian's designee.

RECOMMENDATION #3 Change the Standing Rules Section 12.05(f): Add Proration of membership dues for new Members and new Affiliates.

RECOMMENDATION #4: Change the Standing Rules Section 12.05(f): Clarify Waiver of dues for Past Presidents.

RECOMMENDATION #5: Change the Standing Rules Section 12.05(f): Add definition of Lapsed Members rejoining the Guild.

SECTION 12.05(f) "Dues" The following Dues schedule is in effect as of July 1, 2019.

Active Members	\$45.00
Affiliate Members	\$45.00 plus donation of two (2) door prizes
Past Presidents	Waiver of dues for the number of full years served as President beginning with the year immediately following their years of service. Past Presidents prior to 2018 will receive a permanent waiver of dues.

Honorary Life Members: Permanent waiver of dues

New Member and New Affiliate Proration of dues schedule, if joining other than July 1 - September 30:

75 % if joining and paying October 1- December 31

50% if joining and paying January 1 - March 31

25% if joining and paying April 1 - June 30

Amount rounded up to the nearest dollar.

Members and/or Affiliates rejoining the Guild with more than a five (5) year membership dues lapse are considered New Members.

RECOMMENDATION #6: Change the Standing Rules – Redefine the Section 12.05(h) "Good Standing" and remove last portions of that section.

SECTION 12.05(h) A member in **Good Standing** is defined as one who has:

- **Paid their dues in full**
- **Purchased/Sold a minimum of \$10 in Opportunity Quilt tickets**
- **Supported the Guild's fundraising, charity, volunteer or educational efforts**

• **Release from the Service Obligation**

- ~~All petitions for Release from the Service Obligation must be made in writing to the Fundraising Volunteer Chair at least thirty (30) days in advance of a Fundraising event date.~~

• **Medical Condition/Personal Circumstances**

- ~~Members who cannot perform the two (2) hours of service due to a medical condition or personal circumstances should communicate this to the Fundraising Volunteer Chair prior to the Fundraising event dates.~~

• **Availability**

- ~~Members who will be out of town or otherwise unavailable during the Fundraising event should contact the Fundraising Volunteer Chair for a service assignment that can be completed prior to the event.~~

• **Board Authorized Release**

- ~~Members who fail to perform Fundraising service or satisfy their \$10 opportunity quilt obligation and who do not arrange with the Fundraising Volunteer Chair for Release must petition for Release in writing to the Board within ten (10) days of the date of a Fundraising event.~~

- ~~If Release is not granted by the Board, the Member will not be in Good Standing and will not be eligible to renew their Membership for a period of one (1) Fiscal Year. In this circumstance, the individual may still attend all Guild Meetings which are open to the public as a Visitor, subject to the payment of the Visitor Fee, without the privilege of voting.~~



Moonlight Star Block

Finished Block Size
12" x 12"

Cut (in order listed)

Cream print

- 1 square 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"
- 6 squares 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"
- 20 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Medium blue print

- 4 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"
- 6 squares 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"

Sew

1 Draw diagonal line on wrong side of cream 2 7/8" square. Referring to **Diagram I**, place marked square on medium blue 2 7/8" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Make 12.

2 Stitch together 3 pieced squares and 1 cream 2 1/2" square (**Diagram II**) to make corner square. Make 4.

3 Draw diagonal line on wrong side of cream 2 1/2" square. Referring to **Diagram III**, place marked square on medium blue 4 1/2" square, right sides together, aligning raw edges. Stitch on drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Open and press. Repeat on remaining corners to make side square. Make 4.

4 Sew corner squares, side squares, and cream 4 1/2" square together (**Diagram IV**) to make Moonlight Star Block.


