Have you ever seen striped and flowered fabric and wondered how to use it in a quilt other than in a border?



Use odd pieces to create a center and put the blocks on point around it to create a more dynamic look. As was done in the second photo.

Cut the fabric into strips following the direction of the pattern. Use an equilateral triangle to cut the pieces into triangles alternating the top tip to give you triangles with the same pattern on the top and bottom. You need four similar triangles for a block. See the sample from the first photo.

The flower blocks were turned into pillows.

2021 Holiday Block Exchange - "Trees That Sparkle"



It's an easy, wonky, kinda' glitzy, "stack & whack" block.

Make 20 blocks (you will have 10 with lighter trees and 10 with darker trees)

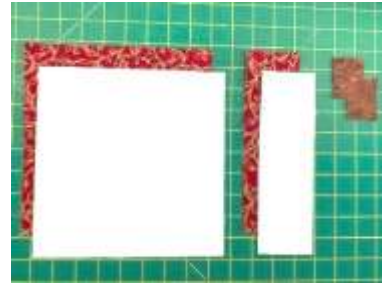
Save 2 blocks (1 lighter tree, 1 darker tree)

Turn in remaining 18 blocks at the Loving Hands Work Party on Monday, November 1st 9:00am-3:00pm at WAC, or mail to Kathi Wilson by that date.

Pick up your delightful, exchanged 18 blocks at the Loving Hands Work Party on Monday, December 6th 9:00am-3:00pm at WAC, or Kathi Wilson will mail to you.

1)



Start with 2 contrasting fabrics (1 lighter & 1 darker). Please use rich reds, greens, golds, champagne or white/white-on-white, and brown for the trunk. (This is NOT the time to use holiday conversation prints with Santa or Snowmen, etc.)

Two Squares: $8\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$
Two Strips: $2'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$
Two Brown rectangles: $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2''$

2)



Stack two $8\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ contrasting squares on top of each other.

Make a diagonal cut at least 1" away from the bottom right corner

3)



Pull the fabric from the 1st cut away. Make 2nd cut in the other direction.

Cut the $2\frac{1}{2}''$ strip in half

4)



Swap out tree piece and match with the contrasting background. Sew along raw edges. Top & bottom may not line up.

5)



Square off the bottom so the edges are straight

6)



Sew $2'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ strips on either side of trunk piece. Strips are longer to allow room to center trunk under the tree.

Press seams toward the trunk.

7)



Please leave Finished Block UNTRIMMED.

- I. The **meeting** was called to order at 6:36 p.m. by President Mary Jamora via Zoom and a quorum was present. Present: Mary Jamora, President; Sharon Bishop, Recording Secretary; Kathy Fogel, Treasurer; Elke Miyahara, Parliamentarian; Rebecca Flether, Homa Asef and Kate Ung, Membership; Kathi Wilson, Loving Hands; Tim Spinn, Advisor; Tina Curran, Virtual Ambassador; Hester Bell and Maria Schneider, Website; and Cindy Abrams. Not present: Beth Hasenauer, Vice President and Caren Ryan, Programs.
- II. The **minutes** of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter.

III. BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Vice President/Jamora for Hasenauer: The October 9th SCCQG meeting will focus on philanthropy and connections during the pandemic. The January meeting will focus on fund raising. We are still awaiting confirmation from Road2CA regarding displaying our 2022 Opportunity Quilt. GQG hybrid meetings are on hold until 2022. The technology committee is working on how to accomplish hybrid meetings.

Treasurer/Fogel: The August Treasurer's Report was given.

Membership/Ung: Thus far 69% of members have renewed. The roster is being prepared and should be ready for October distribution pending a photo of the 2022 Opportunity Quilt. Roger will be drawing the winner of the prize of \$45 towards a Workshop.

Newsletter/Miyahara for Gray: Elke continues to handle the Newsletter while Ellen is recovering. Deadline for articles is September 14.

Loving Hands/Wilson: Next Loving Hands day, *Christmas in September*, is September 13th. An added Loving Hands day, *Welcome Autumn*, is Saturday, September 18 from 9 to 3 at WAC. This day is aimed at including working members who wish to participate in Loving Hands days. Kathi is currently working on a better method of updating the distribution report so that it will not overlap previously reported information.

Programs/Workshops/Jamora for Ryan: Eleanor Levie will present a *Magical History Tour* at the September meeting with a workshop *Weave a Quilt with Me* on September 11.

Fund Raising/Abrams: The Panda Express fund raiser netted \$346. Not bad for a first time event where we were not able to dine-in. We can revisit this event in the future.

2022 Opportunity Quilt/Spinn: The quilt is finished and awaiting a name. At the next meeting we will solicit suggestions for names and a poll will be conducted during the October meeting to finalize a name.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

Bingo Night/Jamora: We had tentatively reserved November 13 for a Bingo Night but after some discussion and consideration of the current fluctuating Covid restrictions along with the lack of a team to head it up, the Board decided it would be best to revisit having a Bingo Night in 2022.

Montrose Arts and Crafts/Jamora: Currently scheduled for October 23 and 24, 2021 we are still in need of a team for this event.

Website Redesign/Jamora & Schneider: The redesigned GQG Website was presented. It is beautiful, colorful, current and contains lots of information. It is pleasing to look at, easy to navigate and will be easy to update saving us money in the long run. A few suggestions were made and congratulations were expressed for a job well done.

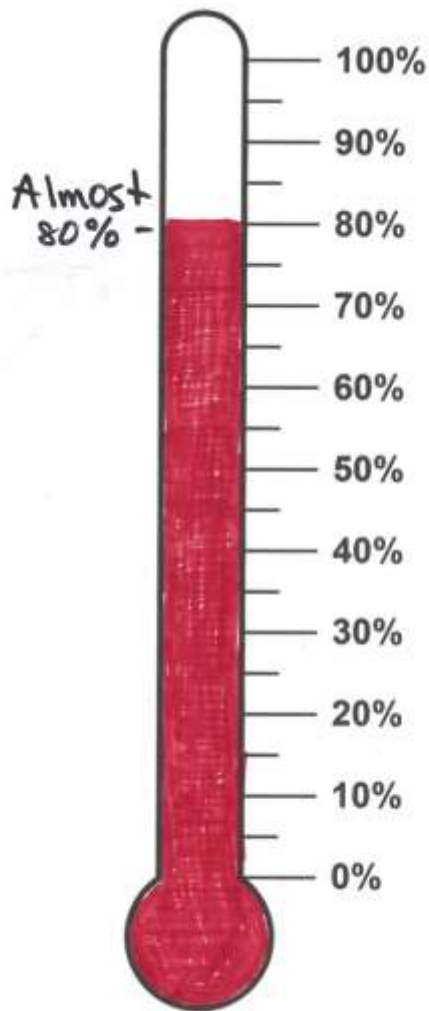
